**DEHORNING CATTLE.**

Editor World: Your remarks upon the statement made by D. McDonald of the stock firm of McDonald & Laybe regarding the loss sustained by Canadian farmers in not castrating their lambs and deborning their cattle is of the utmost importance, as the loss is great and the remedy so easily applied that every farmer who raises a lamb or steer to sell should get out of them all he possibly can. Farming, like any other business, needs to be rightly managed and good farming and stock raising go hand in hand. Farming in Ontario has to go to the place where a large amount of fertility needs returning to the soil, and the farmer who can return the largest amount and at the same time sell off his product at a profit is the successful farmer of today. The management of any little detail, like the castration of lambs or deborning of cattle, should have the careful attention. The hog industry of Ontario has grown from small to large proportions, thirty three discussions at Farmers' Institutes and other live stock meetings, thus educating farmers to produce what the market demands. Why not with the lambs, when by castrating them the trade of the country would assume large proportions and could be handled at Toronto instead of Buffalo?

**DEHORNING CATTLE.**

It seems to me to have the reputation of our trade spoiled by neglecting these items. I am glad that Mr. McDonald has taken the trouble to investigate this matter in the United States markets. Although our sheep are generally of better quality, we now see how the Yankees get better prices for their sheep and cattle than we do. Could you not get the agricultural department to make this a real live issue, which requires united effort? No use in me doing it unless my neighbors do. His neglected lambs would just lower the grade of mine. Following Mr. McDonald's suggestions, and having a regular campaign of education among Ontario farmers, let "Do it now" be the motto. If there is a dollar more in the lamb we want it.

**DEHORNING CATTLE.**

Editor World: You kindly give me space in your valuable paper to express a few ideas on the point that McDonald & Laybe, live stock commission salesmen of Toronto, have so recently taken up in regard to the deborning of cattle and castrating of lambs.

I have studied every suggestion that McDonald has made, and there is not one of them disputable. In 1903 there were 1,000,000 lambs shipped to Buffalo market, and in 1904 there were only 400,000, which shows a decrease of 60 per cent.

There are usually in every double deck of lambs 180 in number, and there is a loss of 20 per cent, that is, there are not 20 to 30 culled out from being marketable.

The lambs that are culled out, instead of being sold at 10c per hundred, as McDonald has made, lose 21 per hundred, which means a loss of 21 per cent of a loss. It is in the last four or five years that we got the hog trade where it belongs. I remember when farmers would give us boxes in all shapes and weights all the way from one hundred and fifty to five hundred pounds, but at the present time we get boxes weighing exactly the weights and quality of those that command the best prices. Now we are giving out boxes in all shapes and sizes, and the quality is not so good as it used to be.

