

To the Committee, to which were referred the act of the Legislature of Virginia, of the 2d of January, 1780, and the report thereon, report, that they have considered the several matters referred to them, and find it expedient, that the legislature of Virginia, by their act of January, 1780, resolved that they would yield to the Congress of the United States, for the benefit of the Indians, all right, title and claim to the said commonwealth, hath to the lands north of the river Ohio, upon the following conditions, viz.

1. That the territory so ceded should be laid out and formed into States, containing a suitable extent of territory, not less than one hundred, nor more than two hundred and fifty miles square, or as near thereto as circumstances would admit; and that the states so formed should be distinct republican states, and admitted members of the federal union, having the same rights of sovereignty, freedom and independence as the other states.

2. That Virginia should be allowed and fully reimbursed by the United States, her actual expences in reducing the British posts at the Kaskaskies and St. Vincents; the expence of maintaining garrisons and supporting civil government there, since the reduction of the said posts, and in general all the charge she has incurred on account of the country on the north west side of the Ohio river, since the commencement of the present war.

3. That the French and Canadian inhabitants, and other settlers of the Kaskaskies, St. Vincents and the neighbouring villages, who have professed themselves citizens of Virginia, should have their possessions and titles confirmed to them, and should be protected in the enjoyment of their rights and liberty; for which purpose troops should be stationed there at the charge of the U.

S. S. five, according to their usual respective proportions in general charge and expenditure, and should be fairly and bona fide disposed of for that purpose, and for other uses or purposes whatsoever.

4. And therefore that all purchases and deeds from Indians or Indians, or from any Indian nation or tribes, for any lands within any part of the said territory, which have been or should be made for the use or benefit of any private person or persons whatsoever, and all grants within the ceded territory, inconsistent with the aforesaid rights, laws and customs of Virginia shall be deemed and declared absolutely void and of no effect, in the same manner as if the said territory still remained subject to, and part of the commonwealth of Virginia.

5. That all the remaining territory of Virginia situated between the Atlantic ocean and the south side of the river Ohio, and the Maryland, Pennsylvania and North-Carolina boundaries should be guaranteed to the commonwealth of Virginia by the said United States.

Whereupon your committee are of opinion, that the first condition is provided for by the act of Congress the 10th of October, 1780.

That the second condition is substantially comprehended in the engagement made by Congress in the said act, and that one commissioner should be appointed by Congress, one by the state of Virginia, and another by two commissioners, who, in a majority of whom, shall be authorised and empowered to adjust and liquidate the account of the necessary and reasonable expenses incurred by the said state for the purpose mentioned in said condition.

ens of Virginia, should have their pensions and titles confirmed to them, and should be protected in the enjoyment of their rights and liberty; for which purpose troops should be stationed there at the charge of the United States, to protect them from the encroachments of the British forces at Detroit, or elsewhere, unless the events of the war should render it impracticable.

4. As colonel George Rogers Clarke planned and executed the secret expedition by which the British posts were reduced, and was promised, if the enterprize succeeded, liberal grants in lands in that country, for the officers and soldiers who first marched thither with him, that a tract of land not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand acres, should be allowed and granted to the said officers and soldiers, and the other officers and soldiers that have been since incorporated into the said regiment, to be laid off in one tract, the length of which not to exceed double the breadth in such place, on the north-west side of the Ohio, as the majority of the officers should choose, and to be afterwards divided among the said officers and soldiers in due proportion, according to the laws of Virginia.

5. That in case the quantity of good lands on the south-west side of the Ohio, upon the waters of Cumberland river, and between the Green river and Tennessee river, which have been reserved by law for the Virginia troops now continental establishment, should, from the North-Carolina line bearing in further upon the Cumberland lands than was expected, prove insufficient for their legal quantities, the deficiency should be made up to the said troops in good lands, to be laid off between the rivers Ohio and Little Miami, on the north-west side of the river Ohio, in such proportions as have been engaged to them by the laws of Virginia.

6. That all the lands within the territory so ceded to the United States, and not reserved for, or appropriated to any of the before-mentioned purposes, or disposed of bounties to the officers and soldiers of the American army, should be considered as a common fund for the use and benefit of such of the United American States as have become or shall become members of the confederation or federal alliance of the said states, Virginia includ-

ing account of the necessary and reasonable expenses incurred by the said state for the objects mentioned in said condition.

With respect to the 3d condition, the committee of opinion, that the territories herein intended should be their possession, and titles confirmed to them, and protected in the enjoyment of their rights and liberties.

Your committee are further of opinion, that the 4th and 6th conditions being reasonable, should be agreed to by Congress; with respect to the 7th condition, your committee are of opinion, that it would be improper for Congress by a resolve to declare the purchases and acquisitions mentioned absolutely void and of no effect; and that the 6th condition, engaging how the lands beyond the Ohio shall be disposed of, is sufficient on that point.

As to the last condition, your committee are of opinion, that Congress cannot agree to guarantee to the Commonwealth of Virginia, the land described in said condition without entering into a division of right of the State of Virginia to the said land, and by the acts of Congress it appears to have been their intention, which the committee cannot but approve, to void all claim of the territorial rights of individual states, and only to require and accept a certain kind of claims, whatsoever they might be, to vacant lands. Your committee conceive this condition of a cession to be either unnecessary or unenforceable; because if the land above-mentioned is really the property of the State of Virginia, it is sufficiently secured by the cession, and if it is not the property of that state, there is no reason why it should not be so.

Your committee therefore report the following, and that it be referred to the Committee of Correspondence for consideration; and that a copy of the same be transmitted to the State of Virginia, to the Legislature, and to the Executive, and be laid before the House of Representatives, and the Senate of Congress in time.
