### BOYS' HOME.

#### TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT.

The Twenty-first Annual Meeting, in connection with the Boys' Home, was held on Monday, the 7th February, 1881, at the "Home," on George Street. There was a large attendance of ladies and gentlemen, among the latter were His Worship Mayor McMurrich, the Hon. Vice-Chancellor Blake, Professor Wilson, the Revs. Dr. Potts, John M. King and H. M. Parsons, Mr. A. T. McCord, Mr. John Macdonald and Dr. Thorburn.

Mayor McMurrich occupied the chair.

After some excellent singing by the inmates of the Home, the Chairman called upon the Rev. J. M. King to open the meeting with prayer.

Letters were then read from the Bishop of Toronto, Senator Allan, and Mr. W. H. Howland, regretting their inability to be present. The two latter expressed the hope that either a new building would be erected for the Home, or that the one at present occupied by them might be so enlarged as to give sufficient accommodation for their utmost requirements.

Vice-Chancellor BLAKE then read as follows the Twenty-first Annual Report:

In preparing their Twenty-first Annual Report, the Managers of the Boys' Home would recall the fact that in September last, the Institution attained what may be called its majority, and it is, therefore, they think, but fitting that a short resume of the work accomplished during the twenty-one years of its existence should be given. The Institution, which owed its inception to the thoughtfulness and benevolent exertions of three or four of the old inhabitants of this city, one of whom still holds the position of its first directress, began in a quiet, unpretentious manner in a small building with but three inmates, and advanced step

by step, moving from one rented house to another, as the necessity for greater accommodation became apparent, until in 1863, the Managers were enabled to purchase their valuable property in George street, and to thereon build a house capable of accommodating about sixty inmates, which they still occupy. In 1870, finding that they had not room sufficient to meet the constant applications for admissions, a wing was added to the main building, which has in its turn served its purpose. During the twenty-one years in which the Institution has existed, that is from September, 1859, to September, 1880, no less than 1,091 boys have been received into the "Home," many or whom have remained in it for years, being totally destitute and without relations or friends of any kind. During the same period 300 boys have had situations procured for them with farmers in the country, and several others have been adopted by good Christian people into happy homes. the Institution has, with God's blessing, done a great work in these twenty-one years is undeniable, but the practical result is more fully realized as year by year the lads who have been apprenticed to farmers fulfil their terms of service to the satisfaction of their masters and with credit to themselves. Only a few weeks ago, the Managers had the gratification of a visit from one of the former inmates, who had just completed a long term of apprenticeship and came to claim his earnings, which had been laid by for him, and amounted to \$90. He brought with him a certificate from his clergyman, stating that he was a regular attendant at church, and a steady, honest, and well conducted young man; and his late master, who accompanied him, warmly endorsed these statements. It was difficult for the Managers to recognize in the strong, well-to-do-looking youth before them, the poor, wretched little fellow, who many of them remembered having been placed under their charge by the police some fourteen years before.

Having made this brief retrospect the Managers proceed to give the report of the work done in the Institution during the past year. In January last there were 80 boys resident in the Home, and 68 have since been admitted, making a total of 148 who have received the benefit of the charity during the year 1880. Of these 23 were removed by their parents, 12 were sent to situations in the country, and 9 absconded, leaving the large balance of 104 boys at present in the Home. And this brings the Managers to the point which they most earnestly desire to bring before the public to-day, namely, the absolute

necessity that exists, as the number of inmates so largely increases, for greater accommodation with its accompanying accessories. This matter has already been dwelt upon in former reports; the Managers, therefore, now content themselves with stating that if the work of the Institution is to be carried on in a thoroughly successful manner, and the children kept free from disease and sickness, a new Home must be procured suitable to the requirements of the times. It was hoped that by the advantageous sale of the present property, land might be procured . farther from the city and a new building erected thereon without much additional expenditure of money. This plan, however, the Managers fear may have to be abandoned, in which case they would endeavour, by the sale of part of their property and assistance from the citizens of Toronto, to erect a new Home either on the north or south side of the present building. The Managers, therefore, take this opportunity of enlisting the sympathies of the public in this work, and trust that by thus making known their wants they may be peak a ready and generous response to their appeal for aid in this new and arduous undertaking which they have before them. The Managers are truly thankful to record that the health of the boys has been very good during the past They feel this is greatly to be attributed to the many opportunities of obtaining fresh air and exercise granted to the children during the hot summer months by the captains of the local steamers, who took them repeatedly for trips to the various parks in the neighbourhood of the city, and for which kind thoughtfulness the Managers feel greatly indebted. They would particularly mention the delightful day's outing afforded to the boys through the kindness of Mr. James Fleming, of Brampton, to Lorne Park, whither they were taken in the steamer F. B. Maxwell, and spent the long hours of a glorious summer's day in games and pastimes of all kinds, which was crowned by a bountiful feast provided for them by the members of the Committee. To Mr. McGee the Managers offer many thanks for giving a free pass to over sixty of the boys to the Exhibition in September last, and also to Captain Turner for carrying them thither in one of his commodious steamers.

