

"The Grand Jury beg to report that they have visited the Jall and the Asylum for the Insane. In the former they found twenty-two prisoners well cared for and their cells and apartments clean and well kept. In the Asylum for the Insane the apartments are as clean, siry and confortable as the unfortunate condition of the inmates will permit. At present there is acarcely anticient room for the 188 patients in this Institution, some of the sleeping apartments being over-crowded, and the Jury world recommend the completion and invisibing of the extra ward for which there is room in the present building at the earliest possible data.

The jury also urgestly recommend that the redical attendant be provided with apartments in connection with the Asylum, so that he can give consent attention to patients who require it. Under the precent system of one daily visit it is observed that a much smaller per centage of cures is effected that might be expected under proper medical treatment. The small outlay for this purpose would he simply repaid by the recovery of a few of these unfortunate persons who suffer from the dire affliction of impaired reason.
