



THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Canada Sunday School Anion.

PRESENTED TO THE SUBSCRIBERS AT THEIR ANNUAL MEETING, JANUARY 27TH, 1874.

It is with thankful, cheerful mind that the Committee of the Canada S. S. Union hail the return of the season in which, as in former years, they have to present to their friends and supporters an account of the work recently attempted and done, as well as to state afresh the urgent claims of their great undertaking on the generous liberality and deepening sympathy of the church. It becomes the disciples of the Saviour to be modest in manner and subdued in tone, yet if ever any body of Christian workers may be filled with an inspiring consciousness of the vast value of their endeavours and of the unquestionable validity of their appeal for continued co-cperation, those workers are the promoters of religious education by means of Sabbath Schools. For the bringing up of our children in the fear of the Lord is among the primest duties and privileges set before the Church of Christ. This done all will go well with home and country; this undone our wealth, our material blessings, our secular attainments will only become instruments of deepen · vice and spiritual ruin. Whatever of secular knowledge, aptitude for a keen pursuit of business, and general outward decorum may be ensured by the ordinary appliances of the age, still the need of a deep personal interest in the Saviour is paramount, and whatever some pious parents may be able to do for their children, this imperishable blessing can only be secured for thousands of the youth of Canada by the conjoined action of the churches in promoting Sabbath School instruction. No doubt

the past fifty years has witnessed advances in this direction which may well call forth the grateful wonder of the patriotic Christian; nevertheless, when we reflect on the dangers besetting our youth, the as yet undeveloped possibilities of youthful piety, and the extraordinary skill and persistent devotion requisite to the fullest spiritual success, we must admit that we have only just begun to learn the responsibilities and to reap the first fruits of this great undertaking. Our cities and well ordered towns may now be realizing some of the advantages of combined counsel and generous emulation; but towns and cities do not constitute the Dominion. Owing to the rare circumstances of a young country there are thousands of children in small villages and scattered settlements whose means of religious instruction would be almost non-existent were it not for the kindly forethought and liberal action of those who form this Canada Sunday School Union.

At a time when earnest Christian people are praying for the Spirit of Christian Union, the Committee in making their thirty-seventh annual statement, think it right to remind their friends of the purely catholic character and aims of this society. We know no differences among Evangelical Christians. We are one in Christ; our creed is the pure Gospel. Our platform embraces all who love the Lord Jesus in sincerity. Party names are not enrolled on our banner. The salvation of youthful souls is our aim. And in accordance with these principles, so dear to the Saviour's work, we continue and strive so that every poor child of the forest and every lowly settler on the plain shall be provided with the means of knowing "The old old story of Jesus and His Love." Here we take our stand,on this clear line we work, grateful for the rich mercies of the past and conscious of a holy delight in thus being permitted to exhibit our oneness in action for Christ.

AGENCY.

The first historical statement your Committee have to make relates to your Agent's work. The Rev. J. McKillican, has now, for some years been employed by this Union in visiting various parts of the country for the purpose of organizing Schools

where none exist; encouraging and consolidating those in existence, and furnishing supplies of books suitable for Sabbath School use. In the course of years, it follows, that as schools are organized the number of localities where new schools can be organized becomes annually less. But in a broad land where settlers daily break up new ground and penetrate into virgin forests, there will always be some very remote places requiring our attention; and also, schools formed in poor districts far from the stimulating influences of city and church life will demand occasional visits if they are to be kept above the depressing influences incident to a protracted, unrelieved isolation. During the past year regard has been paid to both these features of our work.

With respect to the district traversed, Mr. McKillican says in his report:—"A glance at our field during the year, described on a map would show that every point accessible for effort from Ham 30 miles East, southward for 30 miles down the St. Franci. River were visited. Then, from that point every school section was visited till the last settlement South of Megantic Mountain on the boundary of New Hampshire, a distance of over 50 miles." After visiting some other places along the St. Francis, he continues. "After a drive of 130 miles the unfinished work of last year was taken up in the County of Huntingdon, where I found eight or nine schools doing very good service, though much in need of some improvement, at five other sections, new schools were organized.

The next sphere of labour was among the English speaking settlers above St. Jerome, for 50 miles along the Laurentine Range. In addition to this the district lying North of Prescott and Kingston, on to Ottawa was visited.

It is important that the friends of this Union be again reminded of the spiritual destitution still to be found in this free country. Mr. McKillican says, "I drove 40 miles into the newly broken forest where people were willing, but could not turn out to any meeting, the children lacked shoes and the mothers could not leave, neither could they carry their little ones through the deep snow, not having teams, and the husbands were from home earning money to purchase provisions for their

families." "In another locality I found the Protestant School attended by seven children only: they were poorly clad, and barefoot, shivering round a stove, some sitting on the floor and using as a class book that furnished by the "Freres Chrétiens."

While alluding to the work of Mr. McKillican it is only due to him that the Committee express on their own behalf and that of the members of this Union the truest sympathy with him in the formidable difficulties he has often to encounter and the sufferings he is called to experience. The wretched, half formed roads of remote settlements in bad weather; the chilly shelter of abodes of simple and slender build; the slow action of men separated from town life must often tax his strength and patience and it is only proper that our Christian sympathy and prayers should be recorded. At the same time the kind and hearty hospitality of many of these backwoodsmen and the ready co-operation of Christians in villages and towns are duly appreciated.

In addition to services rendered in collecting for the Union in Montreal, Ottawa, Brockville and other places, the following is a summary of the work done by Mr. McKillican.

Schools organized 29 with Teachers 124 Scholars 1001.

"visited 121" "510" 7554.

Libraries sold 24" "Schools aided by grants 32.

Sermons and addresses delivered 196.

