Sets on the 1st June about half an hour after sunset, and continues an Evening Star for the remainder of the year. It will be above the horizon between 2 and 4 hours after sunset from the beginning of November to the end of December.

$\text{\textcircled{M}}$  MARS—rises on the 2nd January about 3h. 45m. morning, and will be a Morning Star until the second week in September, when it souths between sunset and midnight. After that it will be an Evening Star during the rest of the year. It will be above the horizon the greater portion of each night from the beginning of August until the middle of October; it then sets about 2h. 20m. morning.

$\text{\textcircled{J}}$  JUPITER.—From the beginning of January until about the 20th June Jupiter will be a Morning Star. On the 1st January it rises at 6h. morning, and on the 20th June it rises 7h. 37m. afternoon, souths 11h. 56m. and sets June 21 at 4h. 15m. morning. After that it will be an Evening Star until the end of December. During June and July it rises in the early evening and sets between midnight and sunrise.

$\text{\textcircled{S}}$  SATURN.—Until the middle of February Saturn will be an Evening Star. It rises about an hour before the Sun in the beginning of April, and continues a Morning Star until the 9th September; it then souths before midnight, and will be an Evening Star the remainder of the year. On the 1st August it rises at 9h. 5m. afternoon, and will be above the horizon throughout each night until about the end of September.

JANUARY.—We know that even the most experienced farmers and gardeners are in the habit of consulting their CALENDAR every month in the year, for in every month there is some kind of work that can be better or more conveniently done than at other times, and neglect of which will entail loss or inconvenience. The great use of the Calendar is not to instruct but to remind. In January the weather is often unsuitable for all kinds of open air work, at least until the snow comes to make chopping comfortable. The short day light limits even the time that can be employed about the barn yard. The industrious farmer is thus shut up to his workshop or house, and can give more attention than usual to his horses and cattle. If he has fattening stock and plenty of roots, attention to them will take up a large portion of his time. During the long evenings the farm books and accounts may be put in order, the fields may be mapped out for the season's cropping, and an estimate formed of the manure and seed required. Scientific

agriculture is now rapidly taking the place of common farming, and young men who are ambitious to take places in the front rank can only do so by scientific study. If they cannot afford to take a winter at college for the acquisition of such subjects as Mathematics, Mechanics, Chemistry, Botany and Anatomy, upon which Scientific Agriculture is founded,—the best plan will be to lay out a course of reading in these subjects, which may be pursued in the winter evenings. The Clergyman or Doctor or Schoolmaster of the district will certainly know something of such subjects, and will usually be willing to give advice or a helping hand to any deserving youth. The peculiarities and distinctive properties of the different breeds of cattle may likewise be read up at this season, and the descriptions of the books compared with the thorough-bred animals which will now be found in neighbouring barns in most parts of the Province. is kept the Stock Register should be gone carefully over at this season, so as to be ready for the entry of the spring calves as they drop in. The full pedigree of the dams and sires should be entered first. A convenient form of record of the calves &c., is a foolscap book ruled in columns for the following items, so that one line will contain the history of an animal, viz:- 1, Number ; 2, Name ; 3, Sire ; 4, Dam ; 5, When calved ; 6, From whom or how obtained ; 7, How disposed of. Where difficulties occur in making up a pedigree, application may be made to the Secretary of the Board of Agriculture, who keeps a set of reference Herd Books for this purpose.

FEBRUARY.—This is the month in which cattle are most likely to begin to fall off; and when once the beginning is made, it is up-hill work to attempt to stop it. Barns may be faulty, and the cold is severely felt, the root cellar may be troublesome to get at, and the ani-

imals miss occasional meals, the wells may be frozen and the way to watering places may be so slippery that the cattle cannot reach them without discomfort or positive accident. In order to overcome these and many other difficulties that appear in February, it is a good rule to give extra time and attention to the stock. In feeding grain and meal always mix them into cut hay, otherwise they do not undergo the second mastication, but pass through the alimentary canal before a large portion of their nutritious material has been absorbed. Cattle should go out every day to water. If kept on the board floors all winter they are apt to become lame, partly from want of exercise, and partly from excessive growth of their hooves, which in spring-time will be found projecting forward like Chinese slippers.

