REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.
1887.

In presenting the Twentieth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association to its members, the Council feel that they can, with much pleasure, congratulate them on the continued popularity and prosperity of its Prize Meeting, as evinced by the increase in the number of competitors as compared with previous years. In 1884 there were two hundred and eighty-seven competitors, in 1885 three hundred and two; in 1886, three hundred and thirty-two, and in 1887, three hundred and sixty-three. The money prize list has been increased from five thousand dollars in 1884 to six thousand seven hundred in 1887.

The thanks of the Association are again due to His Excellency the Governor-General for his continued substantial support of the Association, for his liberal contribution to its funds, and also for his gift of Silver and Bronze Medals to the several Provincial Rifle Associations of the Dominion;

To the Government, and members of the House of Commons, for the liberal vote granted to the Association at the last session of Parliament;

To the Hon. Sir Adolphe P. Caron, K.C.M.G., Minister of Militia and Defence, for his continued interest in the affairs of the Association;

To the Chairman of Council, Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. A. Ouimet, M.P., for his third donation to the General Prize Fund;

To the President and Directors of:—

The Bank of Montreal, for their 7th yearly donation.

The Bank of British North America, for their 7th yearly donation.

To Mr. J. H. Steward, Optician, 406 Strand, London, England, for two Prizes in kind, consisting of a handsome Barometer with silver dial, and a mahogany Revolving Album;

And to Arthur L. Howard, Esq., of Brownsburg, Quebec, for a Whitney-Kennedy repeating Sporting Rifle.

The long time friends of the Association, the Canada Club of London, England, again presented to the Wimbledon Team a handsome Silver Cup for the member making the highest aggregate score at the Wimbledon Meeting, for which the thanks of the Association are hereby tendered. The Cup was won by Qr.-Mr. Sergt. John Ogg, 1st Brigade Field Artillery.

The members of the Wimbledon Team for 1887 acquitted themselves well, their aggregate winnings amounting to £415.18.0 sterling, as compared with £384.10.0 in the previous year. Canada did not succeed in winning the Kolapore Cups, but was second only to the Team of the Mother Country, leading the four other Colonial Teams which also competed. Pte. A. Gillies, 90th Battalion, won the Prince of Wales' Prize, second in importance only to Her Majesty the Queen's.

In the "Corporation of the City of London Prizes," restricted to Indian and Colonial Volunteers, Canadians won ten out of fifteen prizes, including 1st and 2nd, and in money £115.0.0., out of the total amount of £157.10.0.

In the "Queen's" Canadians were seventh, twentieth and twenty-ninth in the last stage of that competition, the places being taken respectively by Sergt. Langstroth, 8th Regiment of Cavalry; Qr.-Mr. Sergt. Ogg, 1st Brigade Field Artillery, and Pte. A. Thomson, 3rd Battalion Victoria Rifles. The other Prizes won by the Team will be found recorded in the schedule of prizes won at Wimbledon, attached to the report of the Commandant of the Team.

The practice obtained by the Team at the ranges at Cambridge, during the week previous to the commencement of the competition at Wimbledon, is found to be of essential service, and thanks are due to Lieut.-Col. A. P. Humphrey, commanding the 2nd Cambridge University Rifle Volunteers, for the use of the ranges, as well as for the interest he took in and the great services he rendered to the Team before their arrival and during their practice at Cambridge.

At the Annual Prize Meeting held at Ottawa, the extra day taken for the Matches was found to be of great advantage, for, in consequence of the smoky atmosphere which prevailed more or less throughout the Meeting, it would have been found impossible to have carried out the Matches on a more condensed time table, as every morning after the first day, the smoke delayed the firing from one to two hours, the targets not being visible from the firing points. This very much reduced the number of entries in the Extra Series and Martini Matches, as it was

necessary to curtail the time allotted to these to enable the Executive to complete the Matches within the prescribed time.

In compliance with the previously expressed wishes of many competitors, the Executive arranged to have the price of the ammunition in the Snider Matches included in the entrance fee, and the ammunition served out at the firing points. This arrangement, although incurring extra expense, worked well, and appeared to give general satisfaction, and the reduction in the price of Martini ammunition was thoroughly appreciated.

That the kindness of Colonel Gzowski, A.D.C., in acceding to the generally expressed wish, that alterations should be made in the regulations for "dress" and "equipment" in the Military Matches, was thoroughly appreciated, is shewn by the increase in the number of Teams which entered for those competitions. In 1885 and 1886 there were eleven entries and in 1887 there were fifteen.

Experience shews that greater target accomodation at the long ranges is becoming more and more a necessity, and it is believed that the entries in the Martini and Extra Series Matches would have been larger by hundreds, had the required accomodation offered, and it behooves the Association to consider how such can be obtained.