As compared with last year there is not much difference in the figures, except that the scholars in the visited schools numbered 3,899 as against 7554 this year. The total number of schools organized since the commencement of the Union amounts to 998.

GENERAL OPERATIONS.

With respect to other departments of work the Committee have to report that the general operations of the Union have continued as heretofore.

Several conventions have been promoted by the Union and attended by its representatives. These were held at Vankleek Hill, Hawkesbury Village, Danville, Eaton, and Sherbrooke. The committee desire to express their obligation to the Revs. T. Gales, G. H. Wells, J. M. Gibson, Dr. Wilkes, J. Howell, J. McKillican, J. Millard of Toronto and S. B. Scott, Esq., for

services rendered on these occasions. At the Provincial convention held at Toronto in October the Union was represented by the Rev. Gavin Lang and Rev. J. Howell whose kind services were much appreciated by our friends in Ontario. The above conventions, with one exception, were thoroughly successful and indicated a public interest in Sabbath School work which the union may do well to foster.

The issue of books and materials for Sunday School use has been continued with growing success. The little French publication "Le Messager des Familles" still holds on its beneficial course and the committee would specially commend its circulation to the notice of private Christians.

The Union has taken an active interest in the arrangement of the International series of Bible Lessons, two of its members being on the International Committee, and it is gratifying to learn that the adoption of the series has given much unity of action to our Schools, and has also created a widespread and most excellent Biblical Literature bearing on the subject of the Lessons.

During the year efforts were made to secure for Montreal a Teachers' Training class similar to that held by Dr. MacVicar last year, but owing to various causes practical effect could not be given to our wishes before the date of this report. The Committee are, however, happy in being able to state that they have secured the consent of the Rev. Dr. MacVicar and the Rev. Canon Baldwin to conduct two training classes for Teachers the former in the rooms of the Young Mens' Christian Association kindly lent for the occasion and the latter in the Lecture Hall of Trinity Church to commence in the first week of February, an arrangement doubtless agreeable to a very large number of Sunday School Teachers.

In accordance with usage a meeting of Sunday Schools was held on New Years day in St. Andrew's Church, presided over by the Rev. Gavin Lang. Cwing to some oversight in the timely announcement of it the attendance was not so large as usual, but the meeting was interesting. Addresses were delivered by the Revs. Gavin Lang, J. M. Gibson, J. Pitcher and Dr. Wilkes.

The financial statement will, in a measure, speak for itself. It reveals the fact that the Christian public are one with us, and for all subscriptions from young and old thanks are due. the same time there are some items in this account which the Committee would most urgently commend to the generous consideration of their constituents. A deficit of \$1570 is a most grevious burden on a noble religious enterprise. It is earnestly hoped that all who are zealous of the honour of our good cause will pour in even unasked their doubled contributions to enable our zealous agent to do his beneficient work with an unembarassed mind, and the Depositary to send forth its sunny messengers with greater freedom. Besides clearing off the \$1500 to which special reference is to be called, we need a clear annual income from Montreal of \$1600, shall we ask in vain? Are there not generous hearts beating to bless our poor and destitute youth, and to aid the depressed toilers of far off solitudes? we are happy to know that many of our city children sympathize with us in our endeavours, -seeing that several Sunday Schools have handsomely contributed to the general work of the Society, as will be seen in the Appendix. In this matter may we see in relation to our elder friends the fulfilment of the beautiful prophecy, "A little child shall lead them."

During the past year the Depositary has been removed to the new and commodious premises in the Y. M. C. A., Building, where is is hoped a considerable increase in the funds of the Union will be ensured. And it is true that the Committee beg most earnestly to bring before their friends the claims of the It should be remembered that by this Book Department. department the Union secures for all Sunday Schools the cheapest and best selection of Sunday School Libraries, and literature and appliances for Teaching. It is immensely important that our Schools, in remote districts, should be well supplied with the best materials; that those in towns should be able to purchase the best that can be obtained at moderate rates. is not entering on business; It is simply continuing to provide for our Sunday Schools what we know is best for them to have. The children of our villages and settlements must have good mental food, or else they will either starve or be fed with what enfeebles and debases. The Committee has arranged that al your subscriptions and donations shall henceforth be devoted to the support of your Agent and to gratuitous supplies of books to needy Schools. Any profits that may accrue from the Book Department are to go to defray expenses of the Depositary, so as to have your contributions free for benevolent objects. But in order to do this it is necessary to place the Book Department in a sound financial position. It is encumbered with a debt of \$1500 which was brought on some years since by an effort to sustain two agents for organizing Schools without a corresponding increase of income. The value of the stock on hand is put down at \$5000. The Committee urgently desire this liability of \$1600 to be raised at once as it is not wise to encumber a useful enterprise with an old deficit. The usefulness of the department will at once be promoted by so doing; for we shall ensure a better supply of books to meet current demands: the accumulation of an interest debit or a trespass on the ordinary income will be avoided, and there will be free scope to our ingenuity in endeavouring to benefit the more destitute parts of the country.

Thus, once more do we state our case offering this statement of principles and of work done as a plea for our urgency in asking for continued co-operation. Leaving the land of our birth or adoption with true heart; cherishing compassion for the poor children of our rural settlements; and convinced beyond all expression of the need of the most untiring soul in seeking to build up one Sunday School system into one agency more worthy of our Divine Master,—we leave the past to the promised blessing of God, and look on to the future in grateful assurance that He will befriend us by sustaining a loyal enthusiasm for this good cause in the hearts of His children.

DEPOSITORY.

The issues from the Depository for the year have been as follows:

By comparison with last year the issues are 13,162 less, but the value is greater being \$5,946.95 against 51,86.84 in 1872. The total issues from the commencement of the Union amounts to 1,114.504.


