

THE WONDERS OF ELECTRICITY. One of the wonders of the forthcoming Chicago Exposition will be the contributions of the world to the display of electrical contrivances. The demonstration of the progress of electrical science will probably be the chief attraction to the large majority of the sightseers. To those who had the privilege of attending the Centennial Exposition of 1876 it will demonstrate, in a marked degree, the advances that have been made in the last few years. At the Centennial Exposition the central point of interest in the exhibit of mehanical contrivances was the ponderous Corlis engine, which furnished motor power for acres of machinery. There was no electrical exhibit. The telephone had not made its appearance as a practical instrument. Of the electric light nothing was heard. And as for the electric notor it has been brought into use but yes-

terday. What a transition from 1876 to 1893! What a transition from 1876 to 1893! At Chicago, we will witness a brilliant electric exhibition in one of the largest and most beautiful buildings of the exposition. According to a well-informed correspondent, the building will cover more than five acres and a half, and will afford a floor surface of packly nine corres. It is Italian Renais. nearly nine acres. It is Italian Renais-sance in style, and elaborately finished, with many towers. The principal entrance with many towers. The principal entrance on the south side will have a noble and gorgeously decorated open vestibule, covered by a half dome, the whole, it is said, being capable of the most brilliant ilsaid, being capable of the most brilliant li-lumination. Indeed, at every point where it is possible the building offers an oppor-tunity for an electrical night display. To this end something like 20,000 incandescent and nearly 3,000 are lights will be em-

ployed on or about the edifice.

At the front door those who wish to enter will open a box and press a button, which will light the lamps in the main hall, as would be done lamps in the main hall, as would be done by an occupant returning home late at night. Some of the lamps in the house will be peculiar. There will be electroliers in certain rooms; rosettes of light embedded in the ceilings and walls of other rooms; in others lamps set behind white percelain in the ceilings and wais of other rooms; in others, lamps set behind white porcelain. There will be lamps in all closets, and these will be lighted by the opening of the closet doors, and put out when the doors are shut. The mere pressure of buttens in the door frames will open each door in the building. Electric elevators will obviate the necessity for using the stairways. In all the common

nights. The house will be 42 feet wide by 50 feet deep and therefore each device All the civilized nations of the earth will contribute that which is notable in their adaptations of electricity to the use of the race, both in useful and ornamental appliances. A telephone company will employ a fine orchestra to play in New York and will conduct the sound of the music all the way to the electrical building, in which a great horn will throw out the melody for the benefit of all who care to visit the section. One electrical company will spend \$350,000 upon its exhibit. The electric street car exhibit in one section of electric street car exhibit in the building will be very fine and thorough, showing all the methods of applying electric power to the propulsion of cars. All the the currents of power in use in the building will be supplied from dynamos set up by exhibitors in the machinery hall.

We look for marvelous results from this exhibit and from the impetus which it will give to further experiments with this wonderful agency. Electrical science has made enormous strides in the last few made enormous strides in the last few years, but in its application to the wants of man it may yet be in its infancy. We can only hope so, and encourage the scientists to continue their investigations till they have the force under greater control. The tendency of the use of steam as a labor saver has been to mass the workers, and make it difficult for them to work profitably as families. With the storage battery per-fected, it may yet be possible to produce as cheaply by machinery set up in the home circle as in the huge factory.
