Our financial year ended 31st October, with a balance due to Treasurer, \$91.01. The year began with a similar balance, \$91.09. We have had exceptional expenses during the year.

Canon Macnab desires us to acknowledge the very acceptable gift of five gallons of wine for Communion, from a donor whose name is not given.

The Rev. Canon Dixon has presented to the Cathedral a handsome brass altar desk. This was given early in the summer, but was sent, by some mistake, to the Island, where it was used in St. Andrew's Chapel. It has only recently reached the Cathedral.

The Cathedral Sunday School has again taken a highly creditable place in Missionary work during the year ending at last Easter. The returns published in *The New Era* for October, show the contributions from St. Alban's, Toronto, \$121.25, being only exceeded in all Canada by Grace Church, Montreal, \$193.50, and St. Stephen's, Toronto, \$113.76. The next figures on the published list (perhaps not complete) are Church of the Redeemer, Toronto, \$110, and St. George's, Halifax, \$99 19.

ST. ALBAN'S CATHEDRAL SCHOOL.

A large assembly gathered in the Crypt of St. Alban's Cathedral on Friday afternoon, October 28th, on the occasion of the Annual Prize Day of St. Alban's Cathedral School. The Lord Bishop of Toronto took the chair. With him on the platform, besides the masters of the School, were the Rev. Canon Cayley, D.D., Revs. Canon MacNab, Canon Sweeny, the Provost of Trinity College, Messrs. Lawrence Baldwin, E. M. Chadwick and others.

After a few opening remarks by Mr. M. E. Matthews, the head master, the Bishop spoke of the large increase in the number of pupils, who now amount to over a hundred and twenty, and congratulated the School on its general efficiency and tone. The prizes for the water sports and rifle match were also presented by Messrs. L. G. Amsden and J. W. G. Andras. Among those who gave prizes for these events were Messrs. Amsden, H. O. Nash, R.N., and Mr. Noble.

After the conclusion of the proceedings, a Rugby match was played on the field, resulting in a win for the School by 10 points to 2.
