## PLANETS.

MERCURY will be the *Evening Star* until Feb. 18; after which it will be the *Morning Star* until April 26; then it will be *Evening Star* until June 21; it will then be the *Morning Star* until August 7; after which it will be the *Evening Star* until October 15; then *Morning Star* until Dec. 12; thence *Evening Star* to the close of the year.

VENUS will be the *Morning Star* until July 14; after which it will be the *Evening Star* to the end of the year.

MARS will be the *Morning Star* until April 4; then the *Evening Star* to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be the *Evening Star* until March 9; after which it will be the *Morning Star* until Sept. 25; it will then be the *Evening Star* to the close of the year.

SATURN will be the *Evening Star* until June 25; it will then be the *Morning Star* until the close of the year.

## ECLIPSES IN 1856.

There will be Four Eclipses this year—Two of the Sun and Two of the Moon.

I. April 4. A total Eclipse of the Sun, *invisible* in North and South America, Europe and Africa, but will be total and central in Australia. It will be partial in New Guinea and Borneo.

II. April 20. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, part of which will be visible in Nova Scotia.

Magnitude of the Eclipse (Moon's diameter = 1) 0,706 on the northern limb. The moon will set eclipsed at sunrise.

III. Sept. 28 and 29. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, *invisible* in Nova Scotia, but will be seen in the northern part of North America and northern part of Europe. It will be central in Siberia, and the Sun will set eclipsed at Behring's Straits. This Eclipse will begin Sept. 28, 9h. 15m. A., and will end Sept. 29, 0h. 14m. M. mean time at Halifax.

IV. Oct. 13. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, *visible* in America and Europe, as follows:—

The Moon will rise partially Eclipsed.

Magnitude of the Eclipse (Moon's diameter = 1) 0,994 on the southern limb. The first contact with the Shadow occurs at 90° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the East. The last contact at 146° towards the West.

## EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

## LEFT HAND PAGE.

## Column.

- 1 & 2—Contain the days of the month and of the week.  
 3 & 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.  
 5—Days' length in hours and minutes.  
 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or at a quarter before 8 o'clock in the morning at Halifax.)  
 7—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th col.  
 8—The rising or setting of the Moon—the setting being given from the New to the Full Moon, and the rising from Full to New Moon.  
 9—The place of the Moon in the Ecliptic.  
 10—The time of the Moon's southing or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.  
 The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the first and last quarters, or two quadratures with the Sun.  
 THE FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

## RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- 1—Contains the days of the month.  
 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.  
 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.  
 4—“ “ “ Pictou, N.S., and Cape Tormentine, P.E.I.  
 5—“ “ “ Annapolis, N. S., St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine.  
 6—“ “ “ St John's, Newfoundland,  
 of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of New and Full Moon (*L'establissement du port*) is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.—at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland, 11h. 14m.—at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h.—and St. John's, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to *mean solar time*, which has superseded the old mode of reckoning by *apparent time*.

THE PLANETS.—The hour of *meridian passage, right ascension, and declination* of each of the principal planets, is given for the 1st and 15th of each month—to which is added the *mean time* transit  $\phi$ , or the mean time of transit of the first point of a *Arietis*, being the mean time corresponding to 0h. 0m. 0s. of Sidereal time on each of those days. By the aid of this table the time of the meridian passage of any heavenly body may be readily found. From the right ascension of the body subtract the *retardation*, which is at the rate of 9 83s. for each hour, or 0 16s. for each minute of its R. A.; add the remainder to the mean time transit  $\phi$ ; the sum, divide if necessary, by 24h., will be the mean time of the meridian passage of the body in question. For any other day than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate of 3m. 55.91s. per day, reckoned from the nearest given day, to be added if for an earlier day, subtracted if for a later day.

 ○ First Quarter, 14th d., 11h. 25m. in the morning, bearing east.

IMAGINE, for a moment, what a difference it would make in the pleasures of the country, in the pleasures of every one who ever goes into the country, if our lands, instead of being marred and deformed, as is often the case, by the hand of ignorance and indifference, were embellished by taste and art — if every farmhouse were itself an object of beauty, if every cottage pleased the eye, if the fertile and well-managed fields, the ample barns, the fine cattle so often seen had in the home of the farmer its garden and lawn, its trees and flowers and shrubbery, its neatness and order, their appropriate and becoming crown and ornament. All this might easily be, with scarcely an additional expense, if the desire and taste were not wanting. Flowers and a smooth lawn around a dwelling require but little attention or money: and as for trees, the most beautiful for shade or ornament are the growth of our native woods. Whilst the chief object of the farmer's attention must be, and should be, the increase of his crops, the care of his cattle, the adding to his yearly profits, he still has time enough, and he ought to have soul and spirit enough, for other and higher objects, the improvement of his mind and the cultivation of his taste.

