charge of Dallas T. Hyams on the ground that there was no evidence to implicate him in the crimes In declining the application Police Magistrate Denison said: "I don't wish to review all the evidence and argue the points discussed, but my impression is that, from the evidence adduced that, from the evidence adduced, there is enough to place the accused on trial. There is no doubt that the evidence is not so strong against Dallas Hyams as against the other prisoner. But the evidence has convinced me that the death of young Wells was not due to accident. There has been ample testimony to show that the weight could not have come off the hook and killed the deceased as alleged. Some one killed the deceased as alleged. While the argument for his discharge was in progress, Dallas Hyams became extremely nervous.
