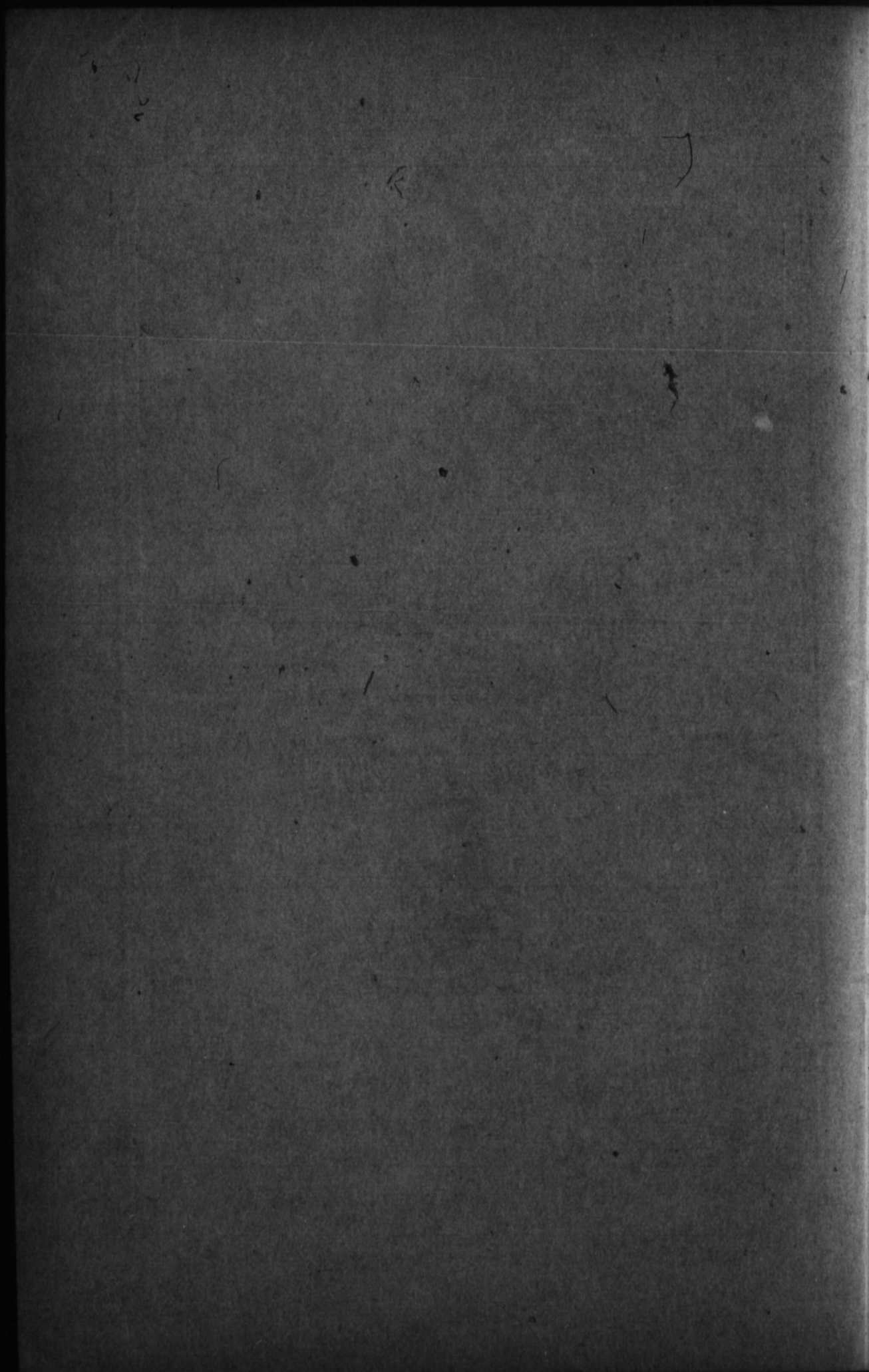

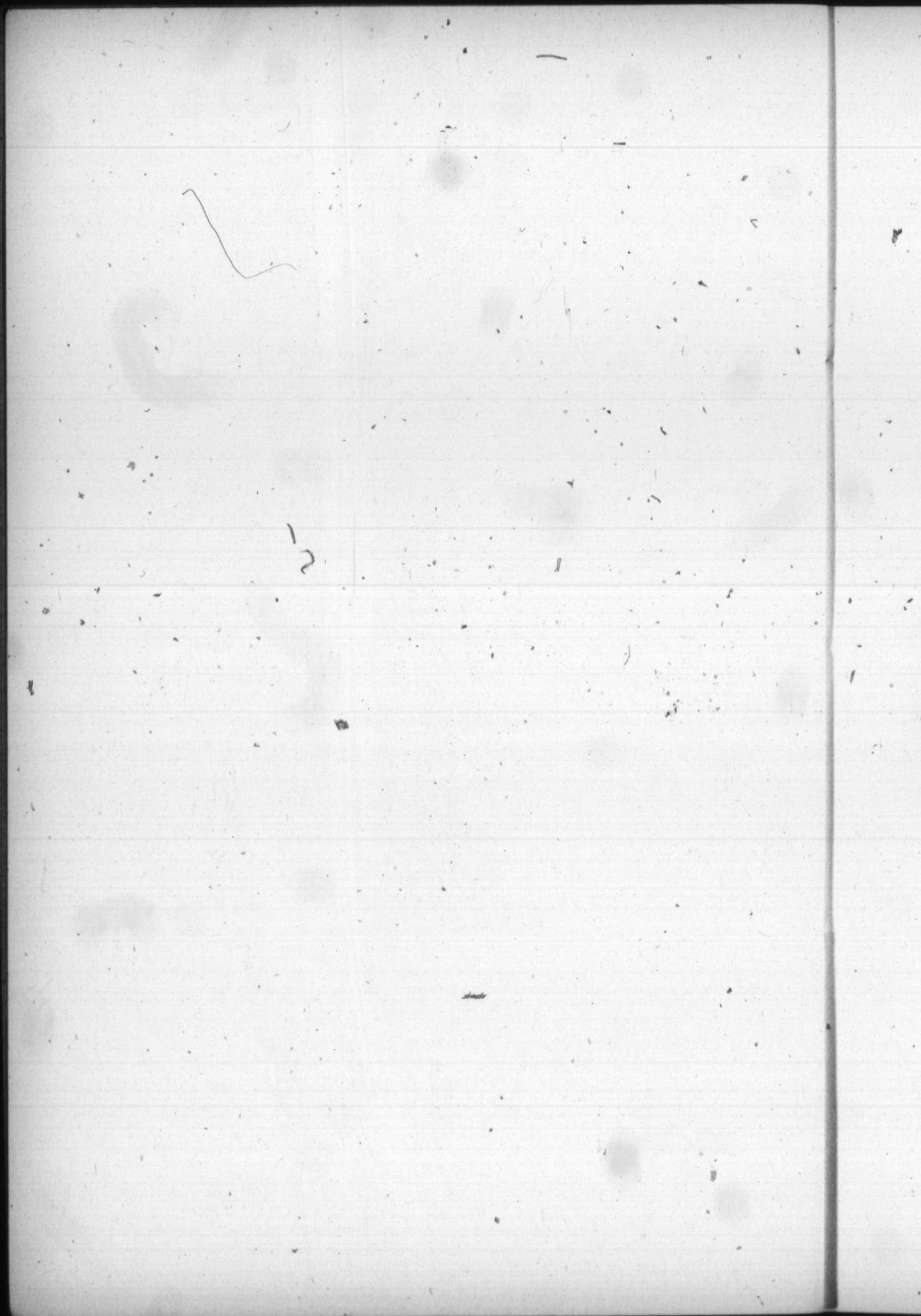

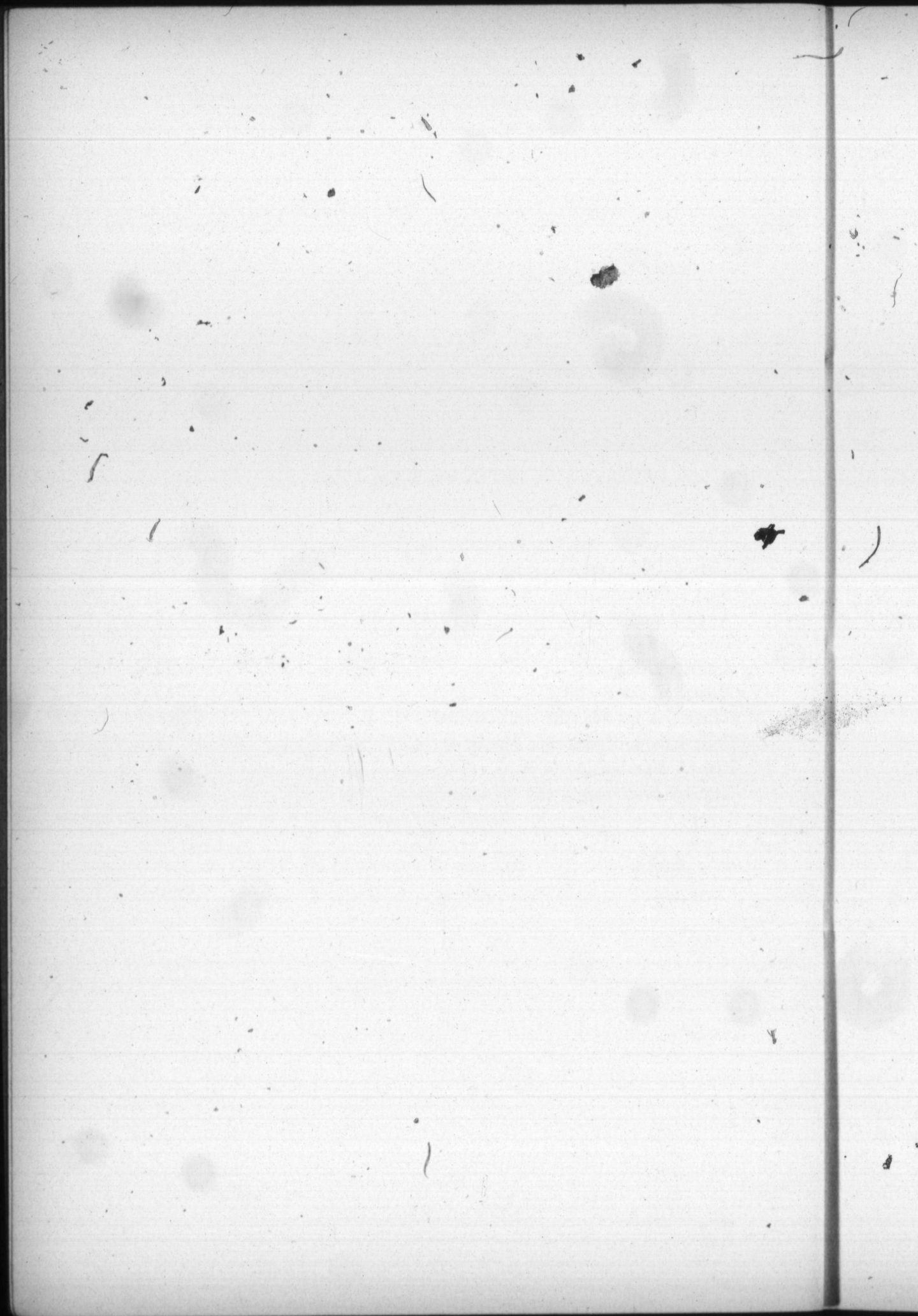

FIFTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

OF THE

St. George's Society

OF THE

CITY OF TORONTO,

FOR THE YEAR 1884.

The year having elapsed for which the Officers and Committee of Management were elected, it becomes their duty to present to the Members this their Fiftieth Annual Report of their operations, together with the usual Financial Statement of the Treasurer :

APPLICANTS FOR RELIEF.

