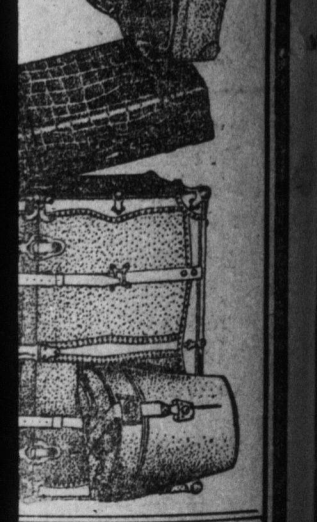

PROVINCIAL REFORM. Last week's meeting of the "General Reform Association for Ontario" provided an interesting commentary on the methods and purposes of the provincial Liberal leaders.

Hitherto the pressure in the cities has been relieved by the encouragement of emigration, also spasmodic efforts have been made to return some of the urban unemployed to the land.

Except to the veriest party hacks, the ignominious discomfiture of the late government was rightly regarded as a victory for reform. As Mr. Ross with rare, if partial, truth observed, the people of Ontario had "in their wisdom prescribed what is known as the rest cure, which some of us need in more ways than one."

He has already worked out the main features of his scheme, which, like all his other agencies, is designed to increase, not lower, the laborer's sense of independence. Its main principle is to give the poor man all the advantage that capital can give and to afford him the expert advice necessary in the earlier stages of the experiment.

General Booth has not ignored the objection to setting inexperienced hands to till the ground, and has appointed a committee of expert agriculturists to select suitable colonies. The qualifications required will be (1) that they shall be unemployed; (2) that they shall know something about the land, and (3) that they shall be sober, honest, industrious, and that their wives and families shall have some sort of aptitude for assisting in the work of the holding.

And the speeches delivered at the meeting of this miscellany "General Reform Association for Ontario" may be read from end to end without a single glimmer of light being obtained on the one great question which vitally affects the province and the Dominion. What else indeed could be expected from a reform organization which calls Mr. Ross and the Hon. A. B. Aylesworth to its platform? The reform that is wanted most of all is the reclamation of public resources, utilities and services from the corporations that now hold them, and the conservation of those that remain, and their future administration for the benefit of the people whose they are.

BRITISH LAND COLONIZATION. Contrary to a notion apparently prevalent on this side of the Atlantic the industrial situation in Great Britain is just now generally satisfactory. In a speech delivered some little time ago the Right Hon. John Burns, president of the local government board, whose department has charge of labor affairs, declared that only a very small proportion of the unemployed were skilled workmen—the vast majority belonged to the floating mass of unskilled laborers who pick up a precarious living in the great cities.