Good management and system are equally necessary to success in farming. If farmers intend to "make money," they must keep up with the times, study their business, and adopt new implements and labor-saving machines. Old sayings, old maxims, and old tools are poor capital, and double the money would be made if greater liberality was used in management. We try to live by starving our business, and in turn get starved by it — a result which no reasonable man can find fault with. It is an old saying that "More corn grows on crooked rows than on straight" — and why? Because every body plants crooked rows. Now, still more would grow on straight ones if every body laid them straight. So, likewise, every farmer who ploughs straight furrows raises the largest crops. "Why so?" asks the reader. Because the man who takes pains to do things well is always most successful. Whoever will turn over straight and even furrows will do other things equally well; there is no slipshod farming about him — no broken fences, no giant weeds, no rickety tools, but all is neat and flourishing. Show me the style in which a man ploughs his fields, and I will tell you whether he is a good or bad farmer.

No one can travel through any section of our province without being impressed with the fact that school houses are, generally, constructed without taste, convenience, or even comfort. Erected, perhaps, on a bleak hill side or in a frog pond, at as little cost as possible, with nothing without or within to make it attractive, with no grounds save the public highway belonging to it, like some relic of the past stands the school house. Popular sentiment demands better schools and more highly qualified teachers than it did twenty years since; but in few instances has a corresponding improvement been made in the edifices devoted to the primary, and almost the only education of children. Next to the attractions of the home fireside, the school should be the most desirable and inviting place. An air of neatness and elegance should be given to the school house, and in point of finish and furniture it should be equal to the best room of a private residence. Children would respect such a building, would love to be in it; and what is more, would form there habits of propriety which would save many a bitter lesson of mortification.

The common vice of jumping and throwing fences is taught to cattle, with scarcely an exception, by their owners and care-takers. Fences half down soon fall by the rubbing of cattle, and teach the first lesson, especially if cattle have any shrewdness in observing cause and effect; very fine feed just over a poor fence is the next lesson; letting down bars and rail fences to the halves from laziness, so that the animal has to take a leap, is the third lesson — and this last is often first, second, and third, with sheep — until they will scale any thing. These three lessons are usually quite enough; but a fourth is often added, namely, placing one additional rail on the fence each successive day, as they become more skilful, for the ostensible object of keeping the jumper within bounds, but really operating as a most ingenious contrivance to teach the art of vaulting. Let the wood be cut in proper season — have none rotting about the premises. It should be put under cover in a woodhouse; this is good economy. It should also be neatly piled, not tumbled and pitched in helter-skelter, and cross-wise, like a brush heap. The more exact you are in this, the more the house will hold.

SHEEP should not generally be sheared before June. After having been sheared, they should be protected by shade from the hot sun, and if the weather turns cold, or a storm arises, they should be allowed the shelter of sheds. Three or four days after the sheep are sheared, the ticks, if there are any, will all go on to the lambs. Immerse the lambs in a weak decoction of tobacco, and you will thus get rid of them. Take care to wet the skin furly, but do not keep the lamb too long in the liquid, and take care that it does not get into his ears, eyes, or mouth, as it will make him sick. Ticks occasion the sheep much trouble — to relieve themselves from the intolerable itching which the ticks create, the sheep bite and scratch themselves with their teeth, by which much wool is pulled out and wasted, and the sheep, besides, lose flesh rapidly. The mode here mentioned is the readiest one of extirpating them. It is sometimes an object to fatten sheep rapidly in summer, and also to fatten off old sheep which cannot be readily fattened on pasture alone. In either case, good pasture and the feeding of a moderate quantity of grain daily will generally effect it advantageously. One bushel of grain fed to sheep in summer will make as much fat as three or four fed in winter.

Born the round and the flat turnip may be sown at any time in July or August. Special pains should be taken to enrich the soil, for in this way two objects are secured — the more rapid growth of the plant, and a sweeter and more tender vegetable. We suppose it is generally well known that the more rapid the growth of this and several other vegetables, the more mild and tender they are to the taste. Cabbages, onions, radishes, spinach, cauliflower, are all much more delicate in flavor, and agreeable to the palate when grown freely and rapidly, than when their growth is stunted or slow. Cucumbers and celery may also be added to the above named, as being much milder when grown rapidly than when of slow growth. Some of these may be raised late in the season, as well as turnips, so as to supply the table with the delicacies of spring and summer until quite late. What is not used for the table will be well relished by the cattle. Farmers now should be all busy seeing to the hay harvest. Cut your grass when it is in a fit state, make it well in the sunshine, get it in well, and there is no doubt of its spending well. Some do so hate the care and toil of hay-making, that they put it off till the grass becomes dry, hard, and dead.

