REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE.

Your Board of Management beg, at the expiration of their term of office, to submit to the Society a statement of its operations since the last annual meeting, and are pleased to say that owing to the liberality of the Englishmen resident here, and the highly successful result of the concert given on the Queen's Birthday, they have been in a position to enlarge their sphere of usefulness.

During the year 325 persons have been received into the Home, and besides the ordinary inmates, several English lady philanthropists have availed themselves of its accommodation when taking their charges to their several destinations.

In addition to the relief afforded to the inmates of the Home, a considerable amount of aid has been given to the resident English poor of the city, 319 persons having received assistance in the shape of bread, meat, tea, sugar, flour, butter, clothes, and also household utensils, &c., to the value of \$600.

Railway passages, both eastward and westward, have been granted to assist persons to their situations, and ocean steamship passages have been given to many families desirous to return to their friends and homes in England.

Eight funerals have been furnished.

The amount thus expended by the Charitable Committee amounts as will be seen, by the Treasurer's Report, to \$1,220.64.

In view of the unusual amount of distress likely to occur this winter, a special meeting of Englishmen resi-

dent in Montreal was called in November to take into consideration what action the St. George's Society should take.

At that meeting a resolution was unanimously passed authorizing your Charitable Committee to appeal not only to members of the Society but also to all the English residents in Montreal for special donations, whereby the Society might enlarge its operations in extending relief to distressed English poor.

Your Charitable Committee have fulfilled your wishes to the best of their abilities, with what, perhaps under all the circumstances of the case, may be considered good results.

They, however, by no means conclude that these results are what might and ought to have been attained by so powerful an organization for good, as the St. George's Society undoubtedly is. They feel confident that had every member been more sensibly alive to the actual needs of the Society to meet the great distress occasioned by the want of work amongst the laboring classes, and the general stagnation in every branch of trade, much larger contributions, both in money and kind, would have been received, and the blessings of the Society extended farther and wider than can now be done.

The measures adopted by your Charitable Committee have resulted up to the present time, in placing in the hands of the Treasurer some \$500 cash. Donations have also been received of meat, groceries, flour, oatmeal, bread and vegetables sufficient to provide at Christmas time for 170 families, numbering 741 persons.

The Board beg to tender their grateful thanks to the kind donors of the foregoing, as well as to those who, during the year, were good enough to send in provisions and other useful articles. The Home was, by the kindness of Mr. W. A. Evans, who furnished evergreens, and Col. A. A. Stevenson, who lent a handsome flag, duly decorated for Christmas.

Thanks are due, and are hereby tendered, to the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company, for passing persons recommended by your Committee at half fare; also to Messrs. H. and A. Allan, Montreal Ocean S. S. Co., Messrs. D. Torrance & Co., agents Dominion Line, and Mr. D. Shaw, Temperley line of steamers, who have also reduced their fares at the request of your committee.

The thanks of the Society are also due to Mr. Hickson, the general manager of the Grand Trunk Railway, for allowing the society to purchase at cost price sixty cords of wood for distribution to the English poor.

St. George's Day falling last year upon Sunday, your Board determined that no dinner should be held under the Society's auspices. They, however, arranged to have Divine service in the afternoon at St. George's Church, and obtained the consent of the Metropolitan to preach the anniversary sermon, and, as they had anticipated, the church was not only crowded to its utmost capacity, but many were unable to obtain admission.

Your Board also engaged the Victoria Skating Rink for the purpose of giving a promenade concert on the Queen's Birthday.

It is gratifying to state that the concert proved a great success, financially, as your Treasurer's report will show, and also from the very great satisfaction (freely and cordially expressed,) given to the vast assembly by all the arrangements made for their entertainment and comfort.

Your Festivities' Committee have engaged the Victoria Skating Rink for the next anniversary of the

Queen's Birthday, as agreed upon by members of the Board at the last concert.

During the past year thirty-four new members have joined the society, which numbers 21 life and 312 ordinary members. Your Board have, they regret to state, been compelled to strike off the rolls a large number of members who had been many times applied to for their overdue subscription, and had persistently refused or neglected to pay it. This, with the vacancies caused by death, removal from the city, and resignations has brought the membership of the Society to a point ridiculously low, when the number of Englishmen resident here is taken into consideration.

The Finance Committee in presenting their annual report, beg to state that they have examined the Treasure's accounts, compared the entries with the vouchers, and find them to be correct, showing a balance in hand in favor of the Society of \$347.70.

Your Committee have much pleasure in stating that the revenues of the Society for the past year have been very satisfactory, owing in a great measure to the large collection at our St. Ceorge's Day Service, the success of the concert in the Skating Rink on the Queen's Birthday, and also to the liberal response just made to the appeal of your Charitable Committee.

There is, however, one source of revenue which your Committee regret to state has considerably fallen off during the year, viz:—the rental of the stores, one of which has been vacant for many months.

This and other circumstances have led your Committee to seriously consider the advisability of continuing the Home in the present building, and after full deliberation they deem it to be their duty to strongly urge the members of the Society to pass a resolution giving the

Board of Management the requisite power to place the

present property in the market for sale.

When the ground was bought and building erected by your Society, there existed no Government Immigration Home, and in view of the then increasing number of immigrants arriving every year, the present Home did not afford more accommodation than was required. Since, however, the establishment of the Immigration Home, and the ample and excellent provision made for every class of immigrants, your present building is out of all proportion to the actual wants of the Society.