Every Province in the Dominion was again represented at the annual competition at Ottawa.

The number of Rifle Associations affiliated was in excess of previous years.

The annual membership shows no increase over that of last year, it is still lamentably below what it ought to be, and the Council again urge the friends of the Association to do their utmost to raise it to a number commensurate with the importance of the Association.

The Council deemed it fitting, on the occurrence of the Jubilee of Her Most Gracious Majesty's accession to the Throne to offer the Congratulations of the Association on that happy event. This was done, and at the same time a copy of the Annual Report for the year, handsomely bound, was forwarded for presentation to Her Majesty, who was pleased to accept the same, and commanded an acknowledgment therefor to be sent to the Association, copy of which follows:—

At the General (Competitors,) Meeting held on the second evening of the Annual Competition at Ottawa, in the Drill Hall, a long discussion took place with reference to the question of Rifles and Ammunition for the future, and members interested in that subject are referred to the minutes of that meeting, to be found at the end of this report.

A presentation of Prizes was made at the President's Marquee on Friday afternoon, and passed off with much *éclat*. Amongst those who were present, and took part in the presentation were the Right Honorable Sir J. A. Macdonald, P.C., G.C.B., Hon. Sir Adolphe P. Caron, K.C.M.G., Sir Fred. and Lady Middleton, Colonel and Mrs. Panet, Colonel and Mrs. Powell, His Worship the Mayor and Mrs. Stewart, Major and Mrs. Bond. The ground was well kept, and the Prize Winners were drawn up under the orders of Captain A. H. Sims, 3rd Battalion Victoria Rifles, and advanced to receive their Prizes as their names were called by the Secretary. After the presentation the guests were received and hospitably entertained by Lt.-Colonel Hon. J. A. Ouimet, Chairman of Council.

In closing this portion of the Report the Council would leave a pleasing duty unperformed did they not thank the Executive Officer and the Staff generally for the very satisfactory manner in which they performed the arduous duties imposed upon them.

FINANCE.

The Treasurer's statement of the finances of the Association, duly audited is submitted herewith:

The balance sheet shows the receipts from all sources for the year to have been \$17,478.01, which with the balance of \$2,096.08 from last years, exhibits a total on the credit side of \$19,574.09.

The expenditure amounted to \$17,133.75, leaving a balance in favor of the Association of \$2,440.34.

The balance at credit of Special Account, being accrued interest on the Marquis of Lorne's donation for Provincial Prizes, including the balance of \$25.72 carried forward from last year, amounting to \$26.03; was duly distributed proportionately to the several provinces entitled to the same, thus closing the account in accordance with the conditions originally prescribed.

In the receipts from affiliated Rifle Associations, an increase of \$72.00 will be observed as compared with last year. The fees this year amounting to \$752.00 as against \$680.00 in 1886.

The number of affiliated Rifle Associations being 54, as compared with 48 in 1886 an increase of 6 County and other affiliating Associations.

Members subscriptions for the year amount to the same as last year.

Associate members fees amount to \$307.00 as against \$280.00 in 1886, an increase of \$27.00.

Receipts from "Special Donations" amount to \$1,575.00, a decrease of \$225.00 as compared with 1886.

The *net* receipts from entry fees this year, including post entries and fines, exclusive of the charge for ammunition amounted to \$3,576.01, as against \$3,169.50 in 1886, an increase of \$406.51.

The aggregate value of Prizes in cash and badges distributed this year amounted to \$6,693.70, an increase of \$634.52, as compared with last year.

The Wimbledon Team expenditure this year amounted to \$5,811.96 as against \$5,977.51 in 1886, a decrease of \$165.55; a marked saving having been effected in the expenses at Cambridge in England.

A statement of the expenditure made by Lt.-Colonel the Honorable J. A. Ouimet, Commanding Wimbledon Team of 1887, will be found in the appendix.

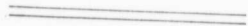

REPORT OF
LIEUT.-COLONEL J. ALD. OUIMET,

Commanding Wimbledon Team, 1887.

*To Lt.-Colonel, The Honorable G. A. Kirkpatrick, President of the
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association :*

SIR,—Having been appointed to the command of the Canadian Wimbledon Team, I beg to submit the following report:—

The team assembled at Quebec on the 22nd day of June last, and after having passed the ordinary inspection and signed the regulations, they embarked on the steamer *Parisian* the following day.

On their landing at Liverpool, the 2nd July, they at once were directed to Cambridge for a week's practice, before going to Wimbledon. Through the kindness of Lt.-Colonel Humphrey, they were allowed to go under canvass, which proved to be much cheaper than being quartered in the hotels of the place.

