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#### CONSTITUTION AND BYE-LAWS

OF THE

# NEW BRUNSWICK PROVINCIAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

#### CONSTITUTION.

- 1. This Association shall be called the "The New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association."
- 2. Any person being a British subject, subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
- 3. Any person, other than a commissioned officer, being a British subject, may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall thereby have the privilege of taking part in the Annual Matches but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association other than a Competitors' Meeting.
- 4. A contribution of twenty dollars, or of the value thereof, to the Association shall constitute the donor a life member.
- 5. Any County or Regimental Association in the Province subscribing five dollars towards the funds of this Association shall be considered as being in connection with it during the year in which such subscription shall be made, and shall be entitled to receive the silver medal of this Association for competition by its bona-fide members.
- 6. On payment of any subscription or contribution, tickets of membership shall be issued by the Secretary, which shall contain the name of the member, and shall not be transferable.

7. The Annual General Meeting of the members of the Association for the election of a President, a Vice-President and Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held on the first Wednesday in April in each year, at such hour and place as the Council shall appoint.

A special general meeting of the members of the Association may be called at any time by the President, upon the written requisition of any three members.

8. A Patron and Vice-Patrons, who shall also be members of the Council, may be named by the Council.

9. The members shall, at each Annual General Meeting of the Association, choose from among their number a President, who shall be President of the Association. Also a Vice-President, who shall act in the absence of the President.

10. The Adjutant-General of Canada, the Deputy Adjutant-General of this district, and all Field Officers on the Militia Staff in New Brunswick, the Officer commanding any Regiment of Cavalry, Field Battery, Battalion of Artillery, Company of Engineers, Battalion or Independent Company of Infantry within the Province, and the President of any County Association affiliated with this Association, respectively being members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents of the Association and members of the Council.

11. The Council shall annually appoint a Secretary-Treasurer of the Association.

12. The Council shall consist of the President, the Vice-Presidents and Secretary-Treasurer, ex-officio; and also of not more than twenty members, who shall be elected annually by a majority of votes taken by ballot at the general meeting. Five members of the Council shall form a quorum for the transaction of business. Any member elected to the Council at the general meeting of the Association may qualify by payment of his subscription at any time prior to the next meeting of the Council, and if the same shall not be then paid, the place of such member shall be considered vacated, and may be filled by the Council.

- 13. The Council shall conduct and control the business of the Association, and may grant such salary as they shall see fit to any Officer of the Association, and shall meet twice during the year, or oftener if required by the President or any two of its members.
- 14. The Council shall, at its first meeting, elect five of its members to form, with the President and Secretary, an Executive Committee, which, subject to such instructions as may be given by the Council, shall transact the business of the Association, and shall arrange for and conduct the Annual Prize Competition.
- 15. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy which may exist in the number of its members, or of the Office Bearers of the Association; to enact Bye-Laws and to form rules for the regulation of the competitions of the Association, and of all other matters committed to its charge.

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- 16. The Secretary-Treasurer shall conduct all correspondence, keep the minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association and of the Council; and shall also keep the accounts of the Association, which shall be annually audited and reported upon to the Annual Meeting by three members appointed by the Council for that purpose.
- 17. A general meeting of members and competitors shall be held on the second evening during the Annual Prize Matches for the discussion of matters relating to the prize list and shooting regulations.
- 18. No alteration in this Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Meeting of the Association by a vote of a majority of the members present and entitled to vote at such meeting.

#### BYE-LAWS.

- 1. The election of all officers and of the Council shall be by ballot, upon nomination duly made and seconded, and no vote shall count for any person not so nominated.
- 2. At least fourteen days notice of the time and place appointed for the Annual Meeting shall be given by the Secretary, in one or more newspapers published in the city of Saint John, and by notification to each member of the Council.
- 3. The regular meetings of the Council shall be held on the first Thursday in May and November, at such time and place as the President shall appoint.
- 4. Special meetings of the Council may be called at any time by the President, and shall be called by him on the written request of any *two* members of the Council; such request to contain the nature of the business for which the meeting is asked.
- 5. Notice of time and place of every regular and special meeting of the Council shall be issued by the Secretary to each member thereof, at least seven days before the day appointed for the meeting, and in case of a special meeting such notices must state the object or objects for which such meeting is called.
- 6. Meetings of the Council may be adjourned from day to day, as may be found necessary.
- 7. If at any regular or special meeting a quorum be not present, three members of the Council (an officer of the Association being one) shall have power—after waiting half an hour, to adjourn the meeting to another time, and it shall not be necessary to issue notices for such adjourned meeting.
- 8. The Council shall appoint three of its members a Committee of Audit, to whom the Secretary-Treasurer shall submit his books and accounts at least one week before the Annual Meeting, and the Committee shall audit the same and report thereon at said Annual Meeting.

