Meanwhile we trust and believe that whatever negotiations may occur, will be conducted in a spirit of the most perfect courtesy, and the sincerest desire to promote a peaceful adjustment. Neither the new administration nor the new minister will forget that, after all, the English are of the same blood with ourselves, and that, because they are, they must not be bullied. Mr. Summer's speech, in this and in most regards, represents the settled determination of the American people; Mr. Chandler's, only passionate prejudices, which will not control our policy. We all know that Great Britan is too proud a nation to be coerced by unworthy fears. Let us not forget that the United States is too great a nation to fall in securing justice, and too absolutely assured of her power to secure it, to be guilty of the bluster and bravado which characterize only the weak.