The true test of ability in farming, all the world over, is the greatest amount of success in the management of those two practical antipodes, *cost* and *result*. A man who may raise enormous crops at a cost of ten times all that these crops will repay — or who may compel his farm laborers, however industrious and efficient they may be, to work without tools, or at best, to hoe his corn with a garden trowel, or to water his cattle in an egg shell — would be set down as decidedly a *bad manager*. On the contrary, the farmer who applies his means in the best possible manner to obtain the greatest amount of results, whether by enriching his land ultimately, or increasing its immediate products — who turns all the currents of waste into profitable channels — shows that the touch of his hand is that of a master, and that he possesses the true philosopher's stone, which turns all his applied energies into gold. There are other very important requisites in good farming, but they are all accomplished with an increase of expenditure and labor. Manuring is a most powerful means for improvement. Under draining has wrought wonderful results, but the cost is always a large item; and the same may be said of deep ploughing and subsoiling.

THERE should be in every town, village, or district, a "Farmers' Club," not consisting merely of a few of the more wealthy, but of the entire body of farmers. This club should own a library of agriculture, consisting not only of the more popular class of agricultural publications, but also of all the English and American standard works on this subject. In this way a vast amount of instruction and information might be derived, and the expense, when divided among a large number, would not be very considerable. This club should hold frequent meetings, in which discussions on various topics, the communication of individual experience and the results of private reading, should form the distinctive feature. In other occupations men club together to maintain the position of their craft; they call for the protection of their interests, and they find means to secure their ends. And when our farmers come to feel the truth of the remark which politicians love to weave into their honeyed speeches, that the "bone and sinew" of the province lies in them, they will then go manfully to the Legislative Assembly for the rights which have too long been intrusted to those who neither sow nor reap, nor gather into barns, but eat the fruits of others' labors.

THE improvement of the soil is one great object to be attained by the good farmer. All the fertilizing substances within his reach will be devoted to this purpose, in order to increase the present quantity of his crops, and to insure a greater fertility of soil for the future. Annually removing the productions of the soil proves exhausting, and in time would render the soil barren. It is the duty of all that cultivate the earth so to direct their labors that all the fertilizing elements which they take from the earth shall be returned to it again, that the soil be neither "barren nor unfruitful." That there are many who take an opposite course is not to be denied. The precept, "Keep what you have and get what you can," is as effectually obeyed in directing the labors of their farms as in their traffic with their fellow-men. But though the improvement of the soil is reckoned of the first importance, the improvement of the farm in other respects should certainly not be neglected. The judicious and enterprising farmer will see where improvements *should* be made, and he will see that they *are* made.

Such preparations for winter as have not already been made should be attended to without delay. Domestic animals should be provided with comfortable shelter. This is a duty enforced by the obligations of humanity, as well as a matter of policy in a pecuniary view. Animals should be kept dry in winter. Farmers that have not already suitable buildings for their stock may readily make those which will serve for a while. Sheds for sheep may be made of boards, rails, or poles. If the latter are used, they may be thatched with straw; they will afford good protection. Sleds should be got ready for use at a minute's warning, for none can tell how soon the snow may come, and the first that falls of sufficient depth should be improved. Implements not in use should be housed. Stock should not be pinched the fore part of the winter—it had better be done the latter part of winter, as they will then have to be kept poor a less time. But with the general abundance of forage the last season, there will, with proper economy, be no necessity of any stock suffering for food.

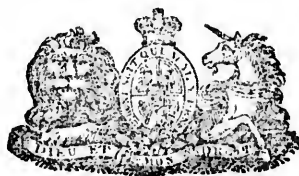

**LIGHT HOUSES ON THE COAST OF NOVA-SCOTIA,  
AND ON THE  
COAST OF NEW BRUNSWICK, IN THE BAY OF FUNDY.**

*Meagher's Beach*—East side Halifax harbor. A fixed light.

*Sambro Island*—Western entrance Halifax harbor. A fixed light.

*Devil's Island*—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the S. W. point of Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbor, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands forty-five feet above high-water mark; rise and fall six feet. The Tower is painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

*Cross Island*—Entrance to Lunenburg harbor. Two lights—flash light above; fixed light below.

*Liverpool*—South end of Coffin's Island. A plain revolving light.