The practice of the team at Cambridge was very satisfactory all our men being in the best spirits.

On the ninth July, the team proceeded to Wimbledon, and the matches began on the 11th to finish on the 23rd.

Although not meeting with all the success which the earnest efforts of our men led me to anticipate, I must say that the result was very satisfactory. One of the team, Private Gillies, of the 90th Rifles of Winnipeg, had the good luck to carry off the Gold Badge and the £100 attached to the first prize in the Prince of Wales' competition, which is only second in importance to Her Majesty the Queen's Prize.

In the latter competition, against over three thousand competitors, five of our men gained places in the three hundred allowed to shoot in the second stage, and three of them remained for the last stage, and occupied at the end of it very good places, Sergt. Langstroth of the 8th, N.B., Cavalry, being seventh, Staff-Sergt. Ogg, of the 1st Brigade of Field Artillery, being 20th, and Private Thomson, of the 3rd Victoria

Rifles, being 29th. This fine result was an agreeable surprise to our warmest friends, and leads to the hope that in the near future, with anything like good luck, the "Blue Ribbon" may be carried off by a Canadian. This will not appear to you a useless boast, when I mention that after the two first rounds at the last, that is the 900 yards range in the last stage, a Canadian (Sergt. Ogg) was leading.

In the competition for the Kolapore cups, in which eight of our men have to shoot against the best eight men of the United Kingdom, as well as the best eight men of the Colonial teams, including Jersey and Guernsey, our team have been able to keep next to the Home team only, the Cape of Good Hope team being 3rd, Jersey 4th, Guernsey 5th, and the East Indies 6th. There was no Australian team this year.

Including the individual prizes won by divers members of the team, our men have taken over £400 in prize money.

The magnificent solid silver cup given by the Canada Club of London, to the member of our team making the highest aggregate in the several matches in which our men are entered at the expense of the Association, fell to Color-Sergt. Ogg.

The members of the Canada Club, and especially their worthy Secretary, Mr. Molyneux, who came to make the presentation, deserves our heartiest thanks for this magnificent mark of attention to the representatives of our country at Wimbledon.

The officers and members of the Canadian team, cannot speak too highly of the kind treatment they have been accorded at Wimbledon by the authorities as well as by every member of the National Rifle Association. I have seen with great pleasure and pride that of the four thousand competitors who meet every year at Wimbledon, from all parts of the United Empire, none receive a more hearty welcome than the Canadians. The Association seems to have been particularly well represented in past years by officers and men who have made the name of Canada most popular on Wimbledon common amongst the British aristocracy and yeomanry.

Allow me to mention here that no one has done more in that direction than our respected ex-President Colonel Gzowski, whose genial and princely hospitality is remembered by every one of the old Wimbledon men.

Many other successful efforts have been and are yet made to make Canada known in the United Kingdom; but nothing, it seems to me, can do more to popularize Canada amongst the best of every class of our fellow subjects in the mother country, than our sending to Wimbledon every year a Canadian representative team of our best riflemen.

According to your recommendation, I have endeavoured to curtail as much as possible the expenses of the team; as will appear by the accounts which I herewith transmit to you.

I cannot conclude this report without adding a word of deserved praise for the team that I had the honor to command. Nothing could be more commendable than their behaviour in camp and the *bonne entente* that existed at all times amongst themselves as well as with the adjutant of the team under whose immediate charge they were; the latter, Capt. J. T. Hartt, of the St. John Rifles, deserves also great credit for his careful and judicious management of the team.

“That the Executive Committee are hereby authorized to make the requisite arrangements for assembling the members of the Wimbledon Team for 1887, to fix the time for embarkation, and to incur the necessary expenses for sending the team to England; also to notify the competitors, selected to compose the team, that they must send a reply to the Secretary for the guidance of the Executive Committee on or before the 20th day of May, stating whether they will be prepared to join the team, and that in the event of any of the selected competitors failing to send such notice the Executive Committee shall be authorized to fill the vacancies.”—Carried.

9 Moved by Lieut.-Col. D. A. Macdonald, seconded by Major Bond—

“That the Annual Prize Meeting of the Association be fixed to commence at the Rideau Range on Monday, the 29th August.”

Moved in amendment by Major H. F. Perley, seconded by Lieut.-Col. Maunsell, D.A.G.—

“That the date of commencement of the Annual Prize Meeting be Monday the 5th September.”

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, when the main motion was put and carried.

10 Moved by E. Crow Baker, Esq., R.N., M.P., seconded by Lieut. E. A. Macnachten—

“That the Executive Committee be empowered to defray the necessary expenses for placing the Rideau Range in perfect order, and for carrying out the annual matches.”—Carried.

