

PRAYERS.

SUNDAY MORNING.

Almighty and merciful Father, we bless and praise thy holy Name, that thou hast safely brought us to the beginning of this, thy holy day; give us grace to observe it in a becoming manner. After Thou, Lord, hadst made the heavens and the earth, thou didst rest on the seventh day from all thy works, and commanded us, thy creatures, to set apart a seventh portion of our time to thy more peculiar service: help us, we humbly beseech thee, to obey this, thy Commandment, by sanctifying this day to thy honour. We thank thee that thou hast been pleased to require us to love and serve thee: because we know that in thy favour only is life; and we bless thee that thou

causest us to rest from our worldly callings this day, that we may enjoy more favorable opportunities for private family and public prayer; for hearing and reading thy holy word, for meditation, and for serious conversation with each other.

O Lord, may we desire to begin the day and the week with Thee. Let a solemn sense of Thy presence be upon our minds, and while we offer our supplications, in the Name of our only Mediator the Lord Jesus Christ, comfort our hearts by the assurance that Thou art nigh unto all them that call upon thee; and though we cannot see thee with our bodily eyes, enable us to believe that the prayers which we offer up unto thee, shall be heard and answered.

We are indeed, Almighty Father, unworthy to be called thy children, because we have in numberless instances sinned against thee. Glory be to thy Name, that thou hast given thy dear Son Jesus Christ to die for sinners: for we acknowledge that we must otherwise have perished everlastingly. Thy wrath might justly have consumed us in a moment, and have sent us down to hell. But thou hast had mercy on us, and hast made known to us, by thy word, how we may be saved. O Lord, help us to ask this day, with real anxiety of mind, as persons who are sensible of the value of their souls, "What must we do to be saved?"

We thank thee, O Lord, for the opportunities which we are invited to enjoy this day, of offering up our prayers and praises publicly in thy house, and of hearing those blessed truths, the knowledge of which is essential to the salvation of our souls. O give us grace diligently to attend to thy word. Enable us to understand it, and make us anxious to improve by it, that the sermons which we hear may not rise up in judgment against us at the last day. Bless, O gracious God, the Ministers of thy Gospel, especially our own, who show unto us the way of Do thou teach them, that they may salvation. O Lord, may thy word this be able to teach us. day awaken our consciences, that we may see more evil in the nature of sin, more danger from the guilt of it, and be more earnest to secure an interest in Christ, the only Saviour from The mercies and blessings we ask for ourselves we ask also for our relations and friends. and all that is near and dear to us. May ene neighbours and acquaintances be also stirred up to a concern for their never-dying souls; and may thy grace be set forth in saving us and them from the wrath to come, which we confess we have deserved.

We pray, O Lord, to be kept this day from all worldly thoughts and words; and may thy spirit suggest such things to our minds as are suitable to this holy part of our time. Guard us from all sin, danger and evil. O may we keep

thy Sabbath in a becoming manner, and love it as the best day of the seven, because it is a season dedicated to Thy service, Holy unto the Preserve us while in thy house from a stupid and a wandering frame; give us the spirit of prayer and of supplication, that we may worship thee in spirit and in truth. Strengthen our memories to retain what we hear, and make this day a time of real benefit to our souls, for which we may have reason to bless thee to all eternity. We are ignorant, do thou instruct us. We are wicked, do thou convert us. We are guilty, do thou pardon us, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with Thee, O Father, and the Holy Spirit, we ascribe all honour, glory and praise, now and for evermore. Amen.

SUNDAY EVENING.

WE thank thee, most merciful Father, for the blessings we have received from thee this day. We thank thee for the opportunities afforded to us of offering up our prayers and praises publicly in thy house. We bless thee for food and raiment, and all other blessings of this life. We humble ourselves before thee, and acknowledge our unworthiness of these blessings; but we adore thee chiefly for thy love made known to us by the Gospel of thy dear Son, for the means of grace and the hope of glory. O, how wonderful it is that to us, miserable sinners, should be preached the forgiveness of sins, through the merits and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, and that we should be invited to partake of it. We have been told. O Lord, of our sinfulness before thee: we beseech thee to make us feel it. May we truly repent May the remembrance of and turn unto thee. our sins be grievous to us, and may the burden of them become intolerable, until we receive an assurance of thy pardon. We have heard of a gracious Saviour who died to put away our sins. Apply this blessed truth to our souls; and may we believe on him, and receive him into our hearts as the hope of glory. As we know that we cannot rightly understand what we have heard, nor practise it, without thy grace, O Lord,

send to us thy Holy Spirit, according to thy merciful promises, that thy truth may take fast hold of our conscience, and be the means of bringing us to eternal life.