The applications for relief have been far more numerous than in previous years, owing to the class and character of the Immigrants, arriving here ; generally speaking they have been of a respectable appearance, but unused to laborious pursuits. It has consequently been very difficult to find suitable employment for them, and they have thus had to fall back upon the Society for assistance.

Cases have again occurred during the year in which the amounts given have been returned ; and it is always pleasing to record these events.

FINANCIAL.

The financial position of the Society continues to improve, although it is to be regretted that there is this year a small decline in the collections for Annual Membership Fees. Every effort has been made to keep up with the previous year, but many Members that have left the city, the financial depression, and other causes, have prevented that object being attained. However, the Life Memberships, the Donations, and other miscellaneous receipts are all in advance of last year. The balance at the beginning of the year in the hands of the Treasurer was \$418.68. The receipts during the year have been \$3,256.70, the expenditure has been \$2,689.42, leaving a balance in the hands of the Treasurer of \$385.28.

Among the above receipts should be mentioned the very handsome bequest of \$500 by the late J. D. Ridout, Esq., who was President of the Society for four years, and who always took a very active interest in its welfare. This amount, together with the ten Life Membership Fees amounting to one hundred dollars, has been added to the permanent investments of the Society ; also, a bequest by Miss Bate, of one Share Dominion Telegraph Stock. The invested funds now amount to \$9,354.23. One thousand seven hundred and sixty-five applications have been relieved during the past year, involving an outlay of \$1,344.74, thus showing the number of applications relieved to be six hundred and seventy-three more than last year, while the expenditure has been \$248.70 more. The assistance given has been of the usual character, viz., Meat, Bread, Meals, Lodgings, Fuel, &c. Owing to the peculiar circumstances, some families arriving in the early part of the Winter, Stoves, and other Furniture had to be procured for

them. Every possible opportunity has also been availed of to find employment for needy people. Fourteen orders have been given during the year for interments in the Lots of the Society in St. James's Cemetery. The Lots have been kept in good order during the year. A large proportion of the applicants relieved have been visited at their homes.

MEMBERSHIP.

Ten Life Members were elected during the year, and thirty Ordinary Members.

Three Life Members have died during the year, two of them Past Presidents of the Society; viz., Joseph D. Ridout, Esq., one of the founders of the Society. Four times its President, its life-long generous supporter, and its benefactor by his bequest to the permanent fund.

Mr. B. Walton, President in the year 1878, a man of great industry and perseverance, who, as a contractor, had erected many of the largest and best buildings in Toronto.

Mr. H. D. Mason, the son of Mr. J. H. Mason, one of the Society's most zealous and ardent supporters, was a young gentleman of great promise, and is much regretted.

Three Ordinary Members have also died during the past year, viz., Mr. E. Beckett, a very old citizen and much respected; Mr. G. Boyd, also a long resident of Toronto, and associated with one of the oldest and most respectable houses of business in Toronto; and Mr. Wm. Hancock, cut down in the prime of life.

The list of Membership now stands as follows, viz.: 12 Honorary Life Members, 230 Life Members, and 354 Ordinary Members; making a total of 596 Members.

ANNIVERSARY SERVICES.

The first of the Annual Religious Services was, in accordance with long established usage, held in St. James's Cathedral on

the afternoon of April 20th. The sermon was preached by the Rev. Professor Clark of Trinity College, and was a very able and scholarly discourse. Pro. Clark very kindly consented to take the place of the Rev. C. Darling, the elected Chaplain, who was prevented by sickness from filling the engagement. The musical portion of the service by the Choir, under the direction of Mr. E. R. Doward, added much to the interest of the service.

The second service was held in the Bond Street Congregational Church, and the sermon was preached by the Rev. Jos. Wild, D. D., and was one of the Rev. gentleman's usual practical and forcible character. Dr. Wild, also, very kindly took the place of the Rev. T. Sims, the other elected Chaplain who had removed from the City. The Choir here also, under the direction of Mr. Lawson, added much to the interest of the service.