11 Moved by Major H. F. Perley, seconded by Major W. M. Blaiklock—

“That the Executive Committee be empowered to prepare a Prize List not to exceed \$6,750 in cash, also to prepare and publish the regulations under which the meeting for 1887 shall be governed.”—Carried.

12 Moved by E. D. Sutherland, Esq., seconded by Major W. M. Blaiklock—

“That it be a recommendation to the Executive Committee that the ‘Standing’ and ‘Ouimet’ matches be fired with the Martini-Henry Rifle, that they be included in the Grand Aggregate, and that the ‘London Merchants’ Cup’ be fired with the Martini at 200, 500 and 600 yards. Seven rounds at each range.”—Carried.

13 Moved by Major W. M. Blaiklock, seconded by Capt. A. H. Sims—

“That Lieut.-Col. Otter, D.A.G., Lieut.-Col. Allan, Lieut.-Col. Grassett and Capt. W. C. Macdonald form a committee with power to add to their number, to wait upon Col. Gzowski with the object of

obtaining different regulations as regards Dress and Equipment in the Gzowski and British Challenge Shield Matches."—Carried.

14 Moved by Lieut.-Col. Otter, D.A.G., seconded by Major W. M. Blaiklock—

"That the Secretary be instructed to send an invitation to the Riflemen of Great Britain to send a representation under the auspices of the National Rifle Association to compete at the D.R.A. Meeting."—Carried unanimously.

15 Moved by E. Crow Baker, Esq., R.N., M.P., seconded by Major W. M. Blaiklock—

"That whilst thanking the Canadian Pacific Railway Company for the liberal reduction made in fares to the team from British Columbia, this Association requests that the same or even a more liberal reduction may be made in said fares for this and future years in order to induce the team to come annually."—Carried.

16 Moved by Lieut.-Col. White, seconded by Major W. M. Blaiklock—

"That the members of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association have heard with much regret of the death of Lieut.-Col. Alfred Brunel, one of the originators of the Association and for many years a prominent member thereof, and desire to place on record their high appreciation of his services and active interest for many years on behalf of the Association."—Carried.

The Chairman, Lieut.-Col. Hon. J. A. Ouimet, M.P., announced his intention of continuing his donation of one hundred dollars to the Prize Fund for the present year.

17 When a unanimous vote of thanks was passed for his continued liberality.

The meeting then adjourned.

D. R. A. COMPETITORS' ANNUAL MEETING.

A largely attended meeting of riflemen who are competing in the Dominion matches was held in the Drill Hall Tuesday evening, 31st August.

Amongst those present were, Capt. J. T. Hartt, Lt.-Col. D. A. Macdonald, Lt.-Col. Beer Major Tilton, Lt.-Col. John Macpherson, Captain B. A. Weston, Major Perley, Lieut. E. A. Macnachtan, Major W. P. Anderson, Lt.-Col. Lamontagne, D. A. G., Captain Barnhill, E. D. Sutherland, Esq., Major F. Hartt, Assistant-Surgeon McLaughlin, Major Guy, D. Mitchell, Lieutenant R. J. Spearing, Captain Balfour, Captain Adam, Lt.-Col. J. M. Gibson, Major Blaiklock, Captain Walter Macdonald, Lieut. Vaughan, Captain Corbin, Lieut. Dover, Lt.-Col. J. P. Macpherson, Lieut. Col. Miller, Staff-Sergt. K. Matthews, Pte. Brocklesby, Lieut. Chambers, Pte. T. Mitchell, Staff-Sergt. W. C. King, Major Demers, Major Delamere, Captain J. Hood, Captain. A. H. Sims, Sergt. Goudie, Lieut. Dimock, Lieut. Abbott, Lieut. Busteed, Captain Newton, Lieut. Gray, Lieut. W. S. Russell, Staff-Sergt. Newby, Gunner Sargison, Lieut.-Col. White, Lieut.-Col. Bacon.

Col. White was, on the motion of Capt. Hood, 5th Royal Scots, seconded by Major Delamere, Queen's Own, elected to the chair.

The Chairman remarked that the present being a Competitor's Meeting, it was essentially a meeting at which the Executive were placed, so to speak, before their constituents, and, therefore, were liable to be called to account for their conduct. He did not know that there was anything special to bring before the meeting, but whatever business there was, now was the time to introduce it.

