TO provide for the more effectually repairing the Roads and Bridges on the Island of Grand Manan, in the County of Charlotte.

WHEREAS the scattered state of the population on the Island of Grand Manan, renders the present High Way Act, all most inoperative; for remedy thereof: I do hereby enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That all persons liable to perform stipulated labour on the roads and bridges in the County of Charlotte, shall in future pay the sum of one shilling and six pence for each and every day's labour such persons are respectively liable to perform.

II.—And be it enacted, That the monies required to be paid by virtue of this Act, shall be assessed, levied and collected, in the same manner as any Parish or County rates are assessed, levied and collected; by virtue of any law now in force, or hereafter to be in force for that purpose in this Province; and such monies when collected shall be paid over to the Commissioner of Highways to be appointed for that purpose, in the same manner and by the same authority, as Commissioners of Highways are now appointed, to be by them expended by public auction in their respective districts on the Highways and Bridges in said districts.

III.—And be it enacted, That this Act shall continue and be in force until the first day of April, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.
