WAS DR. CREAM'S LANDLADY.

MISS PORTER OF TORONTO KNEW THE LONDON POISONER.

How He Attempted to Defraud an Insurance Company Out of \$100,000—Robbing Women and Boasting of the Deeds—Incidents of His Career.

MONTREAL, June 29.—Many incidents of the Canadian career of Neil O. Cream, the London poisoner, are coming out.

At the time, a well-known physician, members Cream perfectly. This doctor was at the St. Thomas Hospital in London in the winter of 1877, together with a number of other Canadian physicians, and Cream was studying at the hospital at the time.

"Cream was always a thorough black-guard and cad," remarked this physician. "His habits and conversation were of the lowest order. He was a hard, steady drinker, but was apparently capable of holding a great quantity of liquor for I never saw him intoxicated."

"Cream at one time in London robbed a woman, a street walker, of her purse, containing \$5, and then boasted of it to his friends. Cream was never seen in company with a respectable woman and was always an exceedingly fast liver."

The description given by this physician of Cream tallies exactly with the published description of Neil, the London poisoner.

Swindling Insurance Companies. Cream, while a student at McGill College, made a bold attempt to swindle a leading insurance company of this city.

At the time he was boarding in the home of Miss Ann Porter, 406 Mansfield street, and was of Toronto. On April 18, 1876, a fire broke out in Cream's bedroom, and he was insured in the company referred to for \$100,000.

To the astonishment of the company, Cream claimed damages amounting to \$75,400. He valued his clothing at \$461.40, pictures and books at \$295 and surgical instruments at \$218. The insurance company suspected Cream of incendiarism, but they were unable to prove it. The matter was finally left to arbitration and the medical men awarded Cream \$350 and a check was given Cream for the amount.

Saved the Skeleton. Cream was also commencing a physical joke, when he occurred in his room he dressed a skeleton in a suit of his clothes and laid it on his bed. The skeleton was a dead man, carried to the residence.

A Scotland Yard Detective After Cream. New York, June 29.—Inspector Frederick Jarvis of the Scotland Yard police force has been in New York since Saturday last.

Thomas Neill, the alleged poisoner of Mrs. Laidlaw, is being held in the attention of Inspector Jarvis. Neill is also charged with blackmailing the son of W. H. Smith, the English millionaire, and other aspects to secure a formidable array of evidence here against the prisoner.

Dr. Cream's Chicago Career. CHICAGO, June 29.—Dr. Cream, alias Thomas Neill, came to Chicago in 1877, and opened an office in West Madison street.

In 1880 Cream and a female confederate, Hattie Mack, were indicted for criminal practice. The Mack woman confessed, but Cream got a separate trial and was acquitted.

He was indicted in Nov., 1880, for sending improper postal cards through the mails. He gave bond on this charge and kept his bail.

In Feb., 1881, Cream made the acquaintance of Mrs. Stott, a well-to-do woman who acted as a nurse for the Northwestern railroad at Garden Prairie. Stott was 61 years old, his wife 53.

Stott died suddenly. An investigation was held and Dr. Cream and Mrs. Stott were arrested for murder. Cream was released and Mrs. Stott was held for trial.

Mrs. Stott was charged with Cream's scheme to have his wife give him a check for \$10,000 and then sue Buck & Rayner for \$10,000 for putting up improper medicines.

Mrs. Stott admitted her relations with Cream, but denied complicity in the poisoning. She was allowed to go free.

In 1891 Gov. Filer committed Cream to the penitentiary for a term of five years with good behavior in prison, gave him his liberty that year.

He went to Canada and thence to England.

A Lady Who Knew Him. A Harvard reporter called upon Miss Porter of 9 A ward street, with whom Dr. Cream boarded during the latter part of his college course in Montreal. She strenuously denied the reports as to his having held parties in his rooms while at her house.

She did no such thing," she declared, and she had known nothing whatever about his character. She had known nothing of his keeping a gun of her own, and she believed he had not done so, as he occasionally mentioned getting very tight, but she did not know how to conduct himself when it was necessary to do so," she said.

The general election in Great Britain and Ireland is not held in one day as in Canada, but may be scattered along a period of two weeks.

At least the election has a certain discretion, which is exercised to the fullest extent, would defer the election to the next day after the date of the United Kingdom for at least the period stated. Upon the dissolution of Parliament the writs issue immediately and simultaneously to all election officers in all parts of the United Kingdom for the formal nomination of candidates for not less than two nor more than three complete days from the receipt of writs.

As the writs are sent by mail, the dates of receiving the writs will vary according to the distance from the Crown Office. In the counties of England, Scotland and Ireland, however, the writs are delivered, either on the day of dissolution or the day following, and the nomination takes place immediately and the nomination will be made in the boroughs on Friday or Saturday next.

As three more complete days must elapse between nomination and the date of election the polling in the boroughs will begin on Tuesday or Wednesday, July 5 or 6.

The borough elections, however, will not doubt indicate the general result, and the close of the polls will have a fairly accurate idea of whether Lord Salisbury or Mr. Gladstone is to direct the policy of the British Empire during the term of the coming Parliament.

Salisbury Will Meet Parliament.
In 1928 Mr. Darnley acted as a precedent. When decidedly defeated at the polls in that year he handed the resignation to the Queen. It had been the custom before that time for the Prime Minister to resign to the King.