Capt. Walter Macdonald remarked that the meeting was usually spoken of as a grievance meeting, and perhaps it was the best opportunity the competitors had of bringing their grievances before the Executive. He believed a thing that had struck most of the competitors forcibly, at this meeting, was the question of Snider shooting at 600 yards (hear, hear and applause). He did not pretend to say much about it, but he was satisfied that all the competitors now present, although some of them had been successful and others unsuccessful, would agree in asking that the Snider rifle should be abolished at 600 and confined to matches at 500 yards and under. He contended that in the troublous times they usually met with at Dominion matches, the difficulties were

too great for the Snider to succeed at 600 yards, and although a man might occasionally fluke a good score—and yet not fluke because he had held well and made his calculations—yet in the next match he might go to pieces, as some of their best shots had done. (Hear, hear). He did not think there was a man present who felt confident at 600 yards with the Snider in his hands. (Hear, hear). They must not lose sight of the fact that it was the arm of their volunteer force, but he thought the Executive could put it in the place where it would do the least harm. (Laughter). The Snider was a good weapon at 200 or 400 and perhaps at 500 yards, but that was the extreme limit. He moved: “That the executive be recommended to abolish the use Snider Rifle at all ranges over 500 yards, and that the Martini be substituted.”

Mr. Ewan seconded the motion.

Pte. Sutherland, G.G.F.G., observed that he came down to the meeting that night with similar resolution, but he was very glad to find that he had been forestalled. A great many competitors at the meeting last year might remember Capt. Weston's resolution for the entire abolition of the Snider rifle. He suggested as an amendment then that the Snider should not be brought above 500 yards, and he also proposed a similar resolution in the Council last fall. The amendment that the 200 yards standing should be shot with the Martini was carried, and his (the speaker's) resolution lost. He was very glad to find it was the general feeling of the riflemen that the Snider should not be used above 500 yards. (Applause).

The resolution was then put to the meeting and carried.

THE AMMUNITION.

Major Delamere, Queen's Own, Toronto, asked if there was any information regarding the quality of the ammunition supplied.

The Chairman—“I think Major Perley is in a better position than anyone else to give information upon that point.”

Major Perley, Headquarter Staff, stated that in the year before last the Association provided “mark 9” ammunition; last year they provided Canadian make, at which there was a good deal of grumbling, and this year Canadian make as well. The Association was obliged to do so for the simple reason that “mark 9” was not to be had nearer than Winnipeg, and he learned from the Director of Stores that there were but 33,000 rounds at that place, and none at Ottawa, and but very few in the Lower Provinces. The Association was anxious to get “mark 9”

because it had been brought to their notice that it would be most desirable to have, as there was a prevailing feeling against Canadian make. It was, however, found impossible to get the ammunition mentioned, because it took from 40 to 45,000 rounds to fire at their matches.

Knowing that a very strong feeling existed against ammunition of D. C. make, the speaker had brought the matter to the notice of the Deputy Minister of Militia, and at his request had prepared a memo:—containing a series of questions, which were submitted to Major Prevost, the Superintendent of the Cartridge Factory at Quebec. From the replies furnished, it was learned that the powder used for filling cartridges, since November, 1886, had been obtained from the Imperial authorities, but was manufactured by Curtis & Harvey.

The Militia Department did not, however, obtain their powder direct from this firm. When it was found that the last batch of powder ordered from the Hamilton Powder Company did not pass the inspection at the cartridge factory, the Minister of Militia ordered enough powder from Woolwich to fill 700,000 rounds of ammunition, which is the quantity fired by the riflemen of Canada in any one year. Last year, 1886, the cartridges were filled with powder supplied from Woolwich. It must be understood that England used the Martini powder, which was a different powder from the Snider, and England did not make the latter at present. During the present year some lots of Snider powder remaining on hand were tested by the English inspecting officers, which did not pass the examination. The English authorities at Woolwich then examined the powder of Messrs. Curtis and Harvey, which passed the inspection.

Major Perley went on to say that the answers of Major Prevost showed the Canadian powder to be the same in point of density as that laid down by the Woolwich specification. The proportion of fine and coarse grain powder corresponded with the Imperial specification. According to the Woolwich authorities, and the practice at Quebec, 70 grains is the charge of powder for a Snider rifle, but in the filling a little latitude is allowed, either two grains less or two grains more, so that a cartridge holding 72 grains or 68 grains would pass muster. Major Perley continued that whilst at Quebec he inspected the making of the bullets. It had been stated to him by some of the competitors that it was a great shame their cartridges should be filled by little boys and little girls, and that the authorities ought to have men to do it. He might say that neither boys or girls filled the cartridges. It was done by an automatic machine—a machine that was solidly bolted to masses of concrete, and the power was transmitted by means of a small water motor, so that there was no tremor in the machine, and therefore but little variation in the filling. Major Perley stated that the late Professor Bayne,

