DEATH OF THE PRINCE OF ORANGE.—The death of the heir apparent to the throne of the Netherlands did not come unexpectedly either to his friends or to King William III. Of Holland. Prince William Nikolas Alexander Fridrik Karl Hendrik was born at The Hague September 4, 1840, and was consequently in his thirty-ninth year. His death was the result of dissolute habits. He was notorious all over Europe, but especially at Paris, for his immoralities, in which respect he followed only too faithfully the traditions of his house. He was usually known by the nickname of "Prince Lemon," and, for reasons connected with the impairment of his constitution by his excesses, was never married. In earlier years the Prince aver promise of growing up to be a model Prince. When he completed his eighteenth year, and had, according to the Dutch constitution, as a member of royalty, become of age—some five years earlier than the ordinary run of his subjects—illuminations and feasts were held in all the cities of Holland in honor of the event. In spite of their shortcomings the House of Orange has always been considered as the palladium of their rights, liberties and privileges, and these held at that time were significant of the hope that another representative of their royal house had fairly entered upon life. He was made a Privy Councillor and Major-General. There were rumours that the King intended to abdicate in favor of his son, and the English and French papers stated that the hand of Princes Alice, the daughter of Queen Victoria, who died last year at Darmstadt, had been promised him.

He had received a good education at the University of Leyden, was conversant with the German, French and English languages and literature. But from the time of his majority his inclinations tended all in the direction of "a short life and a merry one"—a maxim which he was the Princess Anna Puluvna, daughter of the ill-fated Czar Paul of Prussia.
