Being a faithful account of all the most remarkable transactions in Parliament from the earliest times. Collected from the JOURNALS OF BOTH HOUSES, THE RECORDS, ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPTS, SCARCE SPEECHES AND TRACTS, all compared with the several contemporary writers, and connected throughout with the history of the times.

Statutes at Large. London, JOHN BASKETT, 1735. Contains MANY HUNDRED INTERESTING AND CURIOUS OLD ACTS, relating to all conceivable questions and contingencies. Mostly printed in fine **Old English black letter.** Including "Acts for transporting beer over the seas," and for keepers of alehouses and tiplinghouses to be bound by recognisance; others relate to the Colonies beyond the seas, including the AMERICAN PLANTATIONS, etc.

Of the importance of any one of the above items there can be no question: the history and destiny of the New as well as the Old World are to be found within the covers of these ancient volumes. MANY HUNDRED REFERENCES, STATE PAPERS AND SPEECHES, by historians and statesmen whose names are met with on every page of modern history for the last three hundred years, are to be found therein. They are the original sources from which all other authorities must draw their supplies. The SCARCITY of the above collections is unquestionable; as each set, be it long or short, finds its way into the open market, so surely they become more rare, leaving one the less to be gathered in. The CONDITION of each of the above items are everything to be desired.

It has a PORTRAIT of BENGOUGH and 200 OF THE MOST RARE AND INTERESTING CARICATURE ILLUSTRATIONS relating to the history of Canada, including the CANADIAN PUNCH, AN EXCESSIVELY RARE PUBLICATION OF THE FORTIES, with letter-press descriptions. The series which was intended to be continued is complete, and extends to 1878.

An interesting and valuable set of books, containing hundreds of articles and contributions by the most eminent men of science on a variety of questions more or less connected with this important subject, as the History of Meteorological Societies in England, The Climate of Fiji, Variations of Relative Humidity, Notes on Waterspouts, Entomological and Ornithological Reports, New Zealand Weather, Weather Prognostics, On the Force of Wind at Sea, Climate of the Delta of Egypt, Atlantic Weather Maps, and innumerable other contributions, accompanied with upwards of 100 folding maps, charts, and other illustrations. About 20 parts of the Meteorological Record also goes with this interesting lot.

We rejoice to have been the medium for the distribution of *some hundreds of thousands of volumes by the best authors, ancient and modern*; and it gives us especial pleasure to import and sell, at a cheap rate, so many sets of BURKE'S INVALUABLE REGISTER, which will become very scarce, as most of those we have disposed of are well cared for in public libraries and institutions. The above sets comprise a detailed view of the *politics, literature, biography, parliamentary history, commerce, statistics*, etc., during a most important period. All the *State papers* of any importance are given at length. It was suggested to Dodsley by the *Right Hon. Edmund Burke*, who conducted it for many years, and when no longer able to hold the pen himself, he directed that of his substitute, *Mr. Ireland*. The great questions which occupied the talents and attention of this, one of the greatest of men, and called forth from time to time the most splendid displays of eloquence, which was listened to, and since read by admiring multitudes, and his public labors, was one continuous struggle against the stupidity, venality, and selfishness of the politicians of his day. It is safe to assume that had his advice been taken, the necessity for *American Independence would never have had any existence, Warren Hastings would have been hanged, and the world would never have been cursed with a Napoleon*. In one of the index volumes there are above 200 references to this one man.

The contest with the *American Colonies*, the impeachment of *Warren Hastings*, and the *French Revolution*, all of which were commenced and concluded during the publication of the above; the relationship between England and what is now the United States and Canada, occupies nearly twenty columns in the closely-printed index, representing many hundreds of pages. *Hundreds of authors are indebted to this bold and uncompromising lover of justice*, and his complete and invaluable information retailed to their readers. On the subject of Canadian history, these volumes are of extraordinary interest. Long accounts are given of the Indian and French wars, and each of the sets completely cover the interesting period of 1812-14.