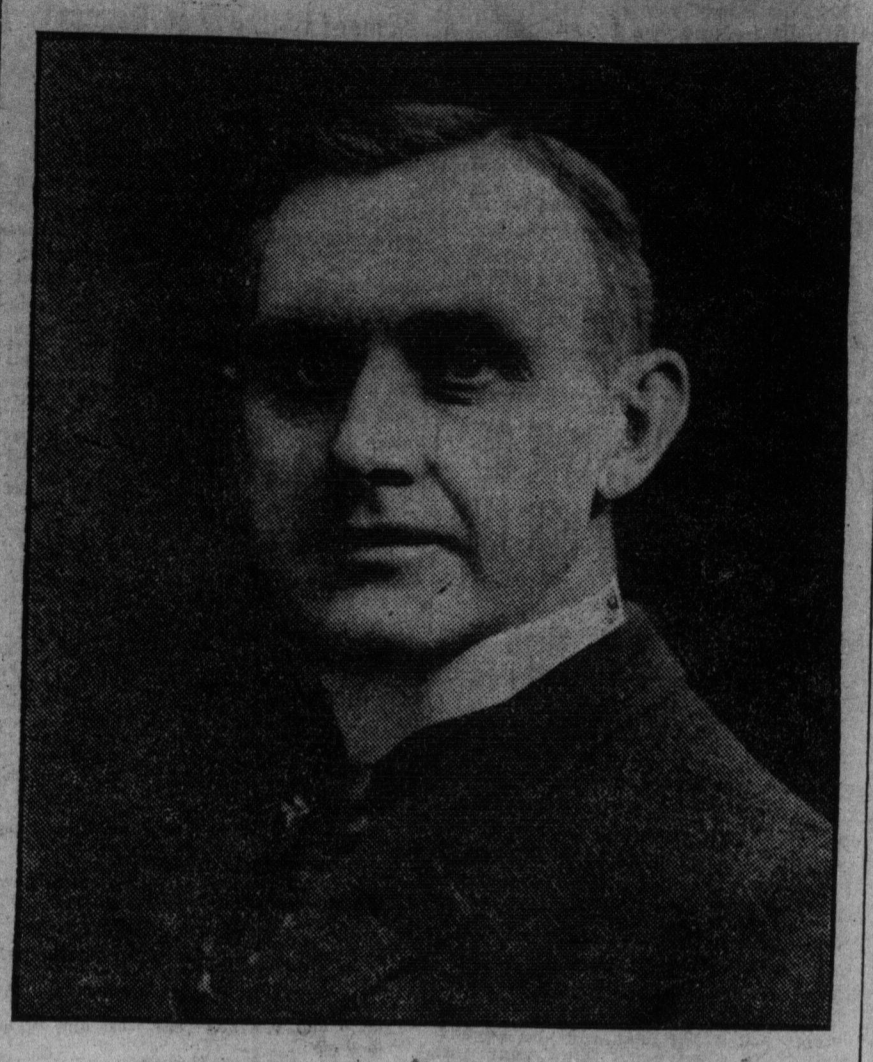

THE UNION OF CHURCHES.

Paper by Rev. E. Ryerson Young, Jr., Before, Brampton District.

In the course of an admirable paper on "The Union of Churches," read by Rev. E. Ryerson Young, Jr., B.A., before the Brampton district meeting at Malton, Mr. Young said, speaking of the present movement towards union.

"Now, we find the Methodist, the Presbyterian and the Congregationalist bodies, two of which have, as we have seen, already taken one degree in Christian charity and partaken of the blessed fruits of church unity, making advances towards one another. Many have been the expressions of mutual affection and admiration; there has been wooing in the dove-cotes, many happy intermarriages of members, and many exchanges of conscientious and rational institutions, has been discussed, and I believe, can be satisfactorily accomplished. A system of church government, acceptable to the vast majority in each body, I also believe, will be evolved. A remarkable system of doctrine has been suggested, and, as far as outspoken words are concerned, it has been generally accepted by all interested parties."

"The chief point of union has not been touched, and only true union will come with it, namely, the harmonizing of the moral ideal. The ideal Presbyterian is one who is ready to bear God's will, whether he be one of the elect or one of the damned. In all things he will see God's will accomplished. All the vicissitudes of life, its ups and downs, its sins and prayers, are of small account. The innermost and overmastering motive, the final outcome, is the chief consideration. During the journey of life, there is the struggle, the flesh lusts against the spirit, the spirit wrestles with the flesh. It was only a Presbyterian who could have written 'Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde.' If man sinned a little, he couldn't help it. But he triumphed for the moment, but the good is still present, and will yet conquer. The chief point is to hold on to the great purpose."

"Yet I doubt not thru the ages one increasing purpose runs. And the thoughts of men are widened by the process of the suns." No special light was expected by the individual, and the enjoyment of love was little dreamed of or expounded. A dogged tenacity of God's sovereignty and will and an equally heroic resignation are the chief characteristics of the "good ideal."

"Who are the saints of your church?" was asked of a prominent Presbyterian minister. "We don't go in for saints; we go in for the doers of God's will," was the reply. No saint, perhaps, wiser than he knew. The moral ideal of Methodism is indeed sainthood. A present, free and full salvation is to be enjoyed by every believer upon the condition of personal faith in the atonement of Jesus Christ and a complete surrender to the Holy Spirit. God's pardoning love is to be enjoyed, and God is to be loved in return, with perfect loving love. The Holy Spirit cleanses the soul of all the roots of bitterness and selfishness—even enemies—are loved as one's own soul. If sin enters the believer's heart the Holy Spirit withdraws. There are no two ways about it. Man's will is single, and he can love but one thing at a time. His present choice and affection is God, or something else; he is, therefore, in the right or in the wrong; he is either a saint or a sinner.