*Port Medway*—Beacon light on Admiralty Head west side of the entrance to the Port. Building square, painted *white*, with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides, *plain white* light forty-four feet above sea level, and stands within thirty fathoms of the shore.

*Shelburne*—McNutt's Island. Two fixed lights, one above the other.

*Barrington*—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. A flash light of fifteen seconds.

*Yarmouth*—West side of the harbor. A plain revolving light.

*Cape Sable, Seal Island*—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the south point of Seal Island. A plain white light, elevated about eighty feet above high-water mark, and may be seen on approaching the Island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W. by compass from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers: the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

*Brier Island*—A plain white light, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

*Westport*—Peter's Island at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. Two WHITE LIGHTS, placed horizontally, (to distinguish it from Brier Island Light) at an elevation of forty feet above high-water mark.

*Digby Gut Light*—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north-eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. A fixed white light.

*Black Rock Light*—On the South Shore of the Bay of Fundy. A fixed light.

*Horton Bluff Light*—In the Basin of Mines, ninety-five feet above sea level high water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted white; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a White Light, which may be seen in clear weather over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blowmedon,) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

*Apple River Light*—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto or Cumberland Bay. Two fixed lights placed horizontally.

*Partridge Island River*—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the west

side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrshoro', on the north side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits a *plain white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

*Eastern Beaver, or Williams' Island*—A revolving light.

*Canseau, Cranberry Island*—Two fixed lights, one above the other, *west side of the Gut of Canseau*. A fixed light.

*Eddy or Sand Point Light*—On Eddy or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by two white lights placed horizontally, twenty-five feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white* with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

*Guysborough Harbor Beacon*—On the west side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chedabucto Bay. A fixed light.

*Pictou Light*—On the south-east side of the entrance to the harbor. A fixed light.

*Pictou Island Light*—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. A fixed light, 52 ft. above high-water mark.

*Arichat Beacon*—A Light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. A white light thirty-four feet above the sea level.

*Louisburg*—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. A fixed light.

*Low Point Light*—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbor. A fixed light.

*Rugged Island Harbor Light*—On the Gull Rock, at the entrance of the harbor. Building square, and painted *white*, exhibiting a clear fixed light at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in latitude  $43^{\circ} 36' N.$ , and longitude  $65^{\circ} 66' W.$

*Pubnico Harbor Light*—A Beacon light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico harbor, situated on the east side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. A fixed red light on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high-water level, (rise and fall twelve feet,) and stands fifty fathoms from low-water mark.

*White Head Island Light*—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The Tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by bright flashes of *ten seconds* duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

*Sea Wolf or Margarie Island Light*—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a half miles. A *plain white light*. The lantern is placed on a square wooden Tower, painted white, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is two hundred and ninety-eight feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island, the light may become observed by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the

Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the S. E. side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

*Port Hood Light*—Changed from white to red, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from Margarie and N. Canso lights.

*St. Paul's Island*—A fixed light on the north-east end; and a Flash Light on the south-west end.

*Scattarie Island*—A Revolving Light on the east end of the Island.

*Gannet Rock Light*—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. A *WHITE Flash Light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white.

*Machias Seal Island Lights*—Two Fixed White Lights upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high-water, and bearing from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about two hundred feet, by which circumstance, of two light houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or American. Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be then not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Mun Ledges, if more than five miles to the E. of the lights.

*Head Harbor Light*—Next in order, after passing Grand Manan, and the plain White Light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also, at all times, to enter Head Harbor. A fixed white light. Building painted *white*, with a *red cross* on it.

*Point Le Preau Lights*—Upon this projecting headland Two Lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are fixed and white. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

*Partridge Island Light*—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. A fixed white light. The building painted *red* and *white* in vertical stripes.

*Beacon Light*—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. A fixed white light. Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

*Quaco Light*—A Revolving White Light, placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red* in horizontal stripes.

*Cape Euryce Light*—On the Point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide. A plain white light.

*West Quoddy Light*—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

The following articles, being the growth and produce of the United States of America, are admitted into this Province *free of duty*, under the treaty between Her Majesty and the United States, signed on the 5th June, 1854:—Grain, Flour, and Bread Stuffs of all kinds; Animals of all kinds; Fresh, Smoked, and Salted Meats; Cotton Wool, Seeds, and Vegetables; Dried and Undried Fruits; Fish, of all kinds; Products of Fish and all other creatures living in the water; Poultry and Eggs; Hides, Furs, Skins, or Tails, undressed; Stone or Marble in its crude or unwrought state; Slate; Butter, Cheese, Tallow; Lard, Horns, Manures; Ores of Metals, of all kinds; Coal, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Ashes; Timber and Lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, and sawed, unmanufactured in whole or in part; Firewood, Plants, Shrubs, and Trees; Pelts; Wool; Rice, Broom Corn, and Bark; Gypsum, ground or unground; hewn, wrought, or unwrought Burr or Grindstones; Dye Stuffs; Flax, Hemp, and Tow; Unmanufactured Tobacco; Rags.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom, *via* United States, are made up at Halifax to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York*." Letters 10d.; Newspapers 1d. each.

