**STANDING RULES**  
FOR THE  
**CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT**  
OF THE

**Newfoundland Church Society.**

---

**NAME.**

1.—The name of this Society shall be "THE NEW-FOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

**OBJECTS.**

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licenced Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement, or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School-Rooms, and in the purchase of Land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer-Books School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, and (4) to create and maintain a separate fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

**MEMBERS.**

3.—The members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual

sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceeding years with the Bishop's licence.

4.—All members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

#### OFFICERS.

5.—The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President, (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting.

#### MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the Officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeting of the Members resident in each Mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge, at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the Mission, (if possible,) on some Sunday in the previous month; at which Meeting the Clergyman, or in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall

vote *serialim* for the prescribed number of Representatives.

8.—When the voting (which may be continued, if necessary, six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a Member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12.—The President, or a Vice-President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese, holding the Bishop's licence, shall be *ex-officio* honorary Members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

## TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

## GENERAL MEETINGS.

15.—An annual general meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's, who shall publish it (with the Bishop's consent) in his Church on the previous Sunday.

16.—At the annual general meeting a Report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's account duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, (1) by the President; (2) by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or (3) by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

## COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a Collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family, and every adult Member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Churchwardens and other respectable Members of his Congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary, a list of the contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole Collections, on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N. B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their Collections to the Treasurer.

21.—All Clergymen who have collected, as far as possible, from every head of a family, or from every adult Member of the Church in their Mission, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole Collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own missions; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from or independent of the general collection; and provided always that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

#### GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the contributors and their payments and a fourth part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grant from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society in his mission: provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth part of the collections

transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his first annual collection, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.—If a Clergyman leave his mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

25.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President, shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

26.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

27.—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence by the Senior officer of the Society in St. John's.

28.—The Committee shall meet for despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock P.M.

29.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or (2) by two Vice-Presidents; or (3) by any five members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its object be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.

30.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's account up to that season, which account examined, approved, and signed by the auditors as correct. Shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report, and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

31.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

#### DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

32.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same, to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the annual report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

#### PRAYERS.

33.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

#### ALTERATION OF RULES.

34.—These rules may be altered, repealed, or added to by the members assembled at any general meeting; provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing, by the person intending to propose it, to the Secretary at least a month before, for the information of the President and Committee, and that

assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

#### NEW DEANERIES.

35.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

---

NOTE.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

The above Rules were agreed to by the President and Members of the Church Society at an adjourned special general meeting held on Friday, July 16th, 1858.

*At the Eighteenth Anniversary of "THE NEWFOUND-  
LAND CHURCH SOCIETY," held at St. John's, 23rd  
June, 1859.*

The Right Rev. the LORD BISHOP of the Diocese,  
President, in the Chair.

The Report of the Committee having been read by  
the Secretary, and the Treasurer's Account submitted,  
it was moved by H. W. HOYLES, Esq., Q. C., seconded  
by G. J. HAYWARD, Esq. :—

That the Report now read be received, adopted, and printed, to-  
gether with the Treasurer's Account.

Moved by the Venerable Archdeacon LOWER, se-  
conded by EUGENIUS HARVEY, Esq. :—

That this meeting desires to acknowledge with devout thankfulness  
the blessing of Almighty GOD, which has enabled the Society to pro-  
secute its work since the last meeting.

Moved by the Rev. T. M. WOOD, seconded by the  
Rev. J. F. PHELPS :—

That we desire to testify our sympathy and interest in the Diocesan  
Church Societies which exist, under the Bishops of the Church, in  
the other British Colonies, and to express our satisfaction at their  
success.

Moved by the Rev. G. HUTCHINSON, seconded by  
JAMES BAYLY, Esq. :—

That the events of the past year point to the necessity of increased  
exertion for the spread of the knowledge of the truth,—a work which  
this Society desires more fully to carry out.

Moved by JOHN H. WARREN, Esq., seconded by T. R. SMITH, Esq. :—

That this meeting desires to record its conviction that, notwithstanding the cheering features of the Report, there is much need for increased efforts by the friends of the Society, and that it is hoped that all members of the Church will do somewhat towards its support.

Moved by K. M'LEA, Jr., Esq., seconded by G. RENDELL, Esq. :—

That the thanks of the meeting be given to the Officers and Committee for their services during the past year, and that F. C. K. Hepburn, Esq. be requested to act as Treasurer, and the Rev. John Pearson, as Secretary, for the ensuing year.

