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# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

# Province of Quebec Rifle Association.

#### CONSTITUTION.

RULE 1. That this Association be called the "Province of Quebec Rifle Association," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.

2. That the Annual subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of ten dollars in cash, at any one time, shall entitle the donor to be elected a life member.

3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps in this Province, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.

4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the office-bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association. Five to form a quorum.

5. The Office bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting.

6. A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting, and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.

7. The Deputy Adjutant Generals and Brigade Majors of the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.

8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise; they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their names sent to the Secretary, at least one month before the annual meeting. 9. The Council may from time to time, make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.

10. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such time and place, as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.

11. The annual business meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the by-laws.

12. An Annual report shall be made by the Secretary and Treasurer and submitted to the Council, previous to publication.

12. At the Annual Meeting, the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee, to carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, under such regulations as may be made by the Council from time to time.

### BY-LAWS.

1. That the Annual Meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the first Thursday in May.

2. Extraordinary meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required by any six members of the Council; fifteen days notice of such meeting given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called.

3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the Annual Meeting.

4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time—all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.

5. The payment of sums for current expenses, must be authorized by the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents. Other payments, to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING

# Province of Quebec Rille Association.

HELD IN THE

MECHANICS' INSTITUTE, MONTREAL, On the 7th May, 1874.

In the absence of the President, Lieut.-Col. McEachern, C.M.G., Vice-President, took the Chair.

1. The Secretary read his Report, which was by motion adopted, and ordered to be printed.

2. The Treasurer read his statement, which had been audited and reported correct by the Auditors. The statement was received and ordered to be printed with the Report.

3. The election of office bearers then took place. The following were elected:

.4. It was resolved—That the Annual Matches be held on the 11th August and following days, and that the Targets be the same as those used at Wimbledon this year.

5. A circular letter from the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association was read, to the effect, that the selection of marksmen for the Team for Wimbledon was to be made by the Presidents of the Provincial Associations, who were to send a list of 18 names each, with the scores made in 1873, the distances, dates and places of matches where the scores were made, also the rank, occupation and status of each competitor. This list is to be sent to the Secretary, of the D.C.R.A., not later than the 24th May. After some discussion, a motion was made and carried unanimously,

"That the system of last year be adopted for the selection of Competitors for the Province of Quebec,—viz., by a competition for that purpose, as the proposition of the Dominion Rifle Association for the selection of competitors for this year

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" is considered impracticable; and that the Secretary of the "D.C.R.A., be notified that such a competition will be held if a " week's delay is given, say to the 30th May."

6. Moved by Lt.-Col. McKay, and seconded by Capt. Johnson,

"That the sum of one hundred dollars be given to the "Secretary for his services for the past year."--Carried.

7. Votes of thanks were passed to the Officers of the past year, and to Lt.-Col. McEachern for his able performance of the duties of Chairman.

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The meeting then adjourned.

# FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

# Province of Quebeq Bifle Association.

A statement of the proceedings of the past year shew that the work for which the Association was formed, was carried out efficiently and successfully. A Competition was held at Point St. Charles for the selection of marksmen for the Team for Wimbledon, and the credit of the Province was fully maintained at Wimbledon by the men so selected.

Our Annual Prize meeting was held at Point St. Charles on the 12th August and following days. The total number of Competitors was 1410, shewing a decrease of 93 from 1872; but taking into account that there was one match less, the decrease does not shew any real falling off in the actual number present at the Meeting. The matches were well contested, and the firing better than at any former meeting. Thirteen Battalions entered for the Battalion Match, being one over the number in 1872. The first Prize was won by the 1st Batt. G.T. Rifles, with a score of 197, being 21 over the score of the previous year. The Brydges Challenge Cup was won by Lt. Whitman of the 60th Batt. His Excellency the Governor General, Lord Dufferin, offered two silver medals, which will be presented when received, to the highest aggregate scores made by the Snider and Small Bore Rifles. The winners are Sergt. Wynne, M.G.A., Snider, and Major Cotton, A. Battery, small bore. Our Association having affiliated with the National Rifle Association, we have received their valuable silver medal, which will be competed for this year at our Annual matches.

The report of our matches is also published in the Annual report of the National Association. By the proper arrangement of the Prize list, and the excellent management of the Executive Officers, Lt.-Col. Hanning, Lt.-Col. Worsley and Major Aylmer, the Matches were concluded within the week, much to the satisfaction of the competitors. There was a large increase in small bore competitors. The optional matches were again very popular, and keenly contested, as will be seen by the fact, that in No. 8 there were 5 scores of 27 out of a possible 28, the two first being Sniders. The number of Battalions and Associations affiliated for the year was 19,-one over 1872. Of this number, three, the Toronto, Victoria of Hamilton, and the Ingersoll, belong to the Province of Ontario. Besides the members of these Clubs, there were a number of Competitors from other parts of the sister Province. We are always glad to welcome our friends from Ontario who come in increasing numbers from year to year to try our mettle.

A suggestion has been made, that in our next Prize List, we should arrange to have an affiliated Association Match in addition to the Battalion one.

Some of our members attended the Dominion Matches last Fall in Ottawa, and maintained their usual reputation, by carrying off some of the highest prizes. In the Competition for the London Merchants Cup, we were represented by the three men who first won it at Wimbledon and two other well known shots. For a second time Quebec won the Cup, and it will remain with Col. Brydges till next year.

The Treasurer's statement shews a balance on hand of \$996.41 being nearly \$250.00 over that of last year, a striking proof that the finances have been prudently managed, for which our worthy Treasurer richly deserves the thanks of the Association.

The Subscription list is not as large as we would like to see it, but thanks are due to those who have supported us, and to those who took the trouble of going round with the subscription list, especially to Lt.-Col. Worsley whose labours in this and in former years, have been so successful in collecting funds. We have been aided by liberal grants from the Bank of Montreal, Bank of British North America, G. T. Railway, and the Stadacona Rifle Club.

It is now time that our Association should be established on a more permanent basis, and supported in some other way than by an Annual Subscription list. Seeing that our Association is a Provincial one, the Provincial Government might well give an annual grant to our Prize list. Such a grant would be duly appreciated by the Riflemen of the Province. Some expense will have to be incurred this year in repairing the Butts and changing the targets to the new system adopted at Wimbledon.

At the last Meeting of the Dominion Association, it was decided to send another Team to Wimbledon. The mode adopted of selecting the men for the Team is different from that of former years, and it will be for the Council of the Q.R.A., to decide as to whether it can be carried out.

The Council has again to acknowledge with thanks, the liberality of the Grand Trunk Railway, Vermont Central Railway, South Eastern Railway, Richelieu Navigation, Canadian Navigation, and Ottawa River Navigation Companies, in granting Competitors passage over their lines, to and from the matches for one fare.
