FORM OF A BEQUEST TO THE SOCIETY.

I give and bequeath to "The Newfoundland and British North America Society for Educating the Poor," instituted in London in the year 1823, the sum of
Pounds sterling, to be raised and paid, for the purposes of the said Institution, out of such part only of my personal estate as shall not consist of chattels real, or money secured on mortgage of Lands or Tenements, or in any other manner affecting Lands or Tenements; for which Legacy the Receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Institution shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.

* * * Bequests for charitable or benevolent purposes, of lands or tenements, or of money to be laid out in the purchase thereof, or charged on, or otherwise affecting lands or tenements, or of money secured on mortgage of lands or tenements, are void; but money, stock, or other personalty not falling under any of the above descriptions, may be so bequeathed.

LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

I. This Society shall be designated **THE NEWFOUNDLAND AND BRITISH NORTH AMERICA SOCIETY FOR EDUCATING THE POOR.**

II. The Schools shall be managed by Masters and Mistresses of the United Church of England and Ireland, or of the established Church of Scotland, and conducted, as nearly as circumstances may permit, on Dr. Bell's system.

III. This Society shall consist of a Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary or Secretaries, and also of Governors, and Life and Annual Members, and such other Officers as may be deemed necessary for conducting its affairs.

IV. Each Subscriber of one Guinea annually, or upwards, shall be a Member.

V. Each Subscriber of Ten Guineas, or upwards, at one time shall be a Member for Life.

VI. Each Subscriber of Five Pounds annually, or of Twenty Guineas at one time, shall be a Governor, and entitled to attend and vote at all Meetings of the Committee.

VII. An Executor paying a bequest of Fifty Pounds, or upwards, shall be a Member for Life.

VIII. The business of the Society shall be conducted, and, all its Officers appointed, by a Committee of not less than twelve; of whom Nine, who shall have attended the greatest number of times during the year, shall be eligible for the ensuing year.

IX. The Patron, Vice-patrons, President, Vice-presidents, Treasurer, and Secretaries, shall be considered *ex officio* Members of the Committee: the ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held once every Month.

X. Three members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum; and in case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

XI. Five Auditors, three of them not being Members of the Committee, shall be appointed by the Committee annually, for the purpose of auditing the accounts of the Society, of whom three shall be a quorum.

XII. A General Meeting of the Members of the Society shall be held in London annually on the Second Wednesday in May, when the proceedings of the foregoing year shall be reported, and the Accounts presented, and a Committee chosen.

XIII. A Special General Meeting of this Society may be called at any time, at the requisition of the General Committee, or any nine Members, by letter addressed to the Secretary.

XIV. Ten days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given in at least three Newspapers. Those Members of the Society who reside within the limits of the Threepenny Post shall be summoned by letter to attend; and when such General Meetings are Special, the object of them shall be mentioned in the summons.

XV. At all General Meetings, and at those of the Committee, the Patron, or, in his absence, the Vice-Patron, or should he be absent the President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President first upon the list, who may be present, or in the absence of all the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, and, in his absence, such Member as shall be voted for that purpose, shall preside at the Meeting.

XVI. None of the Laws of the Society shall be repealed or altered, nor any new Law established, but at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.

RULES FOR AN AUXILIARY SOCIETY.

1. That the object and constitution of the Newfoundland and British North America Society for educating the Poor, having the cordial approbation of this Meeting, a Society be now formed, to be called "The Auxiliary Newfoundland and British North America School Society of _____," for the purpose of co-operating with that Institution.

2. That all persons subscribing One Guinea per annum, or upwards, or Five Guineas or upwards at one time, shall be Members of this Society.

3. That the business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Secretaries, and a Committee, consisting of not less than _____ Members; and that three Members of this Committee constitute a quorum. That the Committee shall meet once every quarter, or oftener, on some day to be fixed by themselves.

4. That the Committee divide this town and neighbourhood into districts, and appoint two or more of their members for each district, who may associate with themselves any Subscribers, for the purpose of soliciting subscriptions and donations from the inhabitants thereof; and that they establish proper agents and correspondents in different parts within the limits of the Auxiliary Society.

5. That this Auxiliary shall furnish the Parent Society, on or before the first week in March in each year, with an abstract of its cash account, &c.

6. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on such day as shall be fixed on by the Committee in each year, when the accounts (as audited by the Committee) shall be presented, the proceedings of the past year reported, and a Committee chosen for the ensuing year.

