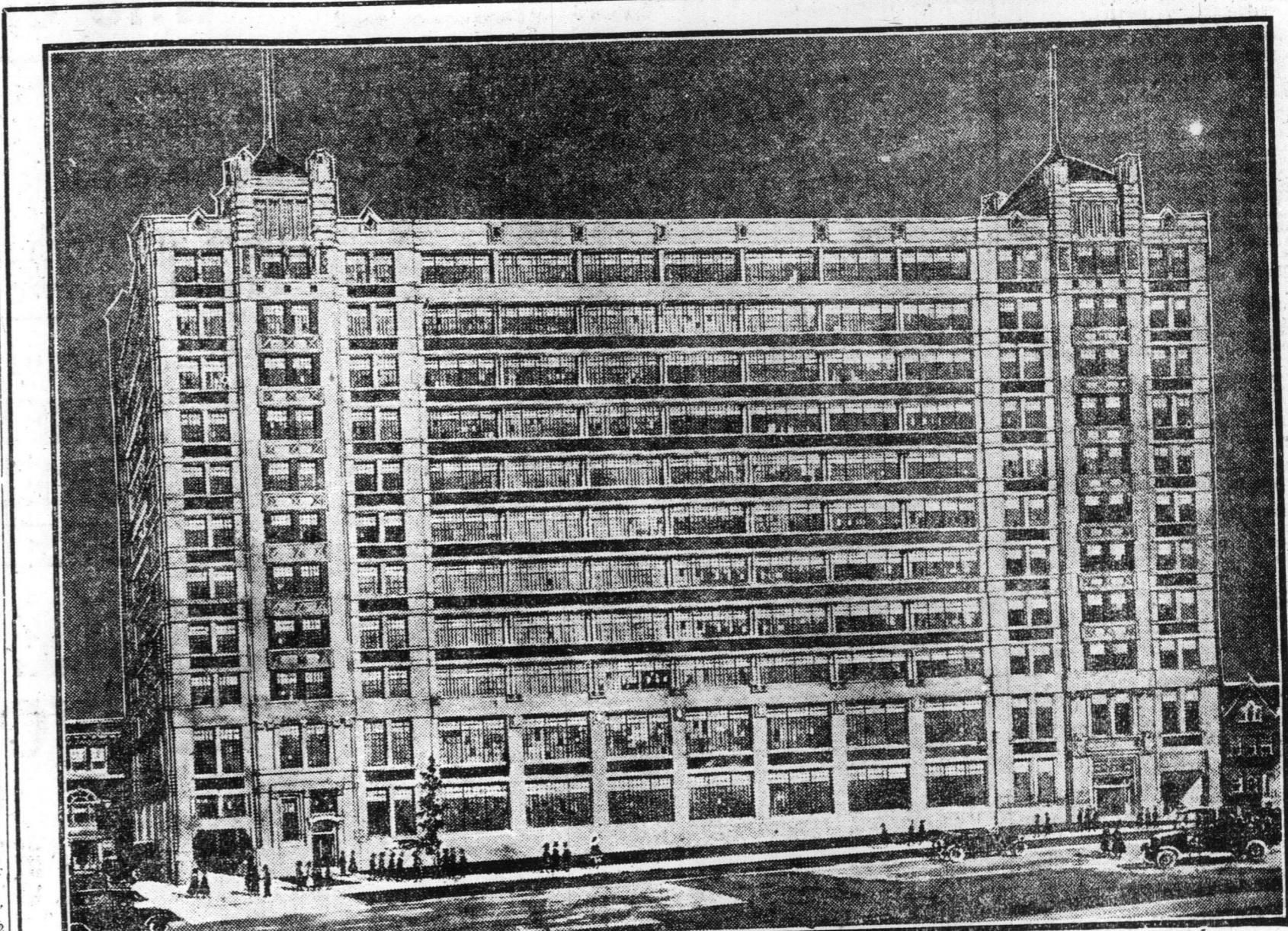

CROWN WITNESS WAS GRILLED BY COUNSEL

John MacMurchy, Valuator, Cross-Examined Severely in McCutcheon Case.

ADMITS INEXPERIENCE

Court Orders All of A. K. Goodman's Papers Handed Over as Exhibit.

Late in the proceedings yesterday at the trial of McCutcheon Brothers before Mr. Justice Middleton and a jury the most severe cross-examination which has yet occurred in the case was made by I. F. Hellmuth, K.C., the witness being John MacMurchy, branch manager of the Northern Trust Company, Calgary, who inspected the Mayfair sub-division.

"Had you ever previous experience in the value of subdivisions at the time when these McCutcheon subdivisions were valued?" he was asked.

"No."

"This was your baby attempt, your initial attempt. I understand to value subdivisions?"

"Yes."

Mr. Hellmuth then took up the valuation of the Mayfair subdivision near Edmonton, which was valued by the witness and he asked if he had set foot in the subdivision at all during 1914.

"No," replied Mr. MacMurchy. With a copy of the report of the police court proceedings in his hand, counsel for the defence said that the Mayfair subdivision had been valued without the valuator ever setting foot on the property, and this was substantiated by the witness.

The Assessment. "What was Mayfair assessed for in 1915?"

"\$445,000."

"So the City of Edmonton assessed this flat, worthless piece of property for \$445,000?" asked Mr. Hellmuth.

"Yes."

"You knew that when you gave evidence in the police court?"

"Yes."

Again referring to the report of the police court proceedings, the lawyer said: "In the police court you were unable to speak regarding the assessed value in Edmonton? Is that not so?"

"That's right."

Here his lordship intervened and said to the witness that it was curious he did not add "except as to the value of Mayfair."

"I anticipated being asked as to Mayfair subdivision later on in the examination," answered the valuator.

Mr. Hellmuth: "You knew the purpose for which you were asked to make these valuations?"

Witness: "Yes and no."

"Now, what do you mean? Such an answer signifies nothing. You said at the police court that you were fully aware what the valuations were required for."

"I thought so at that time."

Speculative Value. Again referring to police court evidence, Mr. Hellmuth said: "You were aware that these valuations were required as far as Mayfair is concerned for the crown?"

"Yes."

Counsel for the defence then referred to the enormous speculation in western real estate in 1912 and 1913, and asked the witness if it was not possible for a property to be sold at a tremendous profit in a very short time, to which MacMurchy replied in the affirmative. He would not dare to say that Mayfair might have fetched in 1912.