The Mails for the United States by Packet are made up immediately on the arrival of each Mail Steamer from Liverpool, G. B. Letters 5d.; if posted in the interior, 3d. additional, which must be pre-paid; Newspapers 1½d each, which must be paid by Stamp at the time of posting.

A closed Mail for Canada is made up and forwarded at the same time in charge of the British Officer. Letters so forwarded must be specially addressed "Closed Mail for Canada;" postage 7½d.; viz.: 5d. Packet Rate, and 2½d Colonial Rate—*pre-payment optional*.

The Mails for Bermuda and the British West Indies are made up at Halifax *once a month*—closing on the arrival of the Mail Steamers from Boston. Letters 5d.—when posted in the interior, 3d. additional, this must be pre-paid. Newspapers 1½d. each, which must be paid by Stamp.

Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda for Chagres and the Pacific, Chili and Peru, Havanna, Honduras, Laguyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands.

Postage to Foreign West Indies, 1s. 3d. when posted at Halifax; 1s. 6d. when posted in the interior—*must be pre-paid*. Newspapers 1½ each, to be pre-paid by Stamp at the time of Posting.

The Mails for Newfoundland, (and Cape-Breton during the Summer months,) are made up at Halifax *once a month* during the months of December, January, February and March; and *once a fortnight* during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November, closing on the arrival of the Mail Steamer from Boston. Postage 5d.; when posted in the interior, 3d. additional. Newspapers 1½ each, which must be paid by Stamp at the time of Posting.

For Dartmouth, *daily*—postage 1d.

For Musquodoboit Harbor, every Tuesday morning, at 9 o'clock. Return Mail due on Monday afternoon, at 5 o'clock.

The Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded to Sydney, C. B., from whence they are despatched by the French Packet during the summer months, and from Halifax direct in the winter months. Letters 5d. packet rate, and 3d. inland, *pre-payment optional*.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 3d. on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America. To any part of the United States, 6d.; to Oregon and California, 9d., *pre-payment optional*.

Newspapers *pass free* to any part of the Province, British North America and the United States, when sent by *land mail*.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, and other printed matter of a like description, put up in covers open at the ends, and without any written communication, may be sent from any part of the Province to any place within the same, as well as through Nova Scotia, at the rate of *one penny per oz.*—*pre-payment optional*, except when addressed to the United States, in which case the postage must be *pre-paid*.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals, or Books, bound or unbound, done up in covers open at the ends, unaccompanied by any written communication, may be transmitted as above mentioned, at the rate of *one half-penny per oz.*, up to 48 ounces, beyond which weight they cannot be sent by Mail.\*

Letters posted in any Town within the Province for delivery in the same Town, are liable to a rate of *one penny* for every  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

Pamphlets, Newspapers, &c., to be sent with covers open at the ends.

British reprints of copyright works from the United States, by *land mail* or *steamer*, charged letter postage.

Letters *Pre-paid by Stamps*, and dropped into the Letter Box any time during the night, and up to 5 o'clock, A. M., will be forwarded by the mails despatched same morning.

When the mails from England arrive before 9 P. M., they are delivered the same evening,—when after that hour, 7 o'clock next morning.

All other mails arriving before 7 P. M., will be delivered the same evening,—if after that hour and before 8, at 6 o'clock,—and if after 8, at 7 o'clock the following morning.

\*The Postage on Books from Great Britain to the British West India Islands, Bermuda, Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, Malta, Gibraltar, Ionian Islands, St. Helena, Gold Coast, Cape Town, New South Wales, &c., or *vice versa*, is at the rate of 7d. if not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb.; exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s. and 3d.; and so on adding 1s. and 3d. for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. One book package may contain separate Books, Publications, Almanacks, and Maps and Paper, Parchment or Vellum; the latter three materials may be written or printed on—the package may contain the name and address of the sender. Rollers may accompany prints and maps, and markers may be sent with books. No letter must be sent with or written on a book package, and no such package must exceed *two feet* in length, width or depth. The postage must in all cases be *pre-paid* by Stamp.