Many other pleasures, treats, and substantial contributions of supplies have been constantly afforded to the children up to the present time by old and tried friends of the Institution, the list of which would fill up an ordinary report. The Managers trust, therefore, that those who

have thus materially aided them in their work by supplying these poor little ones with so much recreation, enjoyment, and solid comfort, in the shape of provisions of every kind, will one and all accept this general acknowledgment, with their very warmest thanks. Committee desire particularly to draw attention to the handsome donations of \$100 from Col. Gzowski, \$50 from Mr. S. Alcorn, \$50 from Mr. James Lesslie, and \$40 from Mr. Robert Walker. To Dr. Thorburn, who has been the faithful friend and physician of the Institution ever since its commencement, and who still continues to attend the inmates free of all charge, the Managers feel they owe a large debt of gratitude. They have also to acknowledge, with thanks, the gratuitous services of Dr. Reeves and Dr. W. C. Adams. Managers have pleasure in testifying to the continued energy and zea displayed, in the discharge of her duties, by the Matron, Mrs. Munro, and that, too, under disadvantages of no ordinary character. The school continues under the charge of Mrs. Arthurs, who, by the steady and rapid progress made by the boys, proves herself to be a most efficient and painstaking teacher. The Sunday-School is also still conducted by that old friend of the Home, Mr. Thomas, who, with the ladies and gentlemen that assist him, claim the grateful thanks of the Managers

The Treasurer's annual financial statement will be found annexed, a glance at which will show that the funds of the Institution are in a very low state, the balance on hand being quite inadequate to meet the current expenses of the Home for the next eight months, which must elapse before the annual collections are again made; but this state of the finances cannot be wondered at when it is seen that the result of the collections made by the Managers last autumn from house to house in the principal streets of the city was only about \$2,000. \$2,000 in a city of 70,000 inhabitants!

In January last the finances were in the same unsatisfactory condition that they are at present, and by the month of June the Managers found themselves without any means wherewith to carry on their work. In this emergency they decided, after giving the matter prayerful consideration, to throw themselves on the continued generosity of the public, rather than attempt to raise money by means of an entertainment or some such ordinary effort. Each member of the Board undertook to collect \$10 in any way that was most feasible to herself. By this

means \$305 were obtained, which helped to pay the outstanding accounts; but the Managers were at last forced to draw upon a small sum of money they had invested, and which they had striven to avoid touching. They now look forward with much anxiety to the rapid decrease of their small balance on hand this year, which will leave them in the same position in which they found themselves last summer. In conclusion, the Managers would suggest that if the numbers of people who systematically refuse to give anything to the collectors, would now voluntarily send even a small sum of money or provisions to the Home in George street, it would so amply replenish the coffers of the Institution, that the funds above-mentioned could be replaced, and the way made easy for the augmentation and advancement of this much; needed and noble charity.

#### THE MEDICAL REPORT.

The medical report was presented by Dr. Thorburn, showing that the inmates were in general possessed of good health, but that the utmost vigilance was required to prevent the outburst of disease, owing to the defective sanitary arrangements.

REV, H. M. PARSONS moved, seconded by REV. Dr. Potts:

"That in reviewing the history of the Boys' Home during the past twenty-one years, the Lady Managers desire to record their sincere and devout thanksgiving to Almighty God for the gracious protection and favour vouchsafed to it during that time; and they would express their fervent trust that the Lord will still further crown with abundant success their humble efforts to make the Home a continued blessing and protection to the little wanderers who from time to time may find a resting-place within its walls." Carried.

VICE-CHANCELLOR BLAKE moved, seconded by MR. A. T. McCord:

"That in view of the increased demands of this Institution, and the inadequacy of the present building to answer the pressing and immediate wants of the Home, a new building be erected at the earliest moment that it can be accomplished, and this meeting recognizing that which has been done here as a work owned by God, expresses its deep sympathy in this undertaking, and pledges itself to aid in the carrying out of this object." Carried.

Several of the gentlemen present spoke upon the necessity of a new building for the use of the Institution, Dr. Wilson, Mayor McMurrich, and Vice-Chancellor Blake stating that they would each give \$50 towards a fund for that purpose, and Rev. Dr. Potts saying that the Hon. Edward Blake would give \$500, and Mrs. Blake \$500 for the same purpose; and that when the building was erected he would have a brick and a half in it.

The meeting closed by all joining in singing "God Save the Queen."

### OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendliness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken and dissolute parents. The object of this Institution is the prevention of juvenile crime, by training poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the Subscribers at the Annual General Meeting, in February of each year; said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all money belonging to the Institution, as also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be kept with each. All accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the Lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding Lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation, shall visit the "Home"

daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report of the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The Weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Treasurer, Secretary, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at eleven o'clock, a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding Lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the discretion of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding Lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order and stopped.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the age of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at six a.m. until the 30th of September, and at seven a.m. from the 1st of October to the 1st of May; the time for going to rest being from six to eight p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., Dinner at 12, and Tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals, by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant Church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend of the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy of parents, or friends, who are able to pay, shall be \$4.00 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
