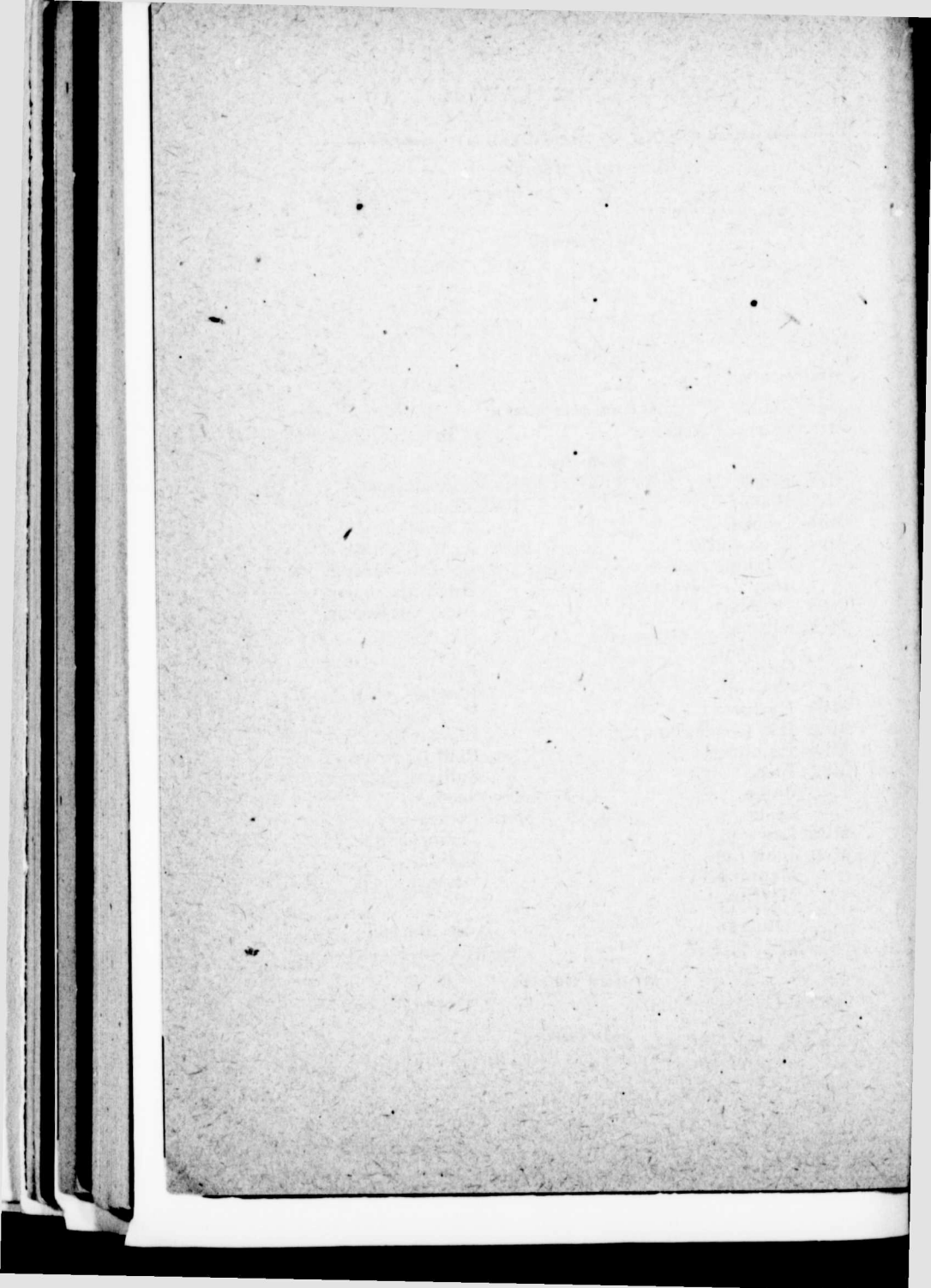

# BOYS' HOME.

## THIRTIETH ANNUAL MEETING.

The thirtieth annual meeting of the Boys' Home was held at the Home in George Street, on Tuesday, March 19th, 1890.

Among those present were Sir Daniel Wilson, Rev. Dr. McLaren, Rev. H. J. Winterbourne, Dr. J. G. Hodgins, Mr J. L. Hughes, Mr. S. B. Brush, Rev. Canon DuMoulin, Rev. Dr. Stafford, Rev. Dr. Parsons, Mr. John J. Withrow, Mr. S. H. Baird, Dr. Thorburn.

On motion of Dr. Stafford, Dr. Hodgins was called to the chair, after which Dr. Parsons opened the meeting with prayer.

Regrets were read from the Mayor, the Right Revd. the Archbishop of Toronto, Mr. Goldwin Smith, Col. Gzowski, Dr. Potts, Rev. Arthur Baldwin, Dr. Kellogg and Ex-Mayor Manning.

