CIVIL WAR IN THE STATES.
Troops Ordered Out Against the Strikers—Officers Give Dynamic Answer—Non-taxing an Army.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., June 5.—Eight miners were killed in a night attack on troops at Shiloh. There are rumors of a plot to blow up the mines.

CHICAGO, June 5.—The miners may refuse to accept the terms of settlement of the strike. They will meet this morning to decide. If they decide they must fight.

Denver, Colo., June 5.—At a conference last night between Governor Vaise, acting for the miners, and Messrs. Moffatt and Haggeman, for the operators, the great strike which has caused a reign of terror was settled. The miners will work for an eight-hour day, with 20 minutes for luncheon. The agreement also provides for a rate of \$3 per day and that the operators shall make no distinction between union and non-union men in employing miners.

SEWANEE, Ind., June 5.—Reports from Forresterburg say the militia "had" a runaway fight with the strikers during the night, killing four men.