Moved by Capt. SYNGE, R. E., seconded by J. BOWRING, Esq. :—

That the thanks of the meeting be offered to the Lord Bishop of the Diocese for his kindness in presiding on this occasion.

## REPORT, &c.

---

The Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society invite all the members to join with them in thankfulness to Almighty God, that they have been permitted to continue their labours during another year; and that there is every hope of an extension of their operations, and the consequent firmer establishment of the cause of true religion.

The past year has been one of some importance to the English Church: new and vast fields of labour in parts of the world most distant from each other have been opened to her energies: and we have of late heard of the establishment of several new bishoprics, and the departure of earnest and able men from the land of their fathers to plant our pure religion in strange countries and among strange nations. No member of the Church in Newfoundland can be otherwise than deeply interested in this: and thoughtful men may well ask themselves whether they cannot in this Diocese do much in aid of the Propagation of the Gospel, simply by making an effort to maintain their own religion here, so that the Venerable Society to whom we are so much indebted may be relieved from our burden, and better able to supply the wants of heathen countries and new colonies, whose requirements are far greater than ours.

Surely, we cannot for one moment think of the present condition of India, with its hundred millions of human souls sunk in Pagan unbelief and all those sins and impurities which ever follow Paganism, without feeling it to be our bounden duty in every way to give to them those blessings of Christianity which are our happy possession! And the way in which we can at present most effectually aid in this great work is

by simply discharging that duty which is upon us, and which Christian people must feel to be their duty,—maintaining our own religion and extending it in our own immediate neighbourhood; so that the funds which we consume may be employed in the Propagation of Christianity in heathen lands.

Your Committee cannot but notice that in the adjoining Diocese of Nova Scotia during the last year the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel has thought proper, to make a further reduction in their grant. Their allowance to that Diocese is paid as one sum to the Diocesan Church Society, and this year the gross amount has been reduced £100, and a like reduction will take place every year until the Church there will be entirely on its own resources. Similar reductions are everywhere taking place in the Colonial Church as the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel is gradually assuming a more distinctly Missionary character than heretofore. Nay, for some time past the large and important Diocese of Toronto, the number of whose Clergy is fast increasing, has been entirely on its own resources, and seems in a most remarkable manner to have been blessed of God and endued with fresh vigour and life: while the accounts which we receive from Australia and the Cape, from Dioceses which were created long after this, shew that there is nothing which brings down the blessing of God so abundantly as endeavours made for the maintenance and extension of His Church among ourselves. These facts are mentioned that all here may more clearly see the necessity of availing themselves of the system of the Church Society in placing the Church in Newfoundland upon the only firm basis,—that of the support of its living members.

It was intimated to the members of the Newfoundland Church Society at the last annual Meeting that

the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop "had availed himself of the circumstance of so many of the Clergy being in St. John's to ascertain from them the difficulties which had hitherto prevented them from forwarding to the Treasurer the collections made in their Missions; and that much and careful deliberation and discussion had taken place, and the result would be embodied in certain Rules to be submitted to a general meeting." This special general meeting was held on July 16, 1858, and such alterations made in the Rules as, it was hoped, would be followed by an immediate union with the Society, on the part of several important places. Your Committee, however, greatly regret to state that such has not been the result. It cannot be supposed that there is any want of confidence in the Society on the part of the Clergy of those Missions, as in every such case there has been an application for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans Fund, which owes its existence to the Society, and whose capital was, moreover, originally contributed by those who from the beginning have steadily adhered to its rules. It is earnestly put to all who really have the welfare of the Church at heart to consider whether we can more effectually strengthen the hands of our revered Diocesan, and better extend the ministrations of pure religion, than by uniting our alms as well as our prayers in behalf of our Church Society.

The actual net income of the Society for 1858 is £1243 16s. 3d. This sum is a little less than last year; but in explanation it must be stated that the new Rules require only *one fourth* of the sum collected to be transmitted to the Treasurer: and though some Missions have sent the whole, many have not. Taking this fact into consideration there is certainly no decrease of income, but the contrary. Indeed, the gross income as compared with that of last year is increased £400: while there is also much

to encourage in the liberal contributions of several particular districts. The following are the total sums collected for the Church Society in the different Missions.

Nor must we forget to add to this large sums of money which have been raised for local purposes in different places; for example, £80 for the repairs of Heart's Content Church, and £80 for New Porlican Church—both in one Mission; and upwards of £250 in Greenspond for the new Church there; as well as the sum of nearly £200 from the whole Diocese for the Widows and Orphans Fund. These matters shew that there is much more contributed than appears in the Subscription List forwarded to the Society.