RULES FOR AN ASSOCIATION.

1. That we form ourselves into an Association in connexion with the Newfoundland and British North America Society for educating the Poor, for the purpose of contributing towards its object, and that this Association be denominated "The Association."

2. That all persons subscribing the sum of Five Shillings or upwards per annum, or making a donation of One Guinea or upwards at one time, or collecting to the amount of Two Pounds or upwards, shall be Members of this Association.

3. That the business of this Association shall be conducted by a Committee to be chosen annually, consisting of a Treasurer, Secretaries, and not less than _____ other Members, and under the patronage of such other Honorary Members as the Society and Committee shall select and obtain.

4. That the Committee meet once a quarter, or oftener, if necessary, on a day to be fixed by themselves, and that three Members be empowered to act.

5. That for the purpose of soliciting and collecting donations and subscriptions, the Committee divide this neighbourhood into districts, and appoint one or more collectors from among themselves to each district; and that these contributions be paid to the Treasurer at the Committee Meetings.

6. That this Association shall furnish the Committee of the Auxiliary Society, on or before the last day of February in each year, with an abstract of its cash account, &c.

7. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on such day as shall be fixed on by the Committee in each year, when the accounts (as audited by the Committee) shall be presented, the proceedings of the year reported, and a Committee chosen for the ensuing year.

THE
FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE
NEWFOUNDLAND AND BRITISH NORTH AMERICA SCHOOL
SOCIETY FOR EDUCATING THE POOR.

THROUGH the good providence of God, your Committee are permitted to meet you on this the fourteenth Anniversary of your Society. In the discharge of this duty it is matter of much thankfulness to be able to speak the language of congratulation, both as it regards the increased prosperity of the Society's labors abroad and the state of its funds at home. His Excellency the Governor, and other Members of the Colonial Government, have continued to the Society their valuable patronage and support. Several of the schools have been visited by them, and strong approbation expressed of the improvement and general good behaviour of the children. It is also gratifying to observe, that the good effects of the education which it is the object of your Society to impart are every day becoming so apparent, as not only to have won the esteem of the Merchants, Planters, and other residents, but to have increased the number of its friends and supporters in the island.

The amount of receipts in Newfoundland for the year ending May 25th, 1836, was £654..12s..6d. sterling; which sum, deducting the Government grant, is still an increase over that of the preceding year.

Your Committee also have much pleasure in being able to state, that the Colonial Legislature, having taken up the subject of education, has voted the annual sum of £300 sterling for five years to your Society, with the hope that some additional schools, which have been long wanted, may be opened; and that this grant is placed at the entire disposal of the Society, without any reference to the boards of education established by the local legislature, to which, with the exception of £300 appropriated to Roman Catholic schools, they have subjected the application of the sum granted for the general purposes of education throughout the island, but which, from difference of opinion respecting the books to be used, there is reason to believe will not generally be carried into effect. Several new applications have been made to the Superintendent for schools in destitute places; and such is the strong desire at present evinced, that, did your Committee possess the requisite funds, they could at once more than double their number of schools.

There are at present 43 principal and branch schools. The total number of scholars which has been admitted into the daily schools is 6945, Sunday schools 4714, adult schools 1180; and there were on the books at the last return 2664.

The communications which have been received both from the Superintendent and the different Teachers are very encouraging, and prove that their labors are not in vain in the Lord. And your Committee feel it to be especially due to your able and indefatigable Superintendent, Mr. Willoughby, to record their conviction, that, under God, the efficiency

and good success of your Society's operations in the colony are mainly to be attributed to the consistency of his Christian character, and the practical wisdom of his measures; by which he has secured the respect and confidence of the friends of your Society, both at home and abroad.

Your Committee will proceed to lay before you some Extracts from the Reports and Journals of the Teachers, illustrative of their duties, which may be classed under three general heads: the first, that of school-masters; the second, that of friendly visitors; and third, that of catechists, or lay-readers.

