THE SIXTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The Annual Meeting of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital was held in the Governor's Hall of the Institution, on Tuesday, the 20th May, 1884, Mr. Andrew Robertson, President of the Board of Governors, in the chair.

The Secretary read the following report, which was adopted and ordered to be printed for circulation amongst the subscribers:

Gentlemen of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital:

I have the honor to present a brief report of the proceedings of the governors during the year which terminated 30th April, 1884:—

The expenditure of the year was.....	\$40,713 36

The increased expenditure in 1883-84 over that of 1882-83 has occurred chiefly in the following items:—Provisions, \$759.88; instruments, \$100.20; dry goods, bedding, etc., \$449.61; fuel, \$595.39; furniture, crockery, etc., \$105.01 and other expenditure, \$75.08. The accounts show a slightly reduced expenditure under the following heads:—Drugs and medicines, \$59.79; liquors, \$20.33; printing, advertising and stationery, \$63.14; insurance and law charges, \$500.74; repairs, \$307.33; wages, \$175.68.

The amounts received from the following sources of revenue during the year when compared with those of 1882-83 show the following reductions:—Subscriptions and donations, \$343.63; city church collections, \$105.83; country church collections, \$21.81; private pay patients, \$93.60; provincial government grant, \$400; Dominion dues for sailors, \$403.20

On the other hand, there has been an increase of revenue derived from the following sources: Subscriptions from employés, \$404.70;

public pay patients, \$201; students' fees, \$74; interest and rents, \$2,089.05; other receipts, \$67.

In addition to the ordinary annual donations to the permanent fund qualifying the donors to become life governors, amounting to \$2,000, the governors have the pleasure of acknowledging the munificent gift by Mr. George Stephen of "first mortgage land grant bonds of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company" for \$50,000, for the purpose of erecting a wing or building, commemorative of the late Lt. George W. Campbell (a noble proof of esteem for a friend), as well as the receipt of the following:

The average daily number of patients in the wards throughout the year was 138; the average time of each patient in the hospital was 25.03 days, and the total number of days spent in hospital was 47,590.

The percentage of deaths to the whole number of cases treated during the year in the hospital is 7.27 per centum; deducting 26 deaths that occurred within three days after admission, the mortality for the year is reduced to 6 per centum. It was 4.79 per cent in 1882-83; 6 per cent. in 1881-82, and 5.4 per cent. in 1880-81.

There were 11,386 consultations given in the "general out-door" department, an increase of 761 over the number of the preceding year. In the out-door eye and ear department 1,172 new patients were treated.

There has been an unusual prevalence of typhoid fever and of diphtheria during the past year, the total admissions for the respective diseases having been only once exceeded in the last decade. Thus there were 131 cases of typhoid in 1883-84 as against 155 in 1881-82, and 50 cases of diphtheria in 1883-84 as against 52 in 1877-78. The admissions for scarlatina and measles attained about the average of the past ten years.

Provision has been made for the isolation of these highly contagious diseases during the year by the erection of a brick-enclosed building upon St. Dominique street, into which the nurses have been removed from the upper story of the building formerly used as a fever hospital. The flat thus vacated has been devoted to the treatment of contagious diseases, and has proved of much service,

Another important provision for the comfort of the sick made during the year is an ambulance for the conveyance of the sick or injured to the hospital. Its cost was defrayed by a special collection amongst a few friends of the institution.

The governors during the past year have seriously considered the subject of the erection of one or more of the pavilions of the new hospital, for which land was purchased in 1875, and plans prepared under the direction of the late president, Mr. Peter Redpath, by one of the first hospital architects in England. The acquisition in February last of the Scott property upon St. Dominique and Lagauchetiere streets, by the committee of management, for a considerably less sum than was authorized to be paid for it at a meeting of governors on the 10th November, 1880, and the further purchase last October of the Dufrense property, upon Lagauchetiere street, have put the corporation at last in possession of sufficient land upon which to erect buildings to form part of a general design for the hospital, which shall combine the latest results of experience in economy of administration and scientific provisions for the relief of suffering and the saving of human life.

The propriety of building the proposed new hospital upon the land thus recently acquired and that previously in possession of the corporation—that is upon the present site—which had been approved of on several former occasions by the governors, was confirmed at the last quarterly meeting, and there remain three important questions ably put by the president in a letter dated 6th March, 1884, and sent to all the governors.

“First—Should the plans referred to and so carefully supervised by Mr. Redpath, be adopted, or if not, what steps should be taken in the premises?