The Committee have much pleasure in laying before this meeting several Letters which have been received from Clergymen, respecting the support which the Society meets with in their missions.

The Rev. W. K. WHITE, of Harbor Briton, thus writes—

"I beg leave herewith to transmit my Church Society Returns, with the amount of Subscriptions received. The names are fewer this year than last, but as the subscriptions of those wanting have heretofore been paid through the Merchants' offices and not to me in person, I cannot explain the deficiency.

"I had flattered myself that I should have reached at least my last

year's amount, and much regret the disappointment. I am not aware of any blame to be attached to me. I was absent from the mission some considerable time this summer in St. John's and elsewhere; but I have managed to extend my cruise, and have celebrated Divine Service in thirty-one different places, and have baptized fifty children and married more couples than in any year before, besides which, several couples have gone from Garnish to Burin, the road between those places being so far perfected as to make the eighteen miles of land much more convenient and pleasant for females than the twenty-five miles of water which separate Garnish from me."

**The Rev. J. DARRELL, of Herring Neck, says:—**

"The amount subscribed to the Church Society is a slight increase on that of the preceding year. I hope I shall be enabled to report a greater increase this year. I can however testify to the willingness with which many gave, several brought their subscriptions without waiting to be called upon by me, and expressed their regret that they were unable to give more."

**The Rev. HENRY PETLEY of Heart's Content thus writes:—**

"I forward you herewith the names of the Subscribers to the Church Society and am thankful to say they will shew an increase of donations. But much more has been laid out for Church purposes than is here credited. Heart's Content has spent on its Church about £80, and New Perlican the same sum on the Church there. Heart's Ease and its neighbourhood have put up with some little Government aid a School-Church—and I hope to hear this has been accomplished at Chance Cove also.

But I feel for all this that much more is expected of us—and very justly.—Until we are able to secure another Missionary, we are only doing our work by halves."

**The Rev. GEORGE M. JOHNSON reports:**

"I beg to forward my usual return of monies collected for the Church Society.

"I have much satisfaction in remarking that the collection for Portugal Cove Mission has the past year exceeded by one fourth that of any previous year—besides which an additional sum of about £10 was also collected, principally for the purpose of helping to enlarge the Church at Broad Cove, where increased room is much needed.

"The Out-harbor Mission Collection, amounting to nearly £80, is also somewhat larger than the Collection in that Mission for the year 1857, and would have been I think larger still had I been better able to attend to it, as I hope I shall be this year when I shall have one Mission only to visit instead of two, as I had last year. I feel it due, however, to the people of Petty Harbor, Pouch Cove, and Torbay to

say that their readiness and forwardness, of which I hope I shall ever be able to speak, alone have placed me in a position to make the favorable report it is my pleasure to be able to lay before the Church Society. For the spirit and manner in which their contributions were paid, I desire to record my thanks, no less than for the payments themselves.

"I have also to thank the Society for grants on my application through his Lordship the Bishop to the Churches of Petty Harbor, Pouch Cove, Torbay, Broad Cove, and Lanea Cove. Special collections to meet the Society's liberality are being made in the two first named places, and Broad Cove, and will be made in the other places also; so that between the aid of the Society, and the efforts of the people called forth in response thereto, I hope to see something shortly done for the improvement of all these Churches."

The Rev. C. WALSH thus writes:—

"I beg to forward to you my Church Society's Returns for the year 1858 which I have been a long time making up, but this is unavoidable for more reasons than one. I have kept the list open as long as possible with the hope of getting in some subscriptions which ought to be paid, some of which have been paid, but others not. I am glad to find that the amount is not less than the previous year but has slightly increased, which I am sure will continue to be the case the longer the Church Society exists, and its principles and objects are brought home to the respective members of our flocks. There is no unwillingness on the part of the people to support the Church Society when they are *really* informed and are taught to understand the advantages and benefits to be derived from union and concerted action in such matters. On the contrary, I believe, they thoroughly appreciate the plan and system which unites all in joint efforts for the promotion of a common cause, and the making this known at present devolves upon the pastor of each flock. I believe some good result might be effected, if the means could be found of carrying it out, if a deputation of *Lay* and Clerical members of the Church Society visited the principal Missions in Conception Bay, once in the course of two or three years, for the purpose of making known what the Church Society *is* and is intended to serve. My experience tells me that a large number of the Members of our Church would in this part be likely to be awakened so as to support the Society, I cannot report any change since last year in the matter of the erection of a Parsonage. Neither do I think the means to any extent towards the work will be forthcoming from this flock while they have my services only fortnightly on Sunday, and there is nothing else to urge them to do their duty in this respect. Moreover the Mission is too poor to do more than assist in the matter of a Parsonage.