The Churches were both most freely and kindly granted for the Services.

ANNUAL DINNER.

The Annual Dinner was again held at the Walker House on St. George's Day, April 23rd, about ninety gentlemen sat down to Dinner, and it passed off with much good fellowship and brotherly feeling.

EXCURSION TO LORNE PARK.

The Annual Excursion to Lorne Park was given on the 31st of July, a very goodly number attended, and enjoyed it much. The net proceeds were \$28.20.

ST. GEORGE'S UNION.

All the Delegates from this Society with other Members were present at the Annual Meeting of the Convention held at Chicago in August, at which 25 Societies were represented,

and met with the kindest and most cordial welcome. Useful work was accomplished at the Meeting, and the interest in the Convention was maintained throughout. The next Meeting will be held in London, Ontario, Mr. Birrell, of that city, having been elected President for the current year.

CHARTER AND BY-LAWS.

A large Special Committee was appointed early in the year for the purpose of revising the Charter and By-laws in such respects as might be found necessary to meet the requirements of the Society, and for further advancing its objects.

After the most careful consideration a report was presented, and ultimately adopted, at a special General Meeting of the Members called by Notice and Circulars, which recommended the applying to the Local Legislature for an Act to amend the Charter in several important particulars, directed principally to enable the Society to amend its By-laws at any Annual Meeting after a proper Notice and by a two-thirds majority of the Members then present, and to authorize the investment of the Society's funds in Dominion, Provincial, and Municipal Securities, Mortgages of Real Estate, Debentures of Loan Companies, and in paid-up Stock therein, and to clear up doubts in this regard in the Charter as it now exists.

Application has accordingly been made to the Legislature, and a Bill will be presented for its acceptance.

Should the requisite amendments be granted, the Society will have full power to amend its By-laws during the coming year.

COMBINED CHARITIES.

The Officers of the Society elected to represent it at the Conference of the Combined City Charities have manifested much interest in its proceedings, and succeeded in impressing their views upon their colleagues from other Societies, and more especially in their mode of payment for work done in the Wood Yard.

CONCERT IN SHAFTESBURY HALL.

A very excellent Concert was given in Shaftesbury Hall on November 6th. The remuneration paid to the performers took the larger portion of the proceeds, and the net results was \$34.00.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The long established usage of giving a supply of the necessities for a Christmas Dinner to every needy English applicant, was again carried out on Wednesday, December the 24th, in the Store, No. 33 Colborne Street, very kindly lent by A. T. Todd, Esq. Collections of a very free and liberal character were again taken up by the Committee and Stewards during the month of December, to the amount of \$960.

About the same quantities as last year were distributed viz., 8,000 lbs. of Beef, 4,400 lbs. of Bread, 175 lbs. of Tea, and 700 lbs. of Sugar to 721 families, consisting of 3,792 individuals. All that was given was of a good quality.

The usual recommendation papers were distributed among the Members and others early in the month, yet a large proportion of those given to applicants were not presented for exchange until the day previous to the distribution, thus causing very much confusion, and unnecessary trouble, as various Members of the Committee sat on the Thursday, Friday, and Saturday previous, for the giving of the Tickets, to little purpose. The Committee would, therefore, again ask the attention of the Members, on a future occasion, to the printed regulations on the Papers, especially in this regard.

THE TENT.

The Tent was rented during the Summer and produced \$30.00. It is, of course, getting the worse for age and wear.

COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

THE WORK DONE.

As previously stated the applications for relief have been much more numerous than in former years. This has been very largely owing to the class and character of the Immigrants that have lately arrived here. They were generally of a respectable class but unused to laborious pursuits; situations of a light character are not easily obtained, and consequently the burthen upon the Society has been heavy. At the same time it is a source of great gratification to the Committee to be able to say, at the conclusion of their year of office, that the Society stands increasingly high in usefulness, and in the estimation of their fellow citizens, and if their labours have been during the past year unusually heavy, it is to be hoped that those who have been the recipients of the Society's bounty will become useful, industrious, thrifty citizens, and thus give the only reward hoped for.