The Teacher at the principal school writes, that in consequence of the small-pox, hooping-cough, and other diseases raging to an alarming extent, it was necessary to close the schools for a time; but observes, "Since Christmas the schools have been gradually regaining strength, the numbers on the books being 213, and the daily attendance, which is on the increase, between 120 and 140. His Excellency the Governor and family; his Honor the Chief Justice, Captain Hope, of His Majesty's Ship "Racer," Clergymen, and other Gentlemen, have visited the schools and expressed their satisfaction, and the merchants generally have increased their subscriptions during the past year, so that we have every reason to feel thankful to God." At one of the branch stations he writes, "A building has been erected for the united purposes of a school and place of worship, and an individual engaged as Teacher for the day school, your Teacher assisting the Rev. T. F. H. Bridge in the duties of Sabbath school and services, which have been regularly attended; and this place, once the disgrace of Christians, so near the capital, assumes almost every feature of a neat little English village."

At the Torbay branch he writes, "Once nearly all Pro-

testants, a splendid Roman Catholic chapel has been erected, and all the sad effects of popery manifested. It is true, a church stands here, which, through the kind aid rendered by the Rev. Mr. Bridge, is occasionally served, and your Teacher at other times reads the service of the church in the school-room; but the 200 Protestants now left here feel themselves, with the above exceptions, destitute of Christian instruction. Our schools, blessed be God, go on, and from 40 to 50 children assemble in our day and Sunday schools, whose answers on the Church Catechism with Scripture Proofs are encouraging. Your Teacher also holds a little social meeting for reading on Sabbath evenings, visits the parents, circulates tracts, books, &c., which are gratefully received; and we have the satisfaction of witnessing some pleasing instances of good."

Another Teacher writes :

" We have not been free from opposition, and discouragement, and trials of different kinds, yet I do humbly trust, yea, I verily believe, that some very beneficial effects have, through the blessing of God, attended our labors. Our Sunday School, during the summer, was very encouraging. The average attendance was nearly 60,—several sabbaths there were from 60 to 70 present. We have nothing very wonderful to relate; but the growing improvement of the dear children is quite manifest. Perhaps we may not be privileged to see any immediate work of conversion result from our labors, yet we feel assured that we have abundant encouragement to proceed in this work of faith and labor of love, knowing that the Lord hath said, " So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground, and

should sleep and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up he knoweth not how, for the earth bringeth forth fruit of herself, first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear," &c. (*Mark iv, 26—29*). Suffice it to say, that it is our desire and endeavor, in dependence upon God's grace and blessing, to give the dear children committed to our charge a Bible education, and that they treasure up the blessed contents of that precious book in their memories: I trust many of them love it, and will be made wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus. They are also taught the Church Catechism, Watts's Catechism with exercises, Prayers, Hymns, &c. Our Daily School, too, has been, on the whole, encouraging, the average attendance being about 50, and the children have much improved in reading, writing, ciphering, &c.

"Our branch school at Fool's Island is still in operation, and encouraging as ever. The Teacher was enabled, through the long continuance of ice, to visit this station frequently. On Sabbaths he reads the services, and on other days he reads to or converses with the people, and distributes and exchanges tracts. The people are exceedingly poor: during the winter they live in the woods, for the sake of fuel; this, though it for a time reduces our average attendance, does not diminish the utility or encouragement of our labors at the place.

"Our branch school at Swain's Island has been re-opened by an engagement with the person who, up to last fall, had been employed by the Propagation Society. He is now engaged to keep Sunday School; and in addition to which he reads prayers and a sermon in the church. It is hoped, under the Divine blessing, many in this secluded spot will be led by these means to seek Him whom truly to know is life eternal."

From another :

“ You will see by the returns that another small school at Kiels, in the neighbouring bay, has, with Mr. Willoughby's approbation, been added to us : it contains 30 daily and 60 Sunday scholars, and is conducted by a respectable man, formerly a reader of the Propagation Society, who reads the service in the church, and for whom the Protestants do their utmost, but are unable to maintain him : the additional expense will be £10 per annum.”

Another writes :

“ The daily and Sunday schools continue much as usual : the numbers are unavoidably fluctuating, owing to the circumstance, that fully two-thirds of the children live in the woods during the winter months, and nearly all the elder scholars are engaged in the fishery throughout the summer ; so that, with the exception of very few, your Teachers have not the same children for 12 months together. Your Teachers feel pleasure in stating, that the quantity of fire-wood provided by the parents of the children was quite sufficient for use in the school-room. The amount of subscriptions, also, is greater than that of the preceding year ; for which your Teachers feel thankful. The number of copies of the Holy Scriptures distributed this year has been small, as your Teachers believe that every Protestant family throughout the harbor is furnished with one copy, and in many instances more than one. The books belonging to the Loan Library have been much sought after, and evidently valued, the reading of which will doubtless be attended with a blessing from on high. Many religious tracts have been distributed, espe-

cially among persons going to the Labrador and seal fishery, some of which your Teachers have reason to believe have not been read in vain.

