

## THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE-

## MANAGING COMMITTEE.

-0F-

## Knox Church.

The Managing Committee in presenting the ANNUAL REPORT to the Congregation acknowledge with gratitude, and desire to give thanks to God for His continued goodness, and for the measure of success given to the Congregation during the past year. By reference to the Treasurer's Statement, it will be seen that our collections, by Envelopes have considerably fallen off, but by loose and special collections there has been a slight increase, but insufficient to meet the expenditure, there being a deficiency of five hundred and seventy eight dollars and four cents. (\$578.04)

To meet the present debt and the estimated expenditure for the year will require one thousand dollars (\$1000) more revenue than was raised during the year now closed.

Your committee regret to have to report that there is a large amount in arrears as actually subscribed. This in a measure arises from members of the congregation neglecting to put in the amount omitted through absence on a previous Sabbath.

The committee would recommend that the congregation consider the necessity of raising funds to pay off the floating debt as also the re-shingling the roof of the church and re-painting the outside wood-work.

The managers who retire this year are J.G.McIntyre, Robert Evans, R. J.Husband, William Foreman, and John Stewart all of whom are eligible for re-election.

Mr. M. Brennen, having resigned it will be necessary to elect a manager to fill his place.

In conclusion the committee desire the congregation to unite with them in asking the blessing of God in all the work of the church during the present year.

## THE 45th ANNUAL REPORT

## Knox Church Labhath School

-FOR THE-

Mear ending 31st December, 1881.

The Sabbath School Association beg leave to present their Annual Report as follows:—

The average attendance for the year has been, officers and teachers 36, scholars 254 or a total of 290, the number on the roll being officers and teachers 37, scholars 325, the average attendance being an increase of three over the year 1880 which is made up altogether by the better average attendance of the male teachers; strange to say the female teachers, boys and girls average attendance for the year 1881 being the same as 1880. During the year two deaths have occurred in the school that of Nellie Hyndman, and the daughter of our worthy Assistant Superintendent, viz: Sådie Gillespie, one whom to know was to love and respect, and who, if she had been spared gave evidence of being a willing worker in our Sabbath School. We are pleased to state in our Annual Report that through the exertions of our esteemed President, Rev. John James, D. D., our School Room has all been thoroughly renovated. and also additional accommodation provided by fitting up what was formerly the Manse for Class Rooms, thereby making the place far more comfortable and convenient, and at the same time, providing for what we hope will be our steady increase in members; the members of the association at their regular meeting, on the 4th July, 1881, rescinded the motion passed on the 8th August, 1880, pledging the association to raise the sum of \$500 towards the building of a new School Room, and voted the sum of three hundred dollars towards the improvements that have been made in our School Room. The Psalmody is still in charge of our Precentor, Mr. James Johnson, who is doing his best to make the scholars familiar with the new hymns now in use by the school, and adopted by t vice Pres

The association is under a debt of gratitude to our President for his weekly instructions in the lessons for the sabbath, and those who fail to attend these meetings lose much valuable assistance in the work committed to their care. We regret to say that no new books have been added to the Library during the past year, and the greatest care has been evinced by the Librarian and his assistants to suit the wishes of the scholars with the Libraries under their control.

## THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

## Knox Church Missionary Association

Your committee's report at this time must necessarily be incomplete owing to the fact that we have decided hereafter to close our financial year at the same time that the managing committee of the church close theirs, viz: Dec.31st, we therefore present you to-night with a nine months report of our labours.

While thanking the great King and Head of the church for the amount of success that has attended our labours, we cannot but think there is great cause for humiliation when we think of how little we have done even in the midst of "good times" for the advancement of Christs Kingdom.

For the nine months—April 1st to Dec 31st 1881, we collected for missionary purposes as follows:—

Deducting collection taken at Father Gavazzie's Lecture, which was public and not congregational, the giving per communicant would average less than one dollar per year.

No fault can be attached to the collectors. The Ladies have done their work thoroughly as a rule, collections were never made more regularly, and we think the hearty thanks of the congregation are due to them for doing by far the greater part of the committee's work. Hitherto we have mainly depended on the last quarter to make up the usual collections and we are hopeful that by the end of March—which is the time when the assembly close their books—we shall have reached our usual amount or more if possible. To bring us up to last year's amount we will require about \$400 yet. Trusting that better results may attend the labours of the committee you may appoint for the next year.