From the Rev. EDWARD COLLEY of Hermitage Cove:  
"I am sorry I have not been able to forward my list of Subscri-

bers to the Newfoundland Church Society before; but I missed the January mail, and since then we have been blockaded with ice. While I cannot boast of any increase this year over last in the amount collected, I am glad to say we have not gone back; although I have lost several good Subscribers by removal to distant Missions and death.

" Besides which, I have collected £6 for the Clergy Widows and Orphans Fund, making in all £89 1s. 6d. for Church purposes, independent of my offertory Collections.

" Yet when I answer the question put by the Home Society, whether my people are doing all they can, I feel that many are a very long way from doing what they may, and some, as I have said upon a former occasion, do nothing at all. Numbers could I feel sure (with the catch of fish they have lately had) as easily give Twenty Shillings as they could have given Ten Shillings some little time ago. But still, I must not complain, for I frequently meet with much kindness from many of my people."

It had for a long time been felt that it was desirable to form in this Diocese a fund for the relief of the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy; and last year the Church Society, on the recommendation of the Committee, devoted £500 towards this object. Rules for the government of the Fund, which had been previously discussed, were submitted to a general meeting and adopted. It is a source of great satisfaction to know that in many instances the Clergy have gladly and thankfully availed themselves of the opportunity afforded by the Society of securing a small pension of £30 for their Widows and Children. Thirty-one Clergymen have enrolled themselves Members, and have paid their own annual premium; while the Congregations of their respective Missions have in nearly every case most liberally supported the Fund by their contributions. Happily, during the past year, there has been no claim, and the whole annual income has been added to the Capital, which, together with several generous donations, now amounts to upwards of £1,000. The Society will be thankful that they are thus permitted to lighten the burden and cares of the Clergy, by enabling them to

make some little provision for those bound to them by the ties of nature, whose probable future circumstances have ever been to them a source of great anxiety. The Treasurer's Account with the Widows and Orphans Fund, which is appended to the Report, will show its actual and satisfactory state at this present time.

It is a matter of great thankfulness that the Lord Bishop has been able to fill up the Missions which were vacant by the removal of Clergymen from the Diocese; and also to supply the place of one Clergyman who was absent for medical help; and now to afford assistance to another who is in a most delicate state of health. The Mission of LaPoile has for the last year been served by the Rev. G. Hooper, and the Outharbours of St. John's by the Rev. G. Johnson, whose place at Portugal Cove has been temporarily supplied by the Rev. M. Johnson. At the Ordination on Trinity Sunday, a further addition was made to the number and strength of the Clergy by the admission of Mr. Tucker, of the Theological Institute, to the diaconate, and the Rev. W. LeGallais to the priesthood. The Bishop, it is understood, hopes and intends to take the Rev. M. Johnson to Forteau, to supply that Mission, and to bring the Rev. A. Gifford to Portugal Cove. Mr. Tucker will accompany the Bishop in the Church Ship.

Your Committee cannot conclude this Report without calling to mind the remarks made at the meeting last year by His Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese, upon the necessity which exists for the sub-division of many of the more extensive Missions, and his earnest desire to find men to undertake, with God's grace, the work of the Ministry in this Island. The Ordinations of the last two years have indeed enabled our Bishop to supply those Missions which were vacant, but they have not, alas! sufficed to place additional

Clergymen where they are absolutely needed. You will this evening hear from His Lordship one chief object of his late journey to England; and that the demands of India and the Cape, and the new Diocese of British Columbia, were such that all those whose hearts turned to the Missionary work of the Church, were drawn to the scenes of direct conflict with heathenism, and to the newer Colonies. Still, some Students for the Institution accompanied the Bishop on his return, and we may also congratulate His Lordship, and indeed ourselves, both for his and our own sake, that he was accompanied by the friend whose services were formerly so valuable in this neighbourhood, and who, we have reason to know, has rendered much important assistance both to the Bishop and the Church of Newfoundland during his absence.

But we must feel that to ourselves we must look, and that we must in faith and love to God, offer not only our money, but ourselves and our sons for the service of Almighty God and of His Church. Few offer themselves for the work of the priesthood; and we should indeed do well to pray to God that He would raise up amongst us true Ministers to labour for the salvation of men's immortal souls, and to bring home to all the saving knowledge of the Gospel of Christ.


