SIXTEENTH YEAR
FIRE and falling walls, combined with a lack of proper appliances in the way of steam fire engines, were on Sunday morning responsible for the heaviest financial losses ever sustained by the insurance companies in the history of Toronto, as well as for the loss of one fireman's life, the permanent maiming of a second, and severe injuries to four others. The fire, which originated in the basement of The Globe building, destroyed half a dozen buildings, involving a loss of \$750,000.

DEAD.
HOWARD, ROBERT, aged 24, of No. 11 Hook and Ladder Co., single, lived with his mother, brother and sister at 204 Parliament-street. He was left thigh, fracture of right arm and severe wounds on the scalp, neck, hand and feet, through falling wall. Taken to General Hospital at 4 a.m., died at 5.30.

DECEASED was testified to by the jury on April 2, 1890, and appointed as a fireman of the Hook and Ladder Co. in the year 1887. Previous to that time he was for a short period a driver of a horse-drawn carriage. He was a cheerful and obliging man, and his kindness and geniality had made him one of the most popular men in the brigade.

NOTES OF THE FIRE.

Artist Bell-Smith a Heavy Loss--The Fall of the Globe Corner.

Mr. S. F. McKinnon was on the scene before the fire had gained much headway in her husband's building.

A camera film was on hand and secured a view of the fire from various points of view.

During last night the remains were watched by sections of the fire department from each division of the brigade.

Artist Bell-Smith had some valuable pictures in his camera when the fire broke out. It is understood that the artist had insured for \$200, the value being \$200. At a number of places where the artist had an early stage, including Dr. Seward, J. S. King, Garratt, Armour, Groves, Gove, and Martin.

Medical Health Officer Sheard visited each patient in turn shortly after the accident and saw that they were receiving proper surgical aid.

Two ambulances were brought to the scene of the fire soon after the accident alarm sounded, and were stationed at the corner of King and Yonge-streets, with a patrol wagon.