9. The Annual Prize competition of the Association shall be held at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Council.

10. Notice of the time and place of the Annual Competition shall be given by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in the city of Saint John, and elsewhere in the Province, as the Council may direct, at least fourteen days before the first of the days appointed for the meeting, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to forward to the officers commanding corps in the province, at least six copies of the programme of such Annual Competition.

11. A Silver Medal will be given to each County and Regimental Association within the Province which affiliates with the Provincial Association, on or before the first day of August in each year; which medals shall be competed for at the Queen's ranges, and a certificate of the same together with the scores, shall be required from the Secretary of each affiliated Association.

12. No alterations shall be made in these Bye-Laws except at a regular meeting of the Council by a vote of a majority of the members present.

# TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

### COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

To the Members of the New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association:

The Council submit to the members of the Association the twenty-ninth annual report, and are able to state generally that the work of the Association in its several directions has met with good results.

Before referring to the details of this work, we rejoice to record that the fondest ambition of Canadian marksmanship has been realized through the winning of Her Majesty the Queen's Prize by a member of that "dignified The victory of embassy," the Canadian Bisley Team. Private Hayhurst, G. M., is an event to be proudly remembered by Colonial riflemen.

#### THE MARITIME MATCH.

Due arrangement was made for the holding of the Maritime Match at Drury Range on Thursday, June 13, and teams from the two sister Associations were gladly welcomed on their arrival. By the time the 200-yard range was finished a heavy fog had settled down, precluding all chance of firing at the longer distances. A novel expedient was then resolved upon. The riflemen hastily decamped from the range, took the first train to Sussex, and by 4 p. m. had contentedly resumed firing in bright sunshine, forty miles distant from the scene of the opening further diffic indeed, incre the honors of

Should this match continue to be shot in the month of June, it will, we think, be expedient for the Association to make Sussex the place of the New Brunswick contest.

#### MARTINI RIFLES.

The urgent need of more Martini rifles early engaged the attention of the Council. By personal interview at Ottawa, and through subsequent correspondence, this matter was pressed upon the Director of Stores, and through his kind offices one hundred rifles were forwarded to St. John for issue on the personal security of commanding officers. Prompt advantage was taken of this opportunity by some officers commanding, but unfortunately not by all; still quite an addition has been made to the supply of reliable rifles.

#### THE PRIZE LIST.

The programme containing the Prize List and Regulations was printed in the usual pamphlet form and copies distributed early in the season.

It would be well, perhaps, another year to issue the programme in the more convenient book form generally used elsewhere, and which was indeed the form in which our programme appeared as long ago as 1879.

In the value and distribution of the money prizes, the number of competitions, their ranges and number of

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shots, the programme was similar to that of 1894, but the regulations underwent some changes, and additions were made to the prizes in kind.

In accordance with the recommendation of the Competitors' meeting, formally approved by the Council, all the matches were thrown open to civilians, who thus became eligible for all prizes except the N. R. A. Medal and the cups specially restricted to the Active Militia. The change was made as an experiment, and the increase in the number of entries may fairly be claimed as the result, but as the resolution was, in terms, limited to the matches of this year, it will be for the Association to decide whether the privilege shall be continued.

The number of sighting shots at each range was reduced to one; the firing of that made compulsory, and the price included in the entrance fee of each match. Needless to say this method proved with us, as in every Association where it has been tried, satisfactory alike to the competitors and the Secretary's office.

