

I am a loyal Briton, and would prefer living under the institutions of my own country, were it practicable. But I, like the rest of the world, of which we are each an atom, would prefer the flag and institutions of the United States with prosperity, to remaining as we are, with no prospect of succeeding as a British colony. It has been tried under different forma and phases for twenty years, and proves a failure."