R. train from Owen Sound to Toronto on Wednesday evening of last week was Detective Rogers, recently appointed chief of the detective force of three for Ontario, in succession to the late John W. When the train pulled up at the station here Detective Rogers lost no time in reaching the platform of his coach and where he gained that point of vantage he peered sharply into the crowd of waiters on the dilapidated platform before him. The man in waiting was none other than Walter Jackson, seducer and abortionist suspect. Jackson had been seen hurrying down Mill-street before the arrival of the train, and he was still puffing and snorting and catching his breath when the detective approached, clapping him on the shoulder and warmly shook his hand. Detective and seducer conversed apart from the crowd for the next 15 or 20 minutes, that is, until the "All aboard for Toronto" was called. What was the purpose of the meeting of these two antipodean characters, the sleuth of the law and the man who he is presumed to be seeking to convict one of the gravest and most revolting offences in our criminal calendar? Detective Rogers is found in strange company, and he need not be surprised if there are suspicions abroad the reverse of flattering to him. Popular opinion has almost become convinced that the prosecution in this daft case in lukewarm and lackadaisical and that there is not at all anxiety there should be in the general interest to ferret out and punish the perpetrators of this crime, whose fruit is the tragic and agonizing death of the unfortunate Lizzie Wells. Why should Detective Rogers intensify ever increasing public reaction by being seen in close conference with the confessed seducer of Lizzie Wells, who also to-day stands committed for procuring the abortion which terminated her young life? We are quite sure that the crime of abortion is too abhorrent to Mr. Rogers to permit him to have any sympathy with a man like Jackson. For what, then, did the detective telephone from Owen Sound to the abortionist suspect to meet him at the station here? Is the detective puffing strings behind the scene, and if so, for what purpose? It was certainly not in the interest of Jackson that he met him at the station, for we give the detective the credit of being anxious to hand the station interview for publication, but the facts and purport of that interview will come out sooner or later. The present lamentable indications are part of the authorities to probe the dreadful laundry tragedy to the bottom, but if any heed is paid to local opinion there will be a speedy and radical reversal of a policy and program which, if persisted in to the last hour of rest will be a foul sin on the administration of criminal justice.

Borden Strikes Clear Note Welcomes Public Ownership

Conservative Leader at Truro Affirms That Domain and Franchise are for the People and Not the Speculator—Clean Elections and Merciless Punishment For Offenders Must Be a Watchword.

Truro, N. B., Sept. 8.—(Special)—R. L. Borden struck one clear, strong note at his magnificent meeting this afternoon. He extended a cordial welcome to the great doctrine of public ownership. He believed that it should be applied to national, provincial and municipal affairs alike.

Every Conservative in Truro was present at Victoria Park, and crowds came from miles around. Westville sent a delegation, headed by their own band; there was a trainload from Halifax; New Glasgow, Stellarton and other towns sent imposing delegations.

Mr. Borden began as follows: "We do not depart from the best traditions of the past, but the national policy of today must take account of conditions which have arisen since 1878. In the part of the world is the question of transportation of more vital concern than in Canada and nowhere are the opportunities more favorable on the whole for its solution. The problem begins with the railway, whether at home or abroad. Our natural advantages include a remarkable series of wonderful inland waterways, undeveloped water powers of untold possibilities and great national ports on two oceans."

"The public domain must be regarded as the national resources and facilities with which Canada has been so abundantly endowed, but also the great national franchises and public utilities, the ownership of which is the property of the state, and they must be administered and exploited for the public benefit. The Conservative party maintained this principle in 1904, when it declared that the new transcontinental railway should be a national work, owned and controlled by the state."
