**REGULATIONS.**  
Respecting the Disposal of Certain Public Lands for the purpose of the  
the Canadian Pacific Railway.  
DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,  
Ottawa, Oct. 14th, 1879.  
"Public notice is hereby given that the following provisions, which shall be held to apply to the lands in the Province of Manitoba, and in the Territories to the west and north-west thereof, for the purpose of the Regulations, passed July 18th last, governing the mode of disposing of the Public Lands situated in the Province of Manitoba, and on miles on each side of the line of the Canadian Pacific Railway, which said Regulations are hereby superseded:—  
1. "Until further and final survey of the line of railway shall be respectively divided into belts, and for the purposes of these provisions the line of said railway shall be assumed to be the fourth base meridian to the intersection of the said base by the line between ranges 21 and 22 west of the first principal meridian, and thence in a direct line to the confluence of the Shell River with the River Assiniboine.  
2. "The country lying on each side of the line of railway shall be respectively divided into belts, as follows:  
a. The country lying on either side of the railway, and immediately adjoining the same, to be called belt A;  
b. (1) A belt of fifteen miles on either side of the railway, adjoining belt A, to be called belt B;  
(2) A belt of twenty miles on either side of the railway, adjoining belt B, to be called belt C;  
(3) A belt of twenty miles on either side of the railway, adjoining belt C, to be called belt D;  
(4) A belt of fifty miles on either side of the railway, adjoining belt D, to be called belt E.  
The even-numbered sections in each township throughout the several belts above described shall be open for entry as homesteads and pre-emption of 160 acres each respectively.  
The odd-numbered sections in each of such townships shall not be open to homestead or pre-emption, but shall be specially reserved and designated as railway lands.
