



# These Men Will Help You Decide

They will tell you in a very short time whether your physical condition absolves you from the call or

A certificate of unfitness from a Medical Board will secure for you freedom from responsibility under the Military Service Act from any Exemption Tribunal. A certificate of fitness will not preclude an appeal for exemption on any ground.


