### LEGISLATURE OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY. Fredericton, April 6. The bill having been agreed to with exception of portions relating to fees and a few other details progress was reported with leave to sit again.

Mr. McQueen committed a bill to authorize the appointment of a Magistrate in Moncton, Davidson in the chair.

Mr. King committed a bill to explain section 2 of the Act to amend chap. 114, title 20 Revised Statutes, relating to the real and personal property of married women, Cottrill in the chair.

The Attorney General committed a bill relating to the protection of property of habitual drunkards, Ryan in the chair.

THE PARLIAMENT OF CANADA. (Special Telegram to the Tribune.) The Supreme Court Bill—Duty on Tea—The Pacific Railway.

OTTAWA, April 6. In the Senate last night the Supreme Court Bill got a second reading. A long discussion will take place when third reading comes up.