“ In addition to the branches already in connexion with this station, another very interesting one has been opened at a place called Salmon Cove, on the south side of Bare-need, about four miles from Port de Grave, two by land, and the same by water, which your Teacher attends twice a-week, wind and weather permitting, to instruct the children, and read the church service, with a sermon to the people; this being the only means afforded them for religious instruction, excepting (since the commencement of your school) an occasional visit from a local preacher connected with the Wesleyans. This is a very encouraging spot; 74 scholars have been admitted, very few of whom could read. The Society for Propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts formerly had a school in this place, attended by one of their catechists; but it having been relinquished, your Teacher felt it his duty to commence, as the inhabitants were particularly anxious to have a school again kept amongst them.”

Another writes :

“ The improvement of the scholars in reading, writing, and arithmetic, scriptural knowledge, and other branches of useful learning, has continued to give satisfaction to those persons who from time to time have visited the schools. His Excellency the Governor, with his attendants and several other influential gentlemen, visited them in July, when, after having examined the children in the various branches of their learning, needlework, &c., His Excellency expressed the pleasure he felt in witnessing their improvement. On a subsequent

occasion Judge Brenton visited the schools, and was pleased to testify his approbation by a donation to the Society, in addition to his usual annual subscription. Your Teachers have been much encouraged in their Sunday School labors; the numbers have increased in the attendance, there being sometimes 100 present: the number on the books 140. Several respectable persons have also been found ready to assist in teaching both the daily and Sunday scholars, and their parents, as well as others, evince a lively interest in the Loan Library, which, by the munificence of the Religious Tract Society and others, has been increased to nearly two hundred volumes. On the south side of Harbor Grace there are many children requiring instruction, but whom the Society has not been able hitherto to take under its wing: this place is so situated, that the distance they would have to walk to come to the Harbor Grace school would be from six to seven miles. Some of the inhabitants there have lately expressed a wish for assistance; and it is hoped that, by the mutual co-operation of the people with the Society in a pecuniary way, a branch school on a small scale may soon be established there. At Bryant's Cove, a small settlement not far from the south side, there is also a prospect of opening a branch school, under the care of a young woman who was taught in the Harbor Grace school, and whose friends are now residing there. It is gratifying to report, that, notwithstanding the very depressed state of the trade of Harbor Grace, added to the many heavy losses it has, in the course of Divine Providence, been called to sustain, the amount of subscriptions and contributions for instruction has exceeded that of the previous year, it being £38..2s..0d."

From the foregoing extracts (which, if needful, might be much enlarged), it appears that the Teachers are diligently

engaged in their primary duties of maintaining the efficiency of their schools : their engagements of a more general character will now be adverted to, viz. that of visiting from house to house among the neighbours for the purpose of distributing tracts and other religious publications.

In the prosecution of this part of their labors your Committee have much pleasure in gratefully acknowledging the assistance which the Religious Tract Society has rendered in furnishing the Teachers from time to time with large grants from their valuable stock. During the past year your Committee have received from them a liberal and unsolicited grant of tracts and books to the amount of £60, which will prove a most seasonable supply to the Loan Libraries, as well as for gratuitous distribution. This subject is thus mentioned in a letter of Mr. Martin, of Trinity :—

“ Your Teachers beg gratefully to acknowledge the receipt of a parcel of books for their Loan Library : it was most acceptable, and has enabled them to supply nearly one hundred readers of all parties with books to read, who have expressed much gratitude for the use of them. They are very thankful, too, for plenty of tracts, which with much pleasure they have circulated in the neighbourhood, and among the sealers, previous to their departure for the ice. The neighbourhood is visited, once a-week, by Mrs. Martin and others with Loan Tracts : having divided the Harbor into four districts, they go forth two and two, and visit each house, to change the tract left the preceding week. Some pleasing conversations on the subjects of the tracts have given a proof of good done by the circulation of these little silent messengers of the truth ; and your Teachers humbly hope, and would earnestly pray, that, through the blessing of the Lord on their efforts, the lending of religious tracts, and the frequent visits among

the people will be productive of an increase of true religion among us."