professor of chemistry at Kingston, found that the points of the bullets drooped. In testing the centre of gravity Professor Bayne covered the bullet with a very thin coating of parafine. He then floated it in quicksilver, when the points of the bullets drooped, thus increasing the tendency to tumble. If the centre of gravity of a bullet was forward the bullet would have a tendency to tumble, and thus destroy its accuracy of flight. This he explained was apparently the cause of a good many bullets falling short in front of the target. Major Prevost, however, was of opinion that repeated experiments showed the bullets did not dip through flight. (Laughter). Major Prevost was further asked if the "choking" or creasing of the bullet was not too deep. It had been maintained that a less degree of choke would retain the bullet in its place and prevent the "stripping," which some assert takes place owing to the softness of the lead that is used. Major Prevost, however, replied that no stripping had ever been observed. Major Perley next described how the bullets were "gauged," and asserted that under the system in vogue, it was impossible that the point could be otherwise than true.

POOR SHOOTING EXPLAINED.

As to the cause of the poor shooting with the Snider ammunition, he thought that to a certain extent it was due to the want of confidence on the part of the shooter. He was under the impression that confidence might perhaps be restored wholly or partially, if the sighting shots were once more returned to. He did not not mean that they should be used at the Dominion matches, but at their little club competitions. A great many good shots were under the impression that they would do well with the Martini. The ammunition however for the Snider could not be made better than it was at Quebec. He had thought that perhaps if the ammunition were kept a few years it might be considerably improved, as they were using ammunition now made in the same year.

Lieut. Chamberlin, 43rd battalion, remarked that at Wimbledon the marksmen used ammunition of the same year's manufacture with satisfactory results.

Capt. B. A. Weston, Halifax, pointed out that the only good Snider shooting that had been obtained on the Nova Scotia range had been made with Imperial powder which they condemned ten years ago. He must say himself that the results of Canadian ammunition had been fairly satisfactory. It was more satisfactory to him, however, to know that the Government were endeavoring to find out the defect, for defect there was, in the ammunition. (Hear, hear). The powder was as good as could be procured, but the difficulty was with the bullet, and it seemed to him that the authorities should turn their attention to it, and

ascertain first whether it was properly manufactured as to the centre of gravity. (Applause).

Major Anderson remarked that it was a serious question and could not but discourage the riflemen, if they could not get the ammunition they depended upon. He did not think the fact of want of confidence would explain the low aggregates in the Dominion matches. (Hear, hear).

Captain Hartt, St. John, also joined in the discussion.

Col. Beer urged that the time had come when the Canadian militia forces should be put upon an equality with the militia forces of Great Britain. They were supposed to be the "banner" colony of Great Britain, and if that was the case, and considering they would be called upon to assist the Imperial Government in time of need, he said they should be in a position to take their part. He moved that the Snider rifle be abolished altogether in the matches of the Dominion Rifle Association. (Applause).

Major Tilton remarked that they should agitate in the matter and suggested that a resolution should be placed before the Minister of Militia and Defence, giving the opinions of the riflemen assembled at the meeting.

At the suggestion of Col. Gibson, Col. Beer altered his resolution to read thus: "That in the opinion of this meeting of riflemen, representatives of all parts of the Dominion, the time has arrived when the militia should be armed with the Martini-Henry rifle, and that a committee be appointed to wait upon the Minister of Militia, and urge upon him the adoption of the views of the meeting."

Col. Gibson seconded the resolution and it was carried unanimously.

The following committee, with power to add to their number, was appointed to lay the matter before the Minister of Militia and Defence: Col. Gibson, Ontario; Capt. Balfour, Manitoba; Col. Beer, New Brunswick; Capt. Weston, Nova Scotia; Capt. Sims, Quebec; Bombr. Sargison, British Columbia; and Lieut. Longworth, Prince Edward Island.

Other subjects were discussed by the meeting, which finally broke up shortly after eleven.

REGULATIONS.

The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other Members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or that of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the Conditions of any Match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.

2. Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them seriously.

3. Competitors must, when at the firing points, comply with all orders given by the Range Officers on duty.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.

II.—No Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer or Private, employed by the D. R. A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.

III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, in accordance with the Regulations and Orders of the Militia, viz.:

a. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps of leather or other material will not be allowed.

b. Trousers.

c. Regimental head dress or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and greatcoats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order as must also Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates. Where a duly authorized undress for Officers exist, they (the officers) may appear in it, although the Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates may be in full dress. *Waist belts must be worn*, except when firing.

d. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear strictly in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. (See Reg. XIX d.)

NOTE.—In “Military Match” competitions the above rules shall not apply as special details for dress are issued.

