

EDITORIAL SUMMARY.

The rule begins to wobble. Kingston is distracted by street music. Montreal is getting a new steam fire engine. The "Lover's Walk" in Ottawa is being repaired. The Montreal velocipede rials are in full array on Sunday.

The Kingston elevators have held a competition of speed in unloading vessels. A proposal has been made to establish a stock exchange at Montreal. Hamilton has given over fifteen hundred dollars towards the expenses of the Wheelman team. Toronto \$250.

A fire in Harris on Wednesday destroyed the M. Church and Ball's planing factory. Loss \$10,000. Dr. Edmonson, of Brookville, well-known as an old settler and a man of letters, died on Wednesday. Fifty-six girls and nine girls will reach Hamilton on Friday, the 20th, from Brighton, Eng., if all goes on well.

The schooner Harvest Queen was sunk in Kingston, with 20,000 bushels of grain on board, by 10,000 bushels of ice. A number of applications were made on Tuesday at Quebec, to Miss MacPherson for a lease on the property, but were refused. Some electrical wires, stolen from Mr. D. B. The Hair Market.

INTERESTING TO WEARERS OF ARTIFICIAL HAIR. Having recently discussed the modern fashions in wearing the hair, it may not be amiss to say a few words respecting the mode by which the artificial hair, from which wigs and chignons are made, is obtained. In a recent number of the London Daily News appeared a most interesting account from its own commissioner on the subject, in which he gave an account of his visit to the largest of the London hair-importing warehouses. A Londoner of his narrative will be as good a way as any of giving our readers a correct idea of the nature and extent of the business. On entering the premises he saw upon a sort of bench, four or five feet in width and extending the whole length of the warehouse front, a number of what are technically called "heads" of hair, resembling small wigs, and tightly bound together at one end. These heads, of more or fewer, take, were in lengths of from eight to twenty inches, soft and silky in texture, and many were of rare shades of color; these were also chignons, wigs, flaxen, golden, red-brown, black and grey. They were heaped in hundreds on the bench before mentioned. Behind them, all around there were racks thickly festooned with the great bunches of hair packed in boxes, some of them as large as a man's hat, and the warehouseman, with his arms, was pulling out handfuls of the tightly packed "heads" and sorting them together into a compartment of two hundred weight, and said there were seven hundred weight more waiting for him at the docks. The weight of hair naturally imported into London is estimated by tons; but the "Commissioner" appears not to have ascertained how many are received. The principal part of it comes from the East Indies, and that quarter of the world yields a greater abundance of the fashionable color, yellow, than any other. The German girls, however, never part with their curls; they generally sell only a piece out of the centre of their back hair. The average value of a "head" of hair is estimated to be about 10s. The hair buyers, or "cutters," as they are technically termed, are pedlars as well, and never part with cash when they can barter for a shearing. They are in the employ of the wholesale dealer, who entrusts them with money and goods, and allows them a commission on the hair.

HAIR. Hair is also imported from Italy and Roumania. An attempt has been made to open a trade with Japan; but, though the Japanese girls were willing to furnish hair for the use of Paris, which hair is used to be to much like horse hair to suit the English market. The most valuable hair of all, owing to its scarcity, is grey. The trade pay a high price for that article, because it is in great demand among the elderly ladies, and it is very difficult to obtain a sufficient supply of it. Besides the hair from the living, the importers purchase "dead hair." But this technical term does not signify that the hair had been cut from a dead man; it is found to be to much like horse hair to suit the English market. The most valuable hair of all, owing to its scarcity, is grey. The trade pay a high price for that article, because it is in great demand among the elderly ladies, and it is very difficult to obtain a sufficient supply of it.