Another Teacher writes :

"The large number of tracts sent out last summer have been widely dispersed both in this Harbor and in some of the neighbouring settlements : the new Library books have been very acceptable, and a very much increased love of reading has taken place. All the Prayer Books we could obtain have been sold, and many more Bibles and Testaments than in former years. The Family Prayers, especially of the Tract Society, have been purchased and introduced into many families ; indicating, we hope, that some progress has been made by the schools, and some prospect, at least, of good results are opening."

Another writes :

"During the past year many tracts have been distributed to persons residing in different parts of Green Bay, in which there are numerous small settlements destitute of schools and public worship, who gladly receive them, and spend much time in reading them, particularly on the sabbath, when, in the absence of the means of grace, they are enabled to derive profit and instruction from them : and who can calculate the amount of good these messengers of truth may be the instruments of effecting ?"

Again, another writes :

"The books of the Loan Library have been, as usual, cir-

culated amongst the children, and form a very profitable source of instruction. Your Teachers feel thankful for such an auxiliary to their labors. Tracts have been very widely circulated, and have been thankfully received. The vessels engaged in the sealing voyage have been supplied with them, and generally through the districts with which your Teachers are connected. Many valuable publications of the above society have been sold to the inhabitants generally, and from the circulation of which we do humbly hope, with the blessing of the Lord, that many precious souls may be led to see that Jesus Christ is the way, the truth, and the life."

The third description of employment in which some of your Teachers are engaged is not the least important among their useful labors,—that of reading in the churches or in the school-rooms on the Sabbath where there is no clergyman, and thus preserving the delightful and edifying ordinances of that holy day from entirely falling into disuse. Let it be remembered, that there are thirty-seven churches in the island with but twelve clergymen to supply them; and though the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts had formerly in their service a number of catechists, whose duty it was, under the direction of the clergy, to read the church service, yet the poor inhabitants have been deprived, in a great measure, even of this assistance, the society not being able, in consequence of its diminished income, any longer to retain them*. This fact has necessarily drawn the attention of the clergy and inhabitants to your Teachers to

*In the last Report it was erroneously stated, that the number of stipendiary Missionaries in connexion with the Society for propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts had been reduced: it ought only to have been stated that their *salaries* had been reduced, and the entire of the catechists discharged, or at least not paid.

obtain their assistance : your Committee, therefore, wish it to be understood, that, in undertaking this duty, your Teachers have done it at the request and under the sanction of the respective clergy in the island. And it cannot but be matter of rejoicing to all that love the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, that your Society can be of any service in supplying the lack occasioned by the lamentable paucity of clergymen for ministering to multitudes who are craving for the bread of life.

In closing this portion of the Report, your Committee have to notice a communication which they have received from Captain Owen, proprietor of the island of Campo Bello, in the Bay of Fundy, on the confines of British North America and the United States. It appears from his letter, that the island has a population of between five and six hundred inhabitants, with a probability of a rapid increase, from its mercantile and agricultural advantages. There is no minister among them, nor any means whatever of religious instruction, except what he himself affords. His object is to obtain a master and mistress to conduct a school on the principles of your Society, and to read the church service on the Lord's Day. He has applied, therefore, to your Committee, making a liberal offer towards the support of a married Teacher. This application your Committee have entertained, and are now in correspondence with Captain Owen on the subject: should the issue of the correspondence lead to this result, your Committee hope that it may call forth to their assistance many more supporters, and considerably augment the funds of your Society, and be the commencement of their labors in British North America, to which they have been long pledged, and to which they are most anxious to direct their attention.

HOME PROCEEDINGS.

In calling your attention to the state and prospects of the Society at home, it is the pleasing duty of your Committee to be able to report a steady progress, which affords ground to hope that the Society may yet, through the good pleasure of God, accomplish more fully the great ends of its establishment. During the past year several of the more important auxiliaries could not be visited by your Secretary, owing to various local and other unavoidable causes; in consequence of this, there has been a considerable loss to the Society of the proceeds of sermons and meetings: notwithstanding which, it is most gratifying to state, that the receipts from those places, for the most part, have proved that your Society has lost none of its friends.

The remittances for the past year from Donations, Subscriptions, and Associations, have amounted to £2391..10s..1d. If from this sum be deducted £500, the legacy of the late Mrs. Codner, there will still be an increase over the receipts of the preceding year of £121..10s..4d.

