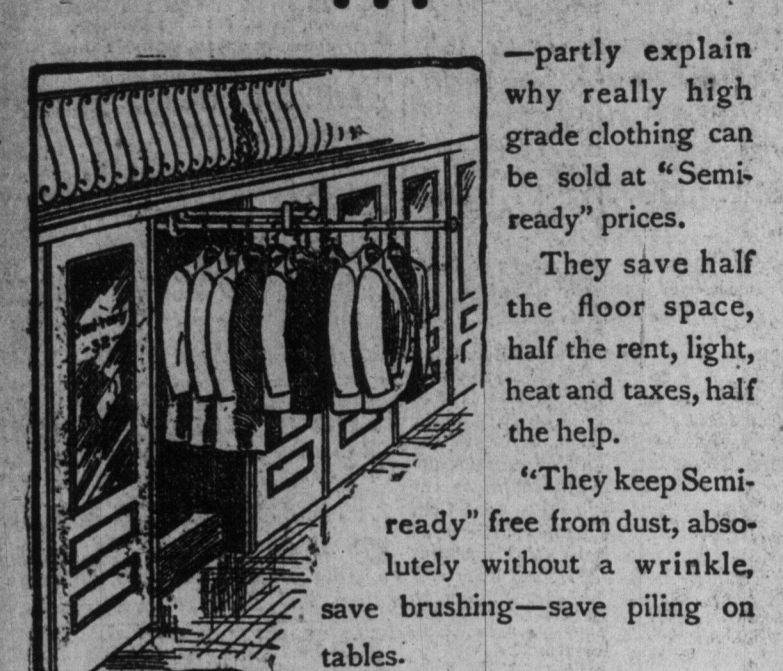

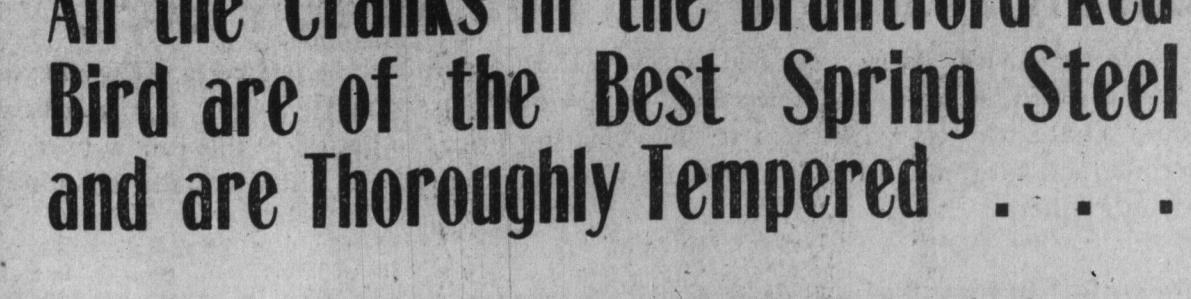

WELL WASHED?
Eight Thousand Washerwomen Have Gone on Strike, and Dirty Linen is Seriously Threatened.

Mr. Weldon, Toronto Manager of the Eddy Company, Thus Describes Hull.

Hotels and Restaurants Feel It.
And Already Private Families Are Affected to Some Extent—Serious Outlook.

Paris, April 28.—A famine of clean linen is more disturbing to the Parisians than the incomplete condition of the Exposition grounds. Eight thousand Paris washerwomen have struck for higher wages and shorter hours, and serious inconvenience has already been caused. The hotel managers and keepers of restaurants bitterly complain that half their linen is not returned from the wash, and private families are also feeling the pinch. The strike commenced at Boulevard-sur-Seine, and spread to several other quarters where laundries are situated. The laundry workpeople around Paris number 200,000, and if the strikers succeed in getting their adhesion the Parisians will have to go unshod.

Infux of Visitors Helps.
The fact that the influx of visitors to the Exposition has begun, necessitating heavy demands on the laundries, gave the washerwomen an opportunity to put the screws on their employers, who, naturally, are much incensed by this attempt to force concessions. They have already concluded contracts in many cases with hotels, restaurants and other establishments for the duration of the season at determined rates. The masters offered a partial increase of wages, but the strikers, thus far, have refused to compromise. Bands of working people gather in the neighborhood of the laundries where wear is still partially continued, and try to persuade the non-strikers to join them. No serious disorder has occurred, but the police are taking precautions, and detachments of gendarmes have been drafted to the districts where trouble is possible.

Washerwomen's March on Paris.
There is some talk of the strikers marching into Paris, to urge the city laundry people to cease work—a sort of Caxton's march of washerwomen of Paris. This, however, is not likely to prove an acceptable attraction to the visitors to the Exposition, who, themselves, will be the severest sufferers by the strike in any case, as they will certainly be called upon to supply the linen if the employers find themselves obliged to concede the strikers' demands.