O Lord, give us now, at the close of this holy day, a true sense of the unspeakable value of our precious souls. May we be convinced that a man would be nothing profited who should gain the whole world and lose his own soul. One more precious Sabbath is passed; and we know not that we shall see another. This one may be our last on earth. Before another comes we may be called into eternity. O, how many Sabbaths have we lost. How little has the present been spent as it ought to have been. How cold have been our prayers for thy grace. How insensible our hearts to thy word. And though we have been informed that Christ died to save us, how little have we been affected with that delightful truth. O merciful God, forgive us, and help us this night, before we close our eves in sleep, to flee to Christ for pardon and salvation; that if we lie down to rise no more, we may sleep in Jesus, and be eternally glorified through him.

We pray thee, if we are permitted to see the light of another day, to grant that the recollection of the religious services of the Sabbath may be fresh on our memories through the week that we have entered upon. When we are tempted to sin, may we remember that it was for sin

our Lord and Saviour suffered on the cross. O may we be resolved in dependance on thy grace to sin no more. May we shun the person and place which have led us to transgress in times past. May we fear to offend thee, more than to lose our lives; may thy love constrain us to please thee in all our words and actions. O may we never be ashamed to acknowledge thee, and live in thy service; and may we renounce everything that is contrary to thy will and word.

Bless every member of this family absent or present, and all that we are in duty bound to pray for; remember them all in mercy, according to their several wants.

Bless thy Church and people, and increase their numbers and piety. Particularly bless thy ministering servants, and grant that they may show by their lives and doctrines that they are the true Ministers of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ; and hasten the time when all mankind shall know thee, and be engaged in thy service.

Hear us, O Lord, in these our imperfect petitions. Forgive us all our sins; take us under thy care and protection for the night, and keep us from all danger and evil, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

MONDAY MORNING.

Almighty and everlasting God, our Heavenly Father, we approach thy foot-stool this morning to offer up our thanksgivings for thy merciful care over us the past night. are again entering on the business of our lawful callings, in which thy Providence has placed us. May we engage in the cares and business of the world this day with a godly fear lest through the temptations to which we are exposed we should dishonour thee by sin, and so bring home with us at night a guilty conscience. O Lord, may this fear of offending thee be kept alive in our hearts all this day. May our employments be sanctified and made comfortable by a sense of Thy presence. Let us remember that "to eat bread in the sweat of our brow" is a part of the curse of thy holy law, and the effect of our sinfulness. May this thought humble us, and make us patient under our labours. May we be truly thankful that we are hitherto preserved from hell, and have a hope, through grace, of getting safe to heaven.

We beseech of thee, gracious Lord, to give us a full conviction of our real situation, that we may seek and obtain true repentance. We acknowledge that we and all men were conceived and born in sin; and what is born of the flesh, and they who are in the flesh, cannot please Gop, but

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live in sin, committing many actual transgressions. We know also that our Saviour Christ has said: "No man can enter into the Kingdom of God except he be regenerate, and born anew of water and the Holy Ghost." O Lord, we acknowledge our sinfulness and helplessness before thee. Mercifully look upon us. Wash us and sanctify us with thy Holy Spirit, that we may be delivered from thy wrath, may be received into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity, may so pass the waves of this troublesome world, that finally we may be brought to the land of everlasting life, there to be with Thee world without end, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Thou knowest, Lord, the secrets of our hearts. O make it our earnest desire this day to grow in grace, and in the love and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Christ Jesus. May thy Holy Spirit instruct us while we are at our daily employments, and bring to our remembrance what we yesterday heard. May we be kept from pro-May we be preserved from every faneness. May no sinful expression proceed temptation. out of our mouths. O may we remember that we are the Lord's servants. May all our conduct be under the direction of his word. May we abhor sin, and fly from it as from the face of a serpent; and may nothing ever induce us to say or do the least thing which our conscience condemns, but may we rather suffer any thing

than wound our blessed Saviour, and grieve his Holy Spirit. Hold thou up our goings in thy path, that our footsteps slip not; and guard us against all the accidents and dangers of this day.

