His Lordship directs me to state that he much regrets to find from the concents of your letter and from the correspondence between the members of the three Governments, interested in this question, assembled at Hulifax, that in the opinion of the members of the Executive Councils of Canada and New Brunswick, so decided an objection would be entertained to the construction of a line of Railway proposed by the officers who conducted the survey through the three Provinces in British North America, in 1848. His hordship feels that the views of gentlemen possessing great local knowledge, and well acquainted with the opinions of the most influential classes of society in British North America on this subject, are justly entitled to great veight. He is, therefore, disposed to consider in the most favourable light the plan submitted in the printed correspondence, constituing as it does from parties infliniately conversatit with the subject. The establishment of the means of rapid and easy communication between the different
