DEFENDER VS. VALKYRIE III

Inside Facts About the Two Greatest Yachts Ever Built.

Great secrecy has attended the construction of both yachts, particularly the English one, but sufficient has leaked out from time to time to enable one to figure out very clearly how both yachts will look and to make comparisons of their respective qualities.

The English craft is a fin-keel craft, the fin commencing just before the mast, the edge curving slightly below the surface. From the gunns, lines to support the mast also is straight below the topmast, than any of the recent yachts giving her an additional grip for length, more than possessed by Vigilant or Britannia.
