**A Cardinal Sin.**  
CHAPTER II.  
FROM TWO PAGES OF VIEW.

The six miles of road between Brackley and Redton is a beautiful picture, but terrible in its grandeur. As you drive over it, and pass now and again at some of its most elevated parts, you are filled with feelings—admiration at the beautiful view you get over Westville, and pity for your horse. His poor creature, driven in blindness quite unable to understand your admiration, and can only hope your pity will allow him to take his own time up those hills.

It is a terrible road—you get a bit of level ground after leaving Brackley, then the up-and-down system begins.
