A Royal Proclamation

ASKED FOR ON BEHALF OF HOMELESS AND
DESTITUTE RUSSIAN JEWS.

Editor FREE PRESS:—The following letters point out clearly the two most essential and absolutely indispensable requirements of the present age; which are now in "faith and hope" submitted to the serious consideration of the great public, as well as to that of the recognized representatives and rulers of the people whose earnest attention might otherwise never be called to such subjects, however important or urgent they may be.

To Lord Salisbury, London, England:

The enclosed extract from the Ottawa FREE PRESS may serve to explain to the Queen, in perhaps the fewest possible words, how the Jewish people happen providentially to be (as it were) the keystone of the grand arch, which the nations of Christendom must now form to sustain the magnificent edifice of the "Kingdom of God" upon earth; which the present condition of Christendom now renders so absolutely indispensable for the future security and welfare of the whole world.

Why should the Sovereign of the foremost empire now cause a royal proclamation to calling upon British subjects every favor as much as possible to the rescue of the homeless and destitute Jewish people "the land of their fathers?" and to give them freely and liberally of their abundance for this purpose; that they may have opportunity to attain to the highest station of which they are capable; the century may soon become one of the fittest location upon earth, supreme International tribunal which henceforth leave the nations neither occasion for war.