MARCH.—The first outdoor preparation for cropping is to be made this month. Every farm should have a garden plot to furnish the family with vegetables, and summer vegetables—many of them—cannot be successfully raised without being started in an early hot bed. The instructions given on a former occasion are just as applicable this year :—This is hot bed month, and how to make a hot-bed is a secret worth knowing. Select a sheltered spot, protected from animals, lying to the sun, and near a well or water butt. Build on this space a neat pile of manure, of such a size that when the frame is put on top, there will be a clear foot of manure outside all round. Cow manure will not heat at this season. Horse manure will not heat at this season, if the animal has not been fed upon oats or some kind of grain. Keeping these facts in view you

can select your manure, or make such a mixture as will give the degree of heat required. Spread over the manure, inside the frame, about four or five inches of very fine soil; this should have been prepared in the Fall, and kept dry under cover all winter,—otherwise it is likely now to be a hard frozen mass. The glass sashes are then to be put on and kept close till the ho' bed heats; the steam and heat will start the seeds of weeds, which may be allowed to grow. Air is then given, and when the heat modifies, weed and rake the surface and sow your spring seeds,—cauliflowers, cabbages, celery, tomatoes, &c., for the kitchen garden; and stocks, verbenas, petunias, asters, balsams, and such like annuals for flower-garden ornament. The seeds will bear a good deal of heat before they emerge from the soil, but as soon as the first leaves begin to appear the frame must be aired daily, taking care to avoid cold draughts.

APRIL.—Should the season prove early, and the soil be in a condition to admit of cultivation, all those crops that do not suffer from early spring frosts and require a long season or the cool weather of spring for their successful culture, should now be put in. For such crops the soil has of course been prepared and probably manured during the previous fall. The crops that especially require early sowing are peas, broadbeans, parsnips, onions, carrots. Towards the close of the month, the fields generally may be in a condition for working. Field peas, horse beans, tares, oats, and wheat should be put in as early as possible.

Wherever the land is dry potatoes cannot be put in too soon. We have seen splendid crops of potatoes raised where they were planted so early that heavy snowstorms intervened before they came above ground. The gardens should be gone over, and all small fruits, such as currants, gooseberries, strawberries, raspberries &c., carefully dressed. If manured the previous fall so much the better. All unfrozen manure should be carted out upon the fields whilst there is still a crust of frozen soil to support the wheels.

**MAY.**—We believe that early sowing and planting is the great secret of successful farming in Nova Scotia, and it is only possible to the active and energetic man. The farmer should be so busy this month, taking advantage of every fit day, as to feel that he has scarcely time to look into the Almanac. Still let him not forget to do so. We consult his convenience by merely jotting down brief memoranda:—Plough every day that ploughing can be done; take out manure as expeditiously as possible; sow or plant everything that has not been already sown or planted in field or garden, with the following exceptions,—corn, tomatoes, bush and pole beans, cucumbers, squashes, turnips, cabbages, all of which require to be put into ground already warm. One great difficulty we have had to contend with is want of

manure. But now we may supplement our barn yard product by superphosphate or by ground bones, which are supplied at the bone mill at Wellington Tannery, Graft apple trees, &c., finish top-dressing of grass, put fences in order, plant fruit and ornamental trees, clean out cellars. After planting is done, whitewash with lime all the buildings, especially the interior of stables and cow houses. The lime withdraws carbonic oxide, a poisonous gas, given off from the lungs of animals, and thus preserves the purity of the surrounding atmosphere. If the "breaking up" of spring time has left a few holes or runs in the road in front of your farm, it may be profitable policy to fill them up, and not wait for the statute labour or road commission man, who will not probably come until you have broken some wheels and shaken your own nerves and those of your family to a greater extent than a day's work.

JUNE.—The drill crops put in during April and May will now require attention, first in the way of hand hoeing, where this has to be done, and secondly by the use of the horse hoe or cultivator. But there are still some crops to be planted or sown. Put out cabbages and cauliflowers, but only in light soil that has been well worked and well enriched. The *Haltica*, or turnip flea, is the great enemy of the cabbage; all efforts at his destruction have failed, and the only effective way of waging war with him is to treat him generously by sowing, between the cabbage rows, common white mustard, the young seedling plants of which are

far more palatable than cabbage. Tomatoes also may be set out later in the month. Ground cherries do best when they come up from seed in the soil, which they will do for years. Finish planting everything now in field and garden, such as Indian corn, bush and pole beans, cucumbers, squashes, turnips. Tender plants may now be put out in the flower beds. Do not touch strawberry plants by weeding or hoeing, and do not now hoe around raspberry canes, otherwise the fruit will not form. Celery may be planted out at the end of the month.