The promise of a cup from the Mutual Reserve Fund Life Association, of New York, made necessary a change in the arrangement of first prizes. Pending the actual receipt of the prize and a fuller consideration of its ultimate place in our programme, the Executive Committee put it in what has hitherto been known as the "Provincial" Match, and named the competition after the President, the late E. B. Harper, to whose generosity the Association is indebted for the prize. The cup has lately been received in the form of a solid silver punch bowl. The conditions which have been attached to it are—that it shall remain a Challenge Prize and be restricted to Active Militia.

For the first time a grand aggregate badge appeared in the programme. A design for an embroidered arm badge submitted by the special committee was approved and placed with Hobson & Sons, London, to be worked up, subject to the approbation of Major Markham, Commandant of the Bisley Team. Three have been received for the winners respectively in 1894, 1895 and 1896.

Our gratitude to Lt.-Colonel Maunsell is by no means lessened because it has been so repeatedly awakened by his annual presentation of the Nursery prize.

#### THE ANNUAL MATCHES.

The matches opened on Tuesday, August 20. It may be mentioned, by the way, that this date was selected in the hope that a full week would then elapse between the conclusion of the meeting and the departure of our representatives to the D. R. A. matches, but as the date of the latter was subsequently altered to August 26, this hope was disappointed.

The Association has for years past enjoyed exceptionable fortune in the matter of weather. Fine weather is perhaps the first of all conditions of a successful meeting, and this condition was again present this year. On the second morning indeed, heavy thunder showers affected the comfort and the scores of some competitors, but apart from these the weather was very agreeable, and the President, with the assistance of some of the Senior Officers, was able to make presentation of the prizes early in the afternoon of the third day.

#### FINANCES.

The accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer, duly audited, are submitted herewith. The balance of \$129.86, with

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which the year commenced, has diminished to \$16.29. This decrease is, as last year, due to the purchase of medals owing County Associations.

#### MEDALS.

Practically all these arrears are now wiped out. There are on hand two medals for winners in Westmorland County, both of whom are out of the province; but apart from these all medals won have been delivered. Then we have on hand two Queen's Head medals (those which accompany the Prince of Wales Cup) yet to be competed for. A full list of medal winners in County Associations has been prepared with the view to its publication in the Annual Report.

#### OTTAWA TEAM.

In the past few years the loss of the Provincial grant has so seriously affected the strength of our Ottawa team, and the more gradual introduction among us of the Martini-Henry has so handicapped our riflemen in open contest with those of the larger provinces, that we had perhaps ceased to look for any special success under the existing circumstances. All the more welcome therefore have been the good things secured this year at Ottawa by New Brunswick riflemen. Our delegation was only nineteen in number, but one of these shot into the Bisley twenty, and two others, twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth respectively, are, we may say, equally certain of places.

Then, as a conclusion, our eight in the Provincial Match, by most brilliant scoring, gained for us another year's possession of the London Merchants' Cup. The team total of 714, or an average per man of 89\frac{1}{4}, is distinctly the highest score ever made for the cup, and thus becomes a Dominion record.

On motion of Captain Hartt, By-law 3 was amended so to read:

The regular meetings of the Council shall be held on the first Thursday in May and November, at such time and place as the President shall appoint.

No medals, however, had been received, as the then Governor General, Lord Stanley, left Canada during that current year.

It was decided that the Secretary endeavor to ascertain whether medals could be obtained, even though at the expense of the Association.

The special committee on the range, Major Arnold and Captain Kinnear, were requested to lay three or four inches of gravel on the mound of the 600-yard Extra Series, so that a test might be made whether gravel would make a suitable covering.

Mr. M. N. Cockburn at some length explained to the Council the difficulties under which the St. Andrew's Rifle Club laboured for want of Martini rifles. There was a great deal of shooting enthusiasm among the members as had been well evidenced by the attendance of ten of their number at the late Sussex matches, but the scarcity of rifles and the having to make each rifle in their possession do duty for three or four members, were very serious impediments to their shooting efficiency, and practically prevented any increase in their number.

After some remarks and explanations from the chair, the Secretary, and Captain McRobbie, it was resolved,

"That the request of the St. Andrew's riflemen for a loan of rifles be referred for action to the Executive Committee, and that it receive their favorable consideration when the shooting season of 1896 is about to open."

The Council, on motion, adjourned.
