THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT of the UNIVERSITY LYING-IN HOSPITAL, in presenting the following Report of the affairs of that Institution for the past year, have much pleasure in stating that the highly important objects for which it was originally established, namely : to afford a comfortable home for poor married and unfortunate women during their confinement ; to afford facilities for the practical study of midwifery, and thus to improve the knowledge of that science in the Dominion, have been faithfully and successfully carried out.

The number of patients admitted during the year just closed was 74. Of these, there were :

The number of Students who, during the year availed themselves of the advantages presented by the Hospital for the practical study of this important branch of their profession, was 43.

Three deaths occurred in the Hospital during the year.

Your Committee regret that they have not been able to take steps towards the erection of a suitable building for the purposes of this charity. In consequence of the prevailing financial depression, they did not feel warranted at this time in making an appeal to the public for the necessary pecuniary aid. Increased accommodation has, however, been provided for private cases.