“Second—The desirability of building one or more pavilions at once, or when?

“Third—Should it be deemed advisable to build, the question of increased income which will be necessary should be considered, and how it is to be obtained.”

The following extract from the same letter is of so much public interest that it merits your earnest attention:—

“I find that the ordinary revenue of the hospital during the last decade has averaged \$34,900, the lowest sum in any one year having been \$30,200, and the highest \$38,500.

“The ordinary expenditure has been an average of \$36,300, the smallest being \$33,700, and the highest \$42,700.

“You will at once see that during the past decade our income has fallen short of our expenditure about \$1,400 per annum, or \$14,000 in all, which had to come out of our permanent fund.

" Let me take last year as an example. The average daily number of patients in hospital was 136, that number multiplied by 365 days amounts to 49,640, and as the expenditure was \$39,714; each patient cost the hospital 80 cents a day. Suppose we build a new wing to accommodate say 70 beds, this will at 80 cents a day increase our yearly expenditure by \$20,440; but suppose we assume only one-half of this number by reducing a similar number in the present buildings, which are over crowded, the cost will still be over \$10,000, so that under the most favorable circumstances \$50,000 will be yearly required to meet the expenses.

" It will be comparatively easy in consequence of Mr. Stephen's gift and Mr. Greenshields' bequest to add buildings, but the question is, when they are built how are they to be kept up?

" It is with no wish to delay building that I raise this question, because I am of opinion that at least one pavilion is *absolutely necessary*, but after my experience in extending accommodation, I do not wish to let the governors take that responsibility without making them fully acquainted with the state of the case."

The above three questions raised by the president were discussed at some length at the last quarterly meeting of the governors, and were referred to the committee of management with the request that they carefully consider them and report their views and recommendations at the November quarterly meeting.

The whole subject is one of great importance to the citizens and the city. Common humanity demands that a building devoted to the treatment of the sick should possess all the requirements that experience and the scientific knowledge of the day deem necessary, and the wealth, population and leading position of this city impose upon its inhabitants the obligation of not permitting Montreal to be behind her sister cities in providing hospital accommodation for the sick poor, and for those other classes of sick people not sufficiently thought of because they have means to pay, but certainly entitled to humane consideration, viz., strangers arriving in our midst, residents in hotels, and boarding-houses, and even members of families living in their own domiciles, when subjects of grave infectious disease like diphtheria scarlet fever and the like.

Four deaths have occurred amongst the governors during the year. Dr. Wm. Scott and Dr. John Reddy had been attending physicians

of the hospital for very many years, and of late had become members of the consulting staff and life governors. Mr. Edward Mackay, had been a life governor, and in his will left the sum of \$5,000 to the institution. Mr. N. S. Whitney had been an "elected governor," and warm friend of the hospital for many years.

The medical superintendent, Dr. Bell, resigned his office at the end of April last, for the purpose of entering upon private practice, and the committee of management appointed Dr. Jas. Gray his successor. The term of service of the three resident medical officers, Drs. J. J. Gardner, W. G. Henry and James Gray being about to expire, their successors, Drs. Ferguson, Johnston and Graham, in accordance with a recommendation of the medical board, were elected at an adjourned meeting of governors held on the 16th April last. Dr. Bell and the retiring resident medical officers have the best wishes of the governors for their success in the private practice of their profession. The governors continue to be pleased with the warm interest in the work of her department manifested by the lady superintendent. Mr. J. T. MOLSON moved, and Mr. W. Drake seconded.

That the Governors of the Montreal General Hospital desire to tender their thanks to the employees of the various mercantile and manufacturing establishments who have subscribed to the support of the hospital during the past year.

Mr. W. DRAKE, in seconding the resolution, took occasion to say that as a collector in the East Ward, he had experienced some difficulty in getting subscriptions, owing to many of the residents of that ward being ignorant as to the exact position of the General Hospital, but Mr. Hebert had kindly gone round and explained to them the general character of the institution, and the result had been largely increased subscriptions. (Applause.)

The motion was carried unanimously.

Dr. CRAIK moved:

That the Governors of the Montreal General Hospital desire to acknowledge the valuable assistance they have derived in maintaining the efficiency of the institution from the gentlemen who have acted as its collectors during the past year, and beg to tender them their thanks.

He referred to the valuable work performed by the collectors, and said that they would find it very difficult to carry on the institution if it were not for the funds raised by them, and they deservedly merited the heartiest thanks which the governors could bestow upon them.