Help us, O Lord, to spend this day as if it were the last we had to spend on earth, for we know not that we shall live to see another. Supply our needful wants, and enable us to make a proper use of all thy blessings. Bless those that are near and dear to us, and all that we are in duty bound to pray for. Show thy mercy and care to the sick and afflicted, to the poor and needy, and grant such other gifts to us as Thou in thy wisdom see fit for each of us, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord, in whose precious name and comprehensive words we sum up all our wants, saying:

MONDAY EVENING.

WE do not presume to come into thy presence, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to lift up our sinful eyes to the throne of thy glory. But it is Thou, O Lord, whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore thy grace at this time, that we may appear before thee as creatures in the presence of their Creator, as criminals in the presence of their Judge, as sinners in the presence of their gracious Saviour, and also as children before a kind and indulgent Father. To Thee, O Lord, belongeth mercy and forgiveness, but to us shame and confusion of face. We have sinned, and deserve to die; but, O Lord, pardon us and cleanse us from all unrighteousness, for the sake of our Advocate Jesus Christ the Righteous, whose blood cleanseth from all sin.

O Lord, teach us to pray; pour out upon us the spirit of grace and supplication. May thy Holy Spirit help our infirmities, for we know not what to pray for as we ought. May he make intercession for us with groanings that cannot be uttered. O produce in us desires after thy favour and image so strong that nothing but real experience of thy pardoning mercy and sanctifying grace may satisfy them. May we earnestly seek thy favor. We know that if we regard iniquity in our hearts, the Lord will not hear us; make us therefore honest in all our prayers, resolutions, and endeavours to mortify sin, and to be cleansed from all ungodliness and worldly lusts.

We look up to Thee this night, O most mighty Lord, who seest that we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves, beseeching thee to keep us both outwardly in our bodies, and inwardly in our souls; that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul. Thou knowest us to be set in the midst of many and great dangers; and by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always be on our guard to do what is right. Grant to us such strength and protection as may support us in all dangers and carry us through all temptations.

May it please thee to give us hearts to love and fear thee, and diligently to live after thy Commandments; to bless and keep all thy people; to give unto them increase of grace, to hear meekly thy word, to receive it with pure affection, and to bring forth the fruits of the spirit. Strengthen such as do stand; comfort and help the weak-hearted; raise up them that fall; and finally beat down Satan under our feet. May it please thee to succour, help and comfort all that are in danger necessity and tribulation, and to have mercy upon all men.

We beseech thee, O Lord, to give us true repentance, to forgive us all our sins, negligences and ignorances, and to endue us with the grace of thy holy Spirit, that we may amend our lives according to thy holy word. We humbly beseech thee, O Father, mercifully to look upon our infirmities; and for the glory of thy Name, turn from us all those evils that we most righteously have deserved; and grant that in all our troubles we may put our whole trust and confidence in thy mercy, and evermore serve thee in holiness of life, to thy honour and glory, through our only Mediator and Advocate Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TUESDAY MORNING.

Almichty and everlasting God, who dost govern all things in heaven and earth, we thank thee for thy care and preservation of us the past night. Enable us to come before thee this morning with grateful and humble hearts. We acknowledge, O Lord, that we have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep. Having left the good Shepherd, we have wandered into a wilderness of sin and misery, where we are in danger of perishing every moment. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, which are only evil continually. We have offended against thy holy laws, though we know thy laws are holy, just and good; and it grieves us, O Lord, when we remember how we have broken them by thought, word and deed: for we have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and have done those things which we ought not to have done, and there is no health in us. We are in our souls full of disease, and ready to perish. But do thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable sinners. Make us to feel the misery of sin; for until we feel in ourselves the misery which our sins have already brought upon us in this world, and exposed us to in the next, we shall not be heartily desirous of thy mercy. Spare us, O Lord, though we deserve thy displeasure. May we honestly

examine ourselves, and confess our faults to thee; for those who confess them with godly sorrow thou hast promised to spare. Oh let not the guilt of our sins thrust us down into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels. But, O Lord, give us the grace of true repentance; that mourning over the sins of our hearts and the sins of our lives, we may fly to the cross of Christ as the only refuge for guilty souls.

