FEMALE EMIGRATION.

A Society in England for promoting Female Emigration, of which The Right Honourable Sidney Herbert is the President, having learnt that there exists in Upper Canada, and more especially in the country districts, a demand for female domestic servants, contemplates sending out a certain number of that class, provided arrangements are previously made in this country for their reception and distribution.

Great care is taken in England to select women of good character, whose age and habits fit them for domestic service; and upon inquiry amongst various classes of persons, it is concluded, that, if sent out in numbers not exceeding twenty at a time for any one place, they would speedily be enabled to obtain respectable situations in the neighbourhood.

Toronto is one of the ports to which it is proposed that this emigration should be directed; but in order to co-operate with the Society in England, it will be necessary to provide some place of reception for the emigrants immediately on their landing, where they may be assured of proper superintendence, and a safe asylum from the dangers that beset friendless women on their first arrival in a new country. Some means must also be devised for subsequently distributing them where their services are required.

With these views, the following Committees have been formed in Toronto; and they look with confidence to the public for support, not doubting that the undertaking will meet with encouragement from all classes in this country, and that sufficient funds will be contributed for carrying the proposed measures into effect.

Arrangements have been already entered into, by which a proper place of reception may be secured, provided a moderate sum is raised to meet the cost of furniture and other necessary expenses.