The Chairman called upon the Rev. H. J. Winterbourne to read the 30th Annual Report.

The Committee of Management, in presenting to their patrons and the public, this their 30th annual report, for the year ending 31st of December 1889, feel it their duty to preface the details of the year's working, by chronicling the many very sad losses, through death, they have sustained in the active Executive of the Home—vacancies which they can never hope to fill with the same untiring perseverance, and patience, towards the achievement of so much good result, as characterized the labors of those they now mourn.

It would almost seem, that the history of the Home had reached a new epoch, when they have to issue the annual report and omit the names of those, who from the beginning of the work in 1860, or nearly thirty years ago, have been so prominently associated in the administration of its affairs, and expended through both prosperity and adversity, the tokens of charity which their kind friends from year to year have placed in their hands for the continuance of the good work being accomplished by the "Boys' Home."



Reference is made to the late Mrs. Dunlop who, for many years previous to her death in October, 1889, had occupied the position of first Directress, and whose latter years in life were spent in the advancement of the Institution in all its schemes for good. Her name will be handed down in future years, as the Mother of this Board: and her later work is a substantial legacy of her earnest and successful endeavor for the comfort of the inmates of the "Home," and it is but fitting tribute, that the new hospital for the sick of the Home will be known as "The Dunlop Infirmary."

To Mrs. MacMurchy, who was called to her rest in August, 1889, and who for many years was a faithful member of the Board of Management. The efficient aid which she lent to the conduct of the business of the "Home," will make her loss much felt in its future labors: while all who were privileged to be associated with her, recall the reverent and Christ-like spirit expressed in the prayers so often offered in behalf of the work in which she was so much interested.

To the late Mrs. Munro (Matron of the "Home" since its formation in 1860) whose life seemed dedicated to her work, and to whose untiring efforts is due the high condition of the efficiency which is found in its interior to-day, and which was further evidenced in the legacy of all her possessions,—being many things greatly valued by herself,—and in money \$130.75. The many touching scenes of grief witnessed at her interment, were evidence of how much the "Boys" felt the loss of one, who had acted to them as a mother for so many years; and they feel sure that her kindly Christian influence will bear much fruit in many families in years to come.

To the late Mr. Wm. Gooderham, whose time and money were always at their disposal, and who was at all times willing to lend a helping hand in time of need; and they wish to place on record through this medium, their heartfelt thankfulness for his many good works, and all due honor to one whose name will never be forgotten in this city.

And to the late Mrs. Annie McKay, who has done much in her position in the "Home" to add to the welfare of the "Boys" under her charge.

The opportunities for work are still as apparent,—the field continues getting larger, and they pray that God may commend their work to like good people as those, and lead them to help

in the training many boys, who might reach a different condition of affairs in life, but for the helping hand extended to them by the efforts of the "Boys' Home."

They have, withal, much to be thankful for ; and in presenting the various reports, careful study of them will show that the year that has gone, has been full of return for both labor and money expended in their earnest endeavor to reach the unfortunates, whom they have made it their duty to protect and train.

The books of the Home at this date show one hundred and one boys under their care in the Institution. During the year fifty-six boys were admitted to the comforts of the Home ; thirty-three were removed by parents ; seventeen sent to situations in the country ; and four absconded.

During the year four boys completed their terms of apprenticeship with farmers, and are now in self-supporting situations, and reported to be doing well for themselves.

The amount of money placed to the credit of various boys still under indenture, during the last twelve months was \$537.10, the amount paid to boys who have completed their terms \$965.95. The largest sum to any one boy, being \$151.00 which being his accumulated savings for the term of his apprenticeship, gives him a good fair start from his own earnings, in the battle of life.

The management continue to have evidence from the boys in various parts of the country, of their comfort in the choice of homes which have been made for them,—and it might be in order to insert here in this report one of their letters, which may be accepted as a fair sample of the many :

"I was so pleased to get your letter, and hope you are well and all your neighbors, and tell the ladies of the Board that I am well pleased with my place. My brother Tom wrote to me on Saturday and told me that he can milk, and do the chores, and he has only been up there since Wednesday. He is fourteen miles from me,—Cookstown. He says that he has a very comfortable home. Mr. Wood is going to try and get F. S——, a place out near us, if the ladies of the Board will let him go. There are several English boys out here. One is working in Laurence's the buggy-makers, and he goes to the English Church Sunday School, and is in the same class as I am. I have been up to your place five or six times. I used to go up the year

before last for lilacs. We have lots of snow out here now, and we must expect the winter to come now. Mrs. W— says that she thinks she was at your place with Mrs. B—, anyhow, she knows that she was at some Mrs. Thompson's over in Rosedale. Mrs. B— is Mrs. W— aunt. Mr. W— is going to let me go down to Toronto on Christmas, if nothing happens.