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Thou hast mercifully spared us through another night. If Thou, O good God, hadst not upheld our lives, we should have slept to wake no more. Help us seriously to ask ourselves this morning, whether, if we had died last night, we have any reason from thy Word to conclude that we should have died happily. O how dreadful would it have been to have opened our eyes in hell, to have none around us but devils and lost souls, and have been without hope of ever being delivered from that frightful place of darkness and pain. In this state we should now be. were not Thy mercy great. O Lord, make us more earnest than ever we have been, to save our souls. Help us to pray this morning with all our hearts, that we may receive the blessings we and. And, Oh what an instance of thy goodness will it be, if we, thy poor sinful creatures, are, by the teaching of thy spirit, brought to the knowledge of Jesus Christ, and to heaven at last, through his Name.

We thank thee, blessed Lord, for the numberless favors and mercies we have received from thee from time to time, both of a spiritual and temporal nature. Undeserving as we have been, yet thy goodness and mercy has followed us all our days, and we are this day living monuments of thy mercy. O Lord, be pleased to continue thy care over us, and give us grace that our ways may be made so direct that we might keep thy statutes.

Thou hast safely brought us, O heavenly Father, to the beginning of this day: defend us, we beseech thee, in the same by Thy mighty power, and grant that this day we fall into no sin, neither run into any kind of danger; but that all our doings may be ordered by thy Divine governance, to do always what is righteous in thy sight, through Jesus Christ our Lord. TUESDAY EVENING.

WE are favored, O Lord, by thy sparing mercy, with another opportunity of meeting together in thy holy presence, and of bending our knees before thy throne of grace, Oh, how greatly are we honored in being permitted to speak to Thee, thou King of Kings! We have no distinguished situation in the present world; but while we have the honor of coming into thy presence, we will not envy our superiors their outward distinctions, which will last but for a short time. In thy favor only is life. It is the contrite heart with which thou hast promised to dwell. grant to us humble and praying hearts, and we shall be rich indeed in having Thee our friend and portion for ever. If Thou art our Shepherd and we thy sheep, who hear thy voice and follow thee, then we can want nothing. Though we are undeserving of the least of thy mercies, yet thou givest us every thing needful, thou givest us food and raiment, and innumerable blessings. Give us thy grace, O Lord, that we may know, love, and serve thee, and may we be content with whatever else thy wise Providence allots for us, and feel that we are always under thy care.

Every day, heavenly Father, brings with it trials and vexations, all which are the effects of our sins. Trouble is the lot of every man,

because all have sinned. Glory be to Thy Name, that thou despisest not the sighing of a contrite heart, nor the desire of such as are sorrowful. Mercifully assist our prayers that we make before thee, in all our troubles and adversities, whensoever they oppress us: and graciously hear us, that those evils which the craft and subtlety of the devil or man work against us be brought to naught, and by the Providence of Thy goodness they may be dispersed, that we, thy servants, being hurt by no persecution, may evermore give thee thanks, with our lips and in our lives, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

And now, O Lord, we commend our souls and bodies into thy hands this night. Our bodies are wearied with the employments and anxieties of the day, and thou hast appointed the hours of darkness for their refreshment in sleep. We do not wish to go to rest till we have looked up to Thee to take care of us. Cur houses may take fire, and we be consumed with them, unless Thy Providence watch over us. We may die without even time to cry for mercy. We therefore commend ourselves to thy merciful protection. We are sinners we know; but thou didst provide a sacrifice upon the cross to save sinners. O Lord, save us, and grant that whenever we are called out of time into eternity, we tany die in peace with Thee, through faith in the Redeemer's precious blood. O cleanse our consciences to-night from the guilt of our sins; and

may we lie down on our beds with a well grounded persuasion that if we never awake again on earth, we shall be received into that kingdom prepared by our Lord for these who are saved by his intercession and atonoment.