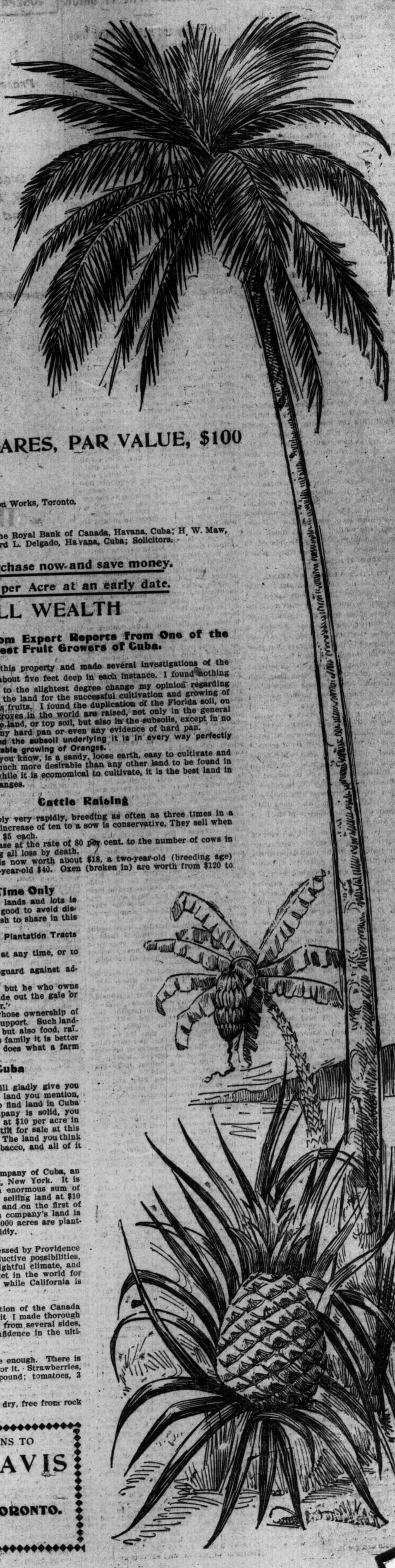
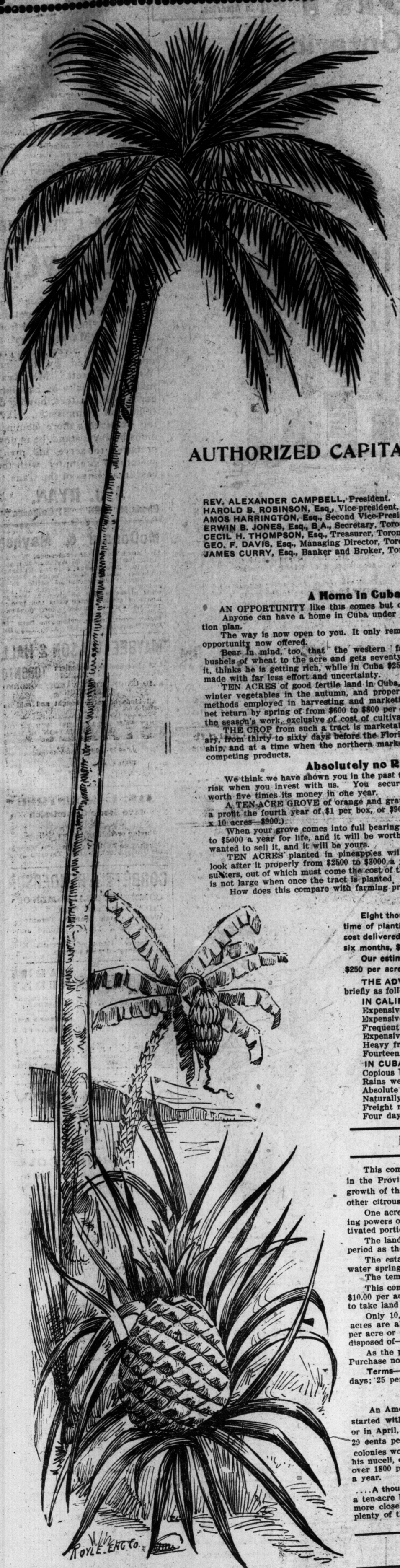

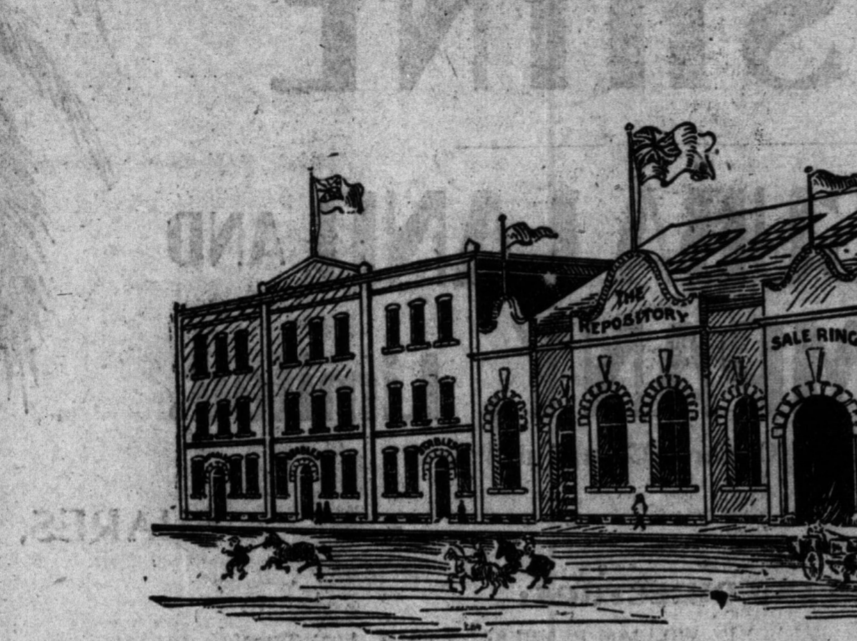