I think that the Infirmary will be a nice and comfortable home for the sick boys.

I think I will have to close now.

The general health of the boys in the Home during the year has been good, as will be shown by the Medical Officer's report; but, unfortunately, the skin disease referred to last year as having caused very much trouble and expense, still causes isolation of some nineteen boys from the rest of the household; and the Committee are glad to report that the Infirmary, which will be known as "The Dunlop Infirmary," has been completed, and the sick of the Home have been removed from the temporary premises to it, where they hope to be able to give them much more comfort than they could under the former system.

Further information on this subject will be found in Dr. Thorburn's report.

The Managers desire, gratefully, to acknowledge the many donations which they have been in receipt of during the year, and wish to specially mention the bequest of \$125.52 from the late Mrs. Anna Mulholland, who for many years was an efficient officer and valued friend of the Home. The bequest from the late John Gordon of \$500. The bequest from the late Glover Harrison of \$1000, payable within the next five years in equal yearly instalments. And from many others, whose names will be found set out in the Treasurer's report.

We have also to thank many friends for the extension of kindness during the year to the boys, in affording them the means of many pleasant outings, which from time to time were much appreciated by all; and the days spent at Victoria Park, Hanlan's Point, etc., were conducive to the general happiness of the Home.

The Sunday School still continues under the personal superintendance of our esteemed helpmate, Mr Robt. Kilgour, to

whom we are much indebted for the long service which he has rendered in this department of the Home, and the character of the boys must be much influenced by his continuance in this office.

Mr. S. S. Brush still devotes himself as musical director, and we are most grateful to him and to the other teachers who undertake this portion of the work of the Institution. We would especially mention Miss Cowan and her assistant, Miss Blight, who labor faithfully in the day school of the Home. Also to Drs. Thorburn and Caven, whose duties this year has been more laborious than usual, on account of the numbers in the Infirmary—Dr. Caven having this year kindly consented to assist Dr. Thorburn in the medical work of the Home.

The Managers commend to the public the object for which they ask their support, as being one which has been, and will be in the future, productive of incalculable good, and bespeak for the collectors a kindly welcome. In this connection, we wish to make mention of Mr. R. L. Baird, who kindly undertook to raise funds for the December prizes, given as an encouragement to the boys to reach as great perfection as possible in their studies, while under the protection of the Home. Also to Mr. Osler for his kindness in providing each boy in the Home at Christmas with a ten-cent piece.

An invitation to visit the Home is extended to any one who may take an interest in our work, and such calls will be appreciated, as showing that the public are interested, and wish to encourage the Institution in the good which it is laboring to accomplish.

In conclusion, the Board of Management, desire to record their devout thankfulness to Almighty God for His unflinching goodness in the past, and offer their earnest prayer for guidance and help in future.

## THIRTIETH ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT.

Another year has passed and it affords me much pleasure to be able to state that no deaths have occurred among the boys, although, largely owing to epidemics of la grippe and measles, a great majority of them have suffered more or less from sickness during the year. Upwards of fifty were confined to bed for a longer or shorter time by these diseases. There were also a few other simple troubles of minor importance. I regret to say that the scalp disease which made its appearance in the Home last year has not yet been eradicated. The long desired Infirmary has been erected and we are now enabled to isolate those affected with contagious disease. In the medical treatment of the boys, especially the contagious cases, we are much indebted to our recently appointed assistant physician, Dr. W. F. Caven. The appearance of the boys, their chubby and fat faces all indicate the best of health.

The sanitary rules of the Institution are strictly observed; and the diet, although not rich is highly nutritious. The recent fire at Toronto University is a warning to the Managers of all public institutions to discard the use of coal oil lamps. I would therefore suggest that gas be introduced throughout the buildings at the earliest possible time. I would also suggest the placing of a telephone in the Home. It would be a great convenience to visitors and those connected with the Institution.

It is with feelings of deep regret that I can no longer refer to a face so long familiar to the boys and friends of the Home; the late matron, Mrs. Munro. As you are aware on the 14th of March, 1889, it pleased God to remove her from among us. I fail in words to express my appreciation of her many good and sterling qualities, she was indeed a good woman, kind and discreet to all around and connected with her. Still another, Mrs. Dunlop, who was connected, with myself and others, at the inception of this Institution over thirty years ago, and who for many years past largely devoted her time to charitable objects, has gone to join the great majority. These, however, have left an honorable record of devotion and love behind them. Miss

McKay, acting matron, the sister of our present matron at the Infirmary, passed from among us after a severe sickness.

All which I have the pleasure of submitting.

Dr. Parsons then tendered a vote of thanks to Dr. Hodgins for discharging the duties of Chairman, after which the meeting was closed with the benediction.

## OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

### *Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.*

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with

prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee ; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May ; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p. m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a. m., Dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p. m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys ; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