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Bless all we are in duty bound to pray for. Bless the poor and needy, and all that are afflicted in mind, body or estate, and all that are suffering in sickness, sorrow or other calmity, and grant such relief as their several circumstances require.

Lighten our spiritual darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord, and by thy great mercy defend us all from the perils and dangers of this night, for the love of thy Son our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

WE desire, O merciful Father, to offer unto Thee this morning thankful and grateful acknowledgements for thy care and protection of us during the past night. Help us to come before thee with humble hearts, and to acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins, which we from time to time most grievously have committed by thought, word and deed, against thy Divine Majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. May we truly repent, and be heartily sorry for our misdoings. May the remembrance of them be grievous to us, the burden of them intolerable. Have mercy upon us, most merciful Father, for Thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake; forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may hereafter serve and please Thee, in newness of life, to the honor and glory of Thy Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Thou hast commanded, O Lord, those that are weary and heavy laden with sin and suffering to come unto Thee, and hast promised to refresh them. Let us experience the refreshing influence of Thy grace on our souls this morning. Remember not our offences, which are many and great; neither take thou vengeance on our sins; but spare us, good Lord, spare us, whom Thou hast redeemed with thy most precious blood, and be not angry with us for ever.

Deliver us this day, we beseech thee, from all sin and wickedness, or we shall fall into it; and from our spiritual enemy, who, like a roaring lion, is going about seeking whom he may devour; and from everlasting death, which our iniquities have deserved. O Lord God of our salvation, we beseech thee, by the Redeemer's agony and bloody sweat, by his cross and passion, by his precious death and burial, by his glorious resurrection and ascension, and by the coming of the Holy Ghost, to deliver our sinful souls from the curse of thy law, from the snares of Satan, from the sin that most easily besetteth us, and so, in the end, from everlasting destruction.

Let not our minds be this day so taken up with our wordly business as to forget Thee. But while we are diligent in business, may we also be fervent in spirit, serving the Lord. May our souls through this day often rise up to Thee in prayer and praise. Oh, that sin, wherever we discover it, may be hateful to us. May our conscience be enlightened and tender; whatever we do, may we do it as unto the Lord, and not unto men, striving to approve ourselves to him who searcheth our hearts. O Lord, graciously help us to love our neighbours as ourselves; and to do to all others as we would they should do unto us. May we duly honor all that are in authority over us, either as governors, teachers, spiritual pastors or masters. May we hurt nobody by word or deed. Make us true and

just in all our dealings. Grant that we bear no malice or hatred in our hearts. Help us to keep our thoughts fixed on Christ, our tongues from evil speaking, lying and slandering; and may our bodies be the temples of the Holy Chost. Grant that we may never covet another's goods; but may we learn to do our duty in that state of life into which it hath pleased God to place us. And as we know that we are not able to do these things of ourselves, nor to keep thy commandments, nor to serve thee acceptably, without Thy special grace, therefore we call upon Thee, O Lord, in the words which thou hast taught us to use, saying:

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

O BLESSED Lord, our Maker and preserver, Thou gavest us our being at first, and hast mercifully upheld us to this moment. Thou didst create us, and gave us a reasonable soul, that we might believe in thee, fear thee, and love and serve thee with all our strength. We were sent into this world to worship thee, to give thee thanks, to honor thy holy Name and Word, and to serve thee truly all the days of our lives. But, O Lord, we have not done this; we have loved other things more than thee, we have feared other things more than offending thee, we have followed the corrupt inclinations of our own hearts, and forgotten thee, our merciful and gracious Redeemer, the author of all our blessings and the fountain of all our comforts. O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable sinners, and incline our hearts to keep thy laws.