IV.—All protests or objections should be made at once to the Secretary or Range Officer on duty, and when practicable, in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the occurrence on which the protest is founded, and the Executive Committee reserve the right to refuse to accept any protest received or presented after the expiration of that time.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Fixed or artificial rests will not be allowed, except in Skirmishing Match.

VII.—Competitors shall only use the mats provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests will not be allowed.

VIII.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

IX.—“Blowing off” shall not be allowed at the firing points, or after competitors have taken their position for firing. Pits will be provided at places near the firing points where competitors can “blow off” before joining their squads on presentation of a “blow off” ticket, which will be sold for 5 cents each, and include the cost of one round of

ammunition to be obtained from the person in charge, on delivery of ticket.

X.—No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All Clear."

XI.—Slings may be used in all matches, but they must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government arms.

XII.—In individual competitions—competitors may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided their doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIII.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper, or an Officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XIV.—In *Matches* where both team and *individual prizes* are being competed for, *coaching* of any kind is strictly prohibited.

XV.—In *Matches* where the prizes are offered to *teams only*, the members of such team shooting together will be permitted to "coach" or "spot" for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint spotters to assist him. With the above exception no other persons will be allowed within the ropes, or permitted to offer advice or instruction to the competitors.

XVI.—Any violation of these rules, or any part of them, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down, under the head of "penalties," and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

XVII.—PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATIONS.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or

- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or
- (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive or Special Committee; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct, or of the aforesaid offences; or
- (h) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize, shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any Affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association, until reinstated.

XVIII.—EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

Any Competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing; or
- (d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such a discharge is due to a defect in his rifle an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given]; or
- (e) Who shall alter or make any erasure on his firing ticket; or
- (f) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous, shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special

Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

XIX.—DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

Any Competitor—

(a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or with the orders of the Executive or Range officers; or

(b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or

(c) Who, when competing for the Grand Aggregate, shall fail to fill up the aggregate score ticket, or shall enter his scores incorrectly, or shall fail to deliver the same to the Statistical Officer within one hour after the conclusion of his firing in the last match; or

(d) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes (See Reg. III. d), shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor-General's Match.

XX.—FINES.

Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed," for any particular prize, the *circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In cases of "disqualification," the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

XXI.—MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to vary, mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

XXII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

(a) Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.

(b) Winners of prizes will, on signing the official prize list, receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the Association.

(c) If a formal presentation takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.

XXIII.—DISTANCES AND TARGETS.

The ordinary Targets, divided into three classes, shall be of the following dimensions:—

XXIV.—SIGNALLING—SCORING.

1. The signalling will be as follows:—

- (a) Bull's Eye, counting . . . 5 . . . White disc.
- (b) Inner, “ . . . 4 . . . Red disc.
- (c) Magpie, “ . . . 3 . . . Black and White disc.
- (d) Outer, “ . . . 2 . . . Black disc.
- (e) Ricochet, “ . . . R . . . Black bar.

(f) *Misses* will *not* be signalled; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a *black* disc, to signify that the target has not been struck.

2. When *two* shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the *signal disc*, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired. *Both hits will*, however, be shown by spotting discs.

3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, will be shown by the spotting disc when the target is again raised.

4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may have struck the target, he may call on the Officer in charge at the butt to examine the target, *and the result of such examination as signalled shall be final*. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of *fifty cents* with the Officer in charge at the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

3. If, on a target being hit, the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal disc*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstance to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

6. All claims for shots signalled *must be made before* another shot is fired at the target in question.

7. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

8. All alterations of the register must be initialled by the Officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first signalled to the butt.

9. No person will be permitted to examine the target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for

every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the targets in excess of the number of shots allowed, could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

XXV.

The rifles shall be Snider (Long and Short) and Martini-Henry rifles, either of Government issue or of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz.
Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Field sights will not be allowed.
 - (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce grey; and no application of color will be allowed after the competitor has taken his position at the firing point.

No application of a permanent nature will be allowed.

No shading of sights will be permitted.

- (b) The *back sight* may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by any extemporized means.
- (c) The sliding bar may be inverted and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider, and *three* for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or line of any kind removable at pleasure may be used, but not consisting of slips of paper or other substance capable of being shifted or removed.

XXVI.—AMMUNITION.

None but the ammunition issued by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed.

XXVII.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the target.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard, and the left elbow clear of the body.

XXVIII.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. Competitors must be present at the firing points punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office. "Blowing off" and all other preliminaries must be completed before hand, and will not be allowed as excuses for delay.

2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*.

3. When but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay; but the officer in charge of the firing point *or some one named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection *before* the next shot is fired.

4. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition except in the Martini Matches, with the same rifle; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Officer in charge.

5. The competitor must after delivering *each shot*, pay attention to the score called out by the Register-Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the Register, so that any objection to *the score recorded* may be investigated before the next shot is fired.

6. In case of an unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the score forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

XXIX.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows:—

A. *In Individual Competition for a Series of Prizes.*

1 If at more than *one* distance by *the range totals in inverse order, commencing at the longest range.*

2 By the fewest *outers.*

3 By the fewest *magpies.*

4 By the fewest *inners.*

5 By the value of *each shot in inverse order.*

In the case of ABSOLUTE TIES.

(a) If for MONEY PRIZES, by division.

(b) If for PRIZES IN KIND, by *shooting off* as in clause B.

(c) In the case of a prize PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by *shooting off for the Prize in Kind, and dividing Money.*

These sub-sections apply also to competitions at single distances. Where a "possible score" is made, the maker shall fire *three* shots immediately after.

N.B.—In all competitions the *order* of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.

B. *In Individual Competitions for a Single Prize.*

1 By the aggregate score in *five* rounds at the longest distance.

2 By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. *In team Competition.*

1 If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.

2 By the fewest *outers*.

3 By the fewest *magpies*.

4 By the fewest *inners*.

5 By the highest scorers in each team *shooting off*, as in Clause B.
D. *Grand Aggregate.*

Equal numerical scores for the first 5 places, and for the last place or places, shall be decided by the result of firing 5 shots at 600 yards, after that if the scores be still equal, by single shots until decided.

For other places:

1 By the *total score in each match in inverse order.*

2 By the *total scores at 600 yards.*

3 By the *total scores at 500 yards.*

4 By the *total scores at 400 yards.*

5 By shooting off as in Clause B.

In the Governor-General's Match, scores of equal numerical value shall be treated and placed by the before stated Rule B.

In Military Matches, by the largest number of hits.

E. *In cases not met by the foregoing.*

1 By any *special rules attached to the conditions.*

2 By the *fiat of the Committee.*

NOTE.—Where ties have been decided by "shooting off" the Snider rifle shall only be used.

XXX.—ENTRIES.

The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any Entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.

The privilege of Entry is restricted to members, who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to associate members, who pay the fee of (\$1.00) at the time of entry.

1 Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the committee.

2 Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.

3 No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.

4 Entries shall be classified :

(a) Ordinary (at the published rates of entrance fees). To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A., on or before 4 p.m., Wednesday, 24th August.

(b) Post (at an increase charge of 20 per cent. on the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made or received after 4 p.m., Wednesday, 24th August.

N. B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the special committee may determine.

2 To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 24th August, Officers commanding corps and secretaries of Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.) competitors accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees ; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries, until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases the Register tickets will not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of

the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for in the following regulations :—

XXXI.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1 Entrance fees in full will be returned to those—

(a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting ; or

(b) Who attend the meeting but are incapacitated from illness or accident ; or

(c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committee may have cancelled.

2 Claims based on other considerations than the above will, if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit.

XXXII.—SQUADDING.

1 In the case of competitors classified as Ordinary Entries, arrangements will be made and details published of the day, hour and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

2 In the case of Post Entries, the hour of shooting cannot be pre-determined or announced, and competitors so classified must await the orders that the progress of the meeting may render practicable.

XXXIII.—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

1 Any alteration which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration, unless verified by the initials of the Secretary or Executive Officer, will cancel the ticket.

2 The place of publication for all notices affecting the detail of shooting shall be the the board fixed without the tent of the Secretary, the posting of a notice on such board must be taken and accepted as a good service on all affected thereby.

XXXIV.—REGISTER TICKETS.

1 Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong

ticket, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.

² Any erasure or substitution of one name for another, unless made by the Secretary or Executive Officer, shall invalidate the ticket.

The Council reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.

CONSTITUTION

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1 That this Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2 Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year; and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association, for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3 Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4 Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the

name of the winner and details of the match at which it is won shall be communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such Prize Meeting.

5 There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6 There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7 There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8 There shall be a Council composed of Fifty members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" N. West Territories so soon as an Association is formed in said Territory and is affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association,

one-half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Association of the respective Provinces at their annual meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Association to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form the quorum.

9 The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10 The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11 The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12 There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13 The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14 The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15 The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16 The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17 An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18 The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the Assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or an adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19 A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20 No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21 The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

General By-Laws of the Association.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. Meetings of Council.
The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each Member of the Council, at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to inspection of any Member of the Council. The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting. Finance Committee.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association. Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Banks.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the Expenditure of sums for current expenses.

signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditure of a
general nature

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual Accounts

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
