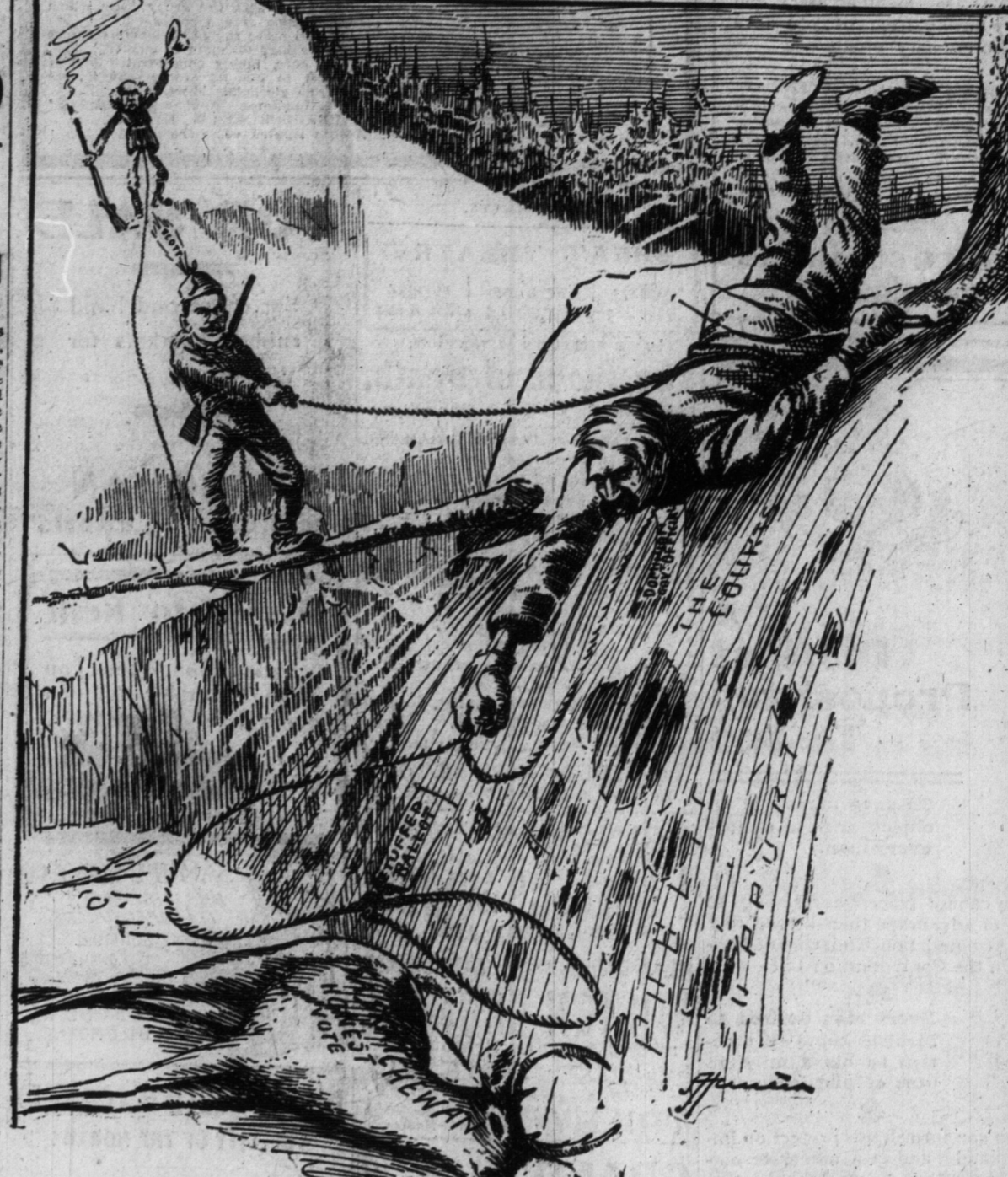

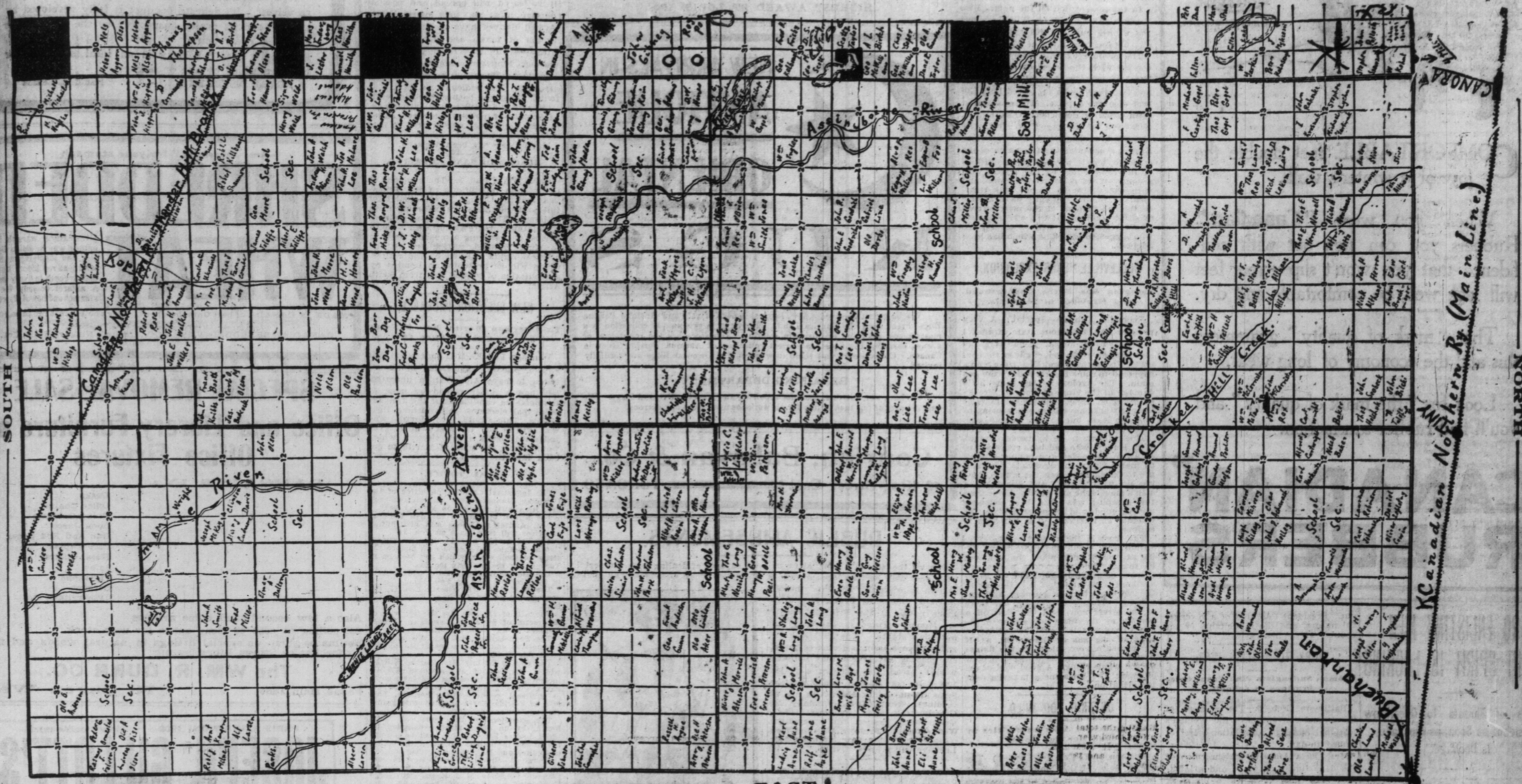

NO BALLOTS FOR FOREIGNERS WHO CANNOT UNDERSTAND

South Simcoe Orangemen Pass Strong Resolution Bearing on the Autonomy Bill.

Alliston, Feb. 9.—The annual meeting of South Simcoe County Orangemen Lodge was held in the Orange Hall and was largely attended, representatives being out from every lodge in the county. The following officers were elected: County master, John A. Stewart; Thorton, worshipful deputy county master, John H. Lee, Newton Robinson; chaplain, Rev. W. G. G. Dreyer; Beaton, recording secretary, John S. Willoughby; Cookstown; financial secretary, Wm. Hammel; Tottenham; treasurer, Robert Henderson; Alliston, director of ceremonies, Samuel Summer; Alliston; lecturer, Wm. Riley; Alliston; first deputy, W. G. Steele; Deschambert; second deputy, J. Wallis; Tottenham.

Rousing speeches were given by Most Worshipful Bro. W. M. Lockhart, Grand Secretary B.N.A.; J. S. Duff, M.L.A.; E. A. Little, M.L.A.; Rev. W. G. G. Dreyer; Rev. J. J. Sparling; F. Wilcox and others.

This resolution was moved by Frank Wilcox, worshipful master of L.O.L. 1058, Bond Head, and carried:

That we, the members of this loyal Orange Lodge of the County of South Simcoe, composed of men of different shades of political opinion, most strongly condemn the action of the Protestant members of the Dominion parliament who voted for the autonomy bill, as they have fastened forever upon the new provinces of the confederation a system of separate schools. In the wide fertile prairies lies the future greatness of Canada. To achieve this the laws should be so framed, so as to develop among the diverse elements of the population a broad national spirit.

Ever since the enactment of the British North American Act the hierarchy of the Roman Catholic Church have been reading into the constitution, special privileges for their church that were never intended by the men who framed it.

The course of Sir Wilfrid Laurier is a keen disappointment to those who in 1896 entrusted him with the government of the Dominion. The bill which he passed is a distinct breach of faith with the people of Canada, as he had no mandate to adopt such vital legislation. As an advocate of the cause of provincial rights in 1896, the special champion of Manitoba, he abandoned his entire record by the concessions he made to the hierarchy, and we deplore and condemn this unparalleled breach of trust.

Resolved further that we entirely disapprove of the ballot being granted to foreigners who are uneducated and do not understand the meaning thereof, until such a time as they become acquainted with its sacredness.