We thank thee, O Lord, that there is a mercy seat to which we are invited to come, that we may obtain pardon for the past and grace for the future. Enable us to pray earnestly for thy favor and grace, and let us not pray as the hypocrites do, repeating with their lips what they do not feel in their hearts, lest our very prayers should in the last day rise up in judgment against us, and condemn us. May we feel an earnest desire for thy pardoning mercy and sanctifying

grace. Our most secret thoughts are open to Thee, as well as our words and actions. us, we beseech thee, seriously to examine ourselves this night; may our sins be brought to remembrance; and may we not suffer them to slip out of our minds till we have a good hope that they are forgiven for Christ's sake. Let us not commit ourselves to rest either with a guilty conscience or a careless heart, but may we lie down trusting to the merits of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and looking to him for the salvation of our souls. Suffer us not, O Lord, to suppose that by bending our knees in prayer we do all that is required of us. we be taught that prayer is designed to bring our souls near to Thee, O Lord, and to make us like Thee; that we may ask in order to receive, and seek that we may find; and that our prayers are of no use any further than as the means of obtaining thy mercy, of rendering us more serious in preparing for death and eternity, and of teaching us to love thee more, and to serve thee better. Therefore bestow upon us the spirit of prayer, that we may pour out our very hearts before Thee as our Heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

As Thou hast taught us to meet together to offer up our supplications and praises, day by day, grant, we entreat thee, O Lord, that in so doing, though in our imperfect manner, we may become more spiritual, more acquainted with thy blessed Gospel; that we may love thy ways and ordinances with increasing fervour, hate sin with a more perfect hatred, and become more and more fit for thine eternal kingdom. O make us delight to pray unto Thee, and to praise thy Name, for Thou, Lord, art worthy of all honor. Angels love to sing thy praise; thy servants on earth delight to worship thee. O may we be numbered among them, and love thy service also. Grant this for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Again, O Lord, we approach thee, to offer unto thee thanks and praises for thy goodness and mercy in protecting us the past night, and giving us to see the light of another day. Grant that the influence of thy Holy Spirit, and the light of thy countenance, may shine on us this morning.

O Lord, it is the office of thy Holy Spirit to convince sinners of their sins, and to make known to them by means of thy own Word that precious Saviour by whom alone they can be saved; make known to us, we beseech thee, the power and willingness of Christ to save our souls. Teach us that He who died on the cross to make an atonement for us was God as well as man; and that, therefore, there is an infinite virtue in his blood, to cleanse us from all sin. Enable us, to believe that He who gave himself for us cannot be unwilling to receive, to pardon, and to bless us. And help us in the belief of this to come unto Him, that we may find rest unto our souls.

We confess, O Lord, that we have not yielded thee that glory which thou hast made us capable of rendering. We are prone to forget thee, though Thou art never unmindful of us, and to disobey thee, though thy goodness to us is unwearied. Jucrease and confirm in us more and more thy true knowledge and faith, and fear, and love, and every grace of thy Holy Spirit. Let not one be wanting, let not one be weak; but grant us such manifestations of thy self, and so confirm us in the image of thy holiness, that our lives may be comfortable to ourselves, profitable to others, and honorable to Thee our God.

And now, O Lord God, who hast given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplications unto thee, and hast promised that when two or three are gathered together in thy Name, thou wilt grant their requests; fulfil now, O Lord, the desires and petitions of thy servants, as may be most expedient for them, granting us in this world knowledge of thy truth, and in the world to come life everlasting. *Amen*.

And if any doubt remain respecting the everlasting welfare of our souls, may we not rest until it is removed.

We bless and thank thy holy Name for all the mercies of this day. We have through thy kind providence escaped many dangers, of which we were not aware, and from which no care of ours could have saved us; may our hearts feel thankfulness while our lips express it. It is Thou who continuest us in health and strength; enable us to live soberly, righteously and godly in this present evil world. Thou feedest and elothest us. O Lord, we adore thy undeserved bounty; and beseech thee to add to these temporal good things the highest bounties of thy

grace in Jesus Christ. Feed our souls with the bread of life, clothe them with the garments of salvation; give us spiritual health and strength, that we may walk in all thy commandments and ordinances blameless. O Lord, receive our prayers, receive our praises, and in the hour of death, O heavenly Father, receive our departing souls, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Let our souls be melted in the furnace, if we may but thereby be made fit for being delivered into the mould of thy Gospel, and bearing thy bright and amiable image for ever.

Hear us in these our prayers, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