The contributions in Newfoundland, including the Government grant of £300, amount to £654..12s..6d, reduced to sterling money: the entire receipts, therefore, available for the purposes of the Society have amounted to £3046..2s..7d, being an increase of £851..9s over the total sum placed at the disposal of your Committee for the preceding year. The payments during the same period have amounted to £3299..6s..8d, leaving a balance due to the Treasurer, on the 31st March, of £253..4s..1d.

Your Committee hope that this statement of the Society's finances may prove an encouragement to their friends, and stimulate them to renewed exertion; that if, in the providence

of God, they should be permitted to see another Anniversary, it may be to offer thanksgivings to Him from whom every good and every perfect gift cometh, for increasing prosperity to the Society's operations both at home and abroad.

Your Committee would take this opportunity to express their grateful acknowledgments to the Ladies of the various Associations in and near the metropolis, as well as in different parts of the country, for the large pecuniary assistance rendered to the Society through their zealous exertions. To several of the Clergy—amongst whom may be mentioned the Rev. S. R. Capel, of Salisbury; the Rev. Mr. Huxtable; the Rev. Mr. Venn, of Hereford; the Rev. Messrs. Wid-drington, Mallock, Foot, Rhodes, &c. &c.—the thanks of the Committee are due for their kindness either in granting their pulpits or advocating the cause of the Society. Nor can your Committee omit to mention their old and valued friend Samuel Codner, Esq., through whose exertions a new impulse has been given to some Associations where he has been resident. Your Committee have farther to acknowledge their obligations to the Secretaries and Officers of the various Associations, to whom, in many instances, the Society owes its increased prosperity, and, in general, its local existence. And it is with much pleasure they have to record the great kindness of Mr. Pack, of the firm of Messrs. Gosse, Pack, and Fryer, of Poole, for his liberal offer to Mr. Willoughby of a free passage, either for himself or any of the Teachers, to or from Newfoundland.

Allusion has been made to the value of the Loan Libraries in connexion with the schools in the island. In addition to the grant already mentioned from the Religious Tract Society, and the receipt of several parcels of books from kind friends, your Committee would gratefully acknowledge the kindness

of the Rev. C. Bradley, of Clapham, who, besides granting his pulpit, has given twelve volumes of his Series of Practical Sermons, for the use of the Society's schools. Your Committee have further to acknowledge the sum of £20 from the conductors of the Youth's Magazine; and also £25 from an anonymous friend, through the Rev. I. Kitchen, of Ipswich.

It hath pleased God to remove by death two kind friends of the Society,—John Griffiths, Esq. of Hereford, and Miss Green, of Peckham, who have left a testimony of their deep interest in its welfare by bequeathing each the legacy of £50* for its uses; and your Committee would take this opportunity to express their best thanks to the respective Executors for having, with much kindness, paid the legacies, duty free, to your Treasurer.

On a review, then, of the proceedings of the Society during the past year, your Committee would thank God and take courage, ascribing most gladly and gratefully to Him all the glory and all the praise for every measure of increasing prosperity with which this Institution has been favoured.

But the principle which leads the grateful heart to ascribe to its proper source the existence and the increase of good will not lie useless and inactive. Called to the distinguished honor of working together with God in the accomplishment of his eternal purposes of love to a sinful and ruined world, and animated by the assurance that his counsel shall stand, and He will do all his pleasure, the Christian's aim and prayer and supreme concern are to be occupied, "while it is called to-day," in working out his own salvation, and promoting to the utmost of his power that of his fellow-men. Nor will such a one, in this day of holy energy and enterprize, find

himself an isolated philanthropist. Be his sympathies ever so fervent, his benevolence ever so expansive, he will be at no loss to find amplitude of scope, and means and opportunity for directing them to the best ends; for there is scarcely a portion of the habitable globe inaccessible to his labors, as there is none to his prayers. And, amid the claims that may press for his support, your Committee feel assured, that, if due consideration be given to those of your Society, they cannot be overlooked. The objects of its bounty, the simplicity of its purpose, the utility of its labors, and, more than all, the seal which God has set upon it, by sustaining it in almost hopeless difficulties, and abundantly crowning its labors with success, must surely commend your Society to the prayers, the sympathy, and the assistance, of all whose heart's desire is that the kingdoms of this world may speedily become the kingdoms of our God and of his Christ, when He shall reign for ever and ever.