JULY.—Turnip sowing may still be done. Some prefer to sow their Swedes this month, and the soft Turnips need not be sown till the end of July. The ground should have undergone a thorough pulverization. Light sandy soil is the best for turnips. They start best after the ground is warm, but the bulbs swell most rapidly during the cool dewy nights of Autumn. The soil cannot be worked too deep or made too fine for turnips. Town manures are valued for this crop; and crushed bones have been applied with the best effects, either when covered in the drills in the manner of ordinary dung, or when sown by machine along with the

seeds, so as to be in immediate contact with the latter. Guano has been largely used of late years. Superphosphate is very efficacious. One point of turnip culture that is often neglected in Nova Scotia, although well understood elsewhere is that the seed should be put in the moment the soil is prepared. If the earth of the prepared drills gets dried up in the sun before the seed is committed to it how can the latter be expected to germinate. Hoeing and weeding of all drill crops should be carried on actively this month and completed before haying time. Get your haying apparatus and implements in order. Get the kitchen and flower gardens in good order before haying begins, as there will be "no time" then.

AUGUST.—Haying is the chief operation during the early part of this month, and everything else is usually sacrificed to it. This is necessarily the case where hay is the principal or only important crop, as on many of our farms. What is required is a mixed husbandry, so that cattle may not be fed on hay all winter and pastured in summer, but fed in winter on straw and roots and coarse grain, and in summer partially or wholly on green fodder in doors. This is the only way to enrich a farm, or to attain to anything like high farming. We then

recommend our readers to note at this season how convenient it is to have a field of tares or green oats or barley or Indian corn or rape, or any other green eatable thing for the cattle to grow or fatten upon when the pastures are all burnt up. After haying there will be work in the garden and especially in the orchard. Look after the ripening fruit, destroy caterpillars, if any still remain; pick the early August apples, and send them into market. When the rains come beds of strawberries may be made up. See that the ground is well drained and enriched with old manure. Mushrooms now appear in the horse pastures.




material, when grain is being cleaned and roots taken up. Sheep should be dipped or washed with some suitable sheep dip, if there is any appearance of ticks, as the eggs hatch out in winter time and the young ticks are very troublesome to the sheep, causing loss not only of wool but of condition and health. It is a good plan to wash or smear twice a year, in Spring when the wool is taken off and in Fall when the eggs are being laid in the wool. Sheep to be healthy and profitable should be free from ticks.





OCTOBER.—Where roots are cultivated (and they ought to be on every farm to a much larger extent than they are at the present time in Nova Scotia), the farmer's chief work this month will be in taking up his root crops. We have said nothing about grain, because every farmer is likely to look after that, and harvest it carefully. But in regard to root crops there is a good deal of misconception. To take up and store roots successfully is a simple art when properly understood, but the frequent destruction of roots in the cellar shows that it is not always understood or carried out. Potatoes should be dug in dry weather, and allowed to dry completely on the surface before being put

together in heaps or in the cellar; the best way is to put them on a barn floor and exclude the light, otherwise they will become green and acquire a bitter taste and poisonous qualities. Mangels, turnips and carrots should be topped and the fine root fibres cut off. Before storing they should, in like manner, be exposed to dry air that the wounds may heal over; if put at once into the cellar, the wounded tissue will begin to ferment, and a large portion of the roots will be rotted by contact. If facts such as these are kept clearly in view, no farmer need lose his roots. Of course the cellar must be kept well aired and dry, and frost carefully excluded.

NOVEMBER.—Agricultural societies are apt to forget that their arrangements for the following season, in regard to animals, are most profitably made at this time of year. Every society keeps, or ought to keep, a sufficient number of male animals for the use of members. If the selection and purchase of these be deferred till spring time, large prices have to be paid, and the demand is usually so great that suitable animals cannot be obtained. For beef cattle the Short Horn Durham breed is the best; their growth is more rapid than that of any other kind. For milk alone, Ayrshires are to be preferred, Devons make the best working oxen, they are quick, active, and easily fed. For domestic cows in the city the creamy Alderneys or Jerseys are most suitable. In King's County there are several breeders of pure Short Horns, such as Messrs Eaton, Margeson, Bowser, Chase,

DECEMBER.—There are now seventy Agricultural Societies in this Province, with a Membership of nearly five thousand. These societies are organized under the Central Board of Agriculture, and each Society is entitled to draw from the provincial Treasury (through the Board) an annual grant in aid to promote its operations. The special purpose of a society is to improve the live stock of its district, which is accomplished by obtaining and keeping for the use of Members superior male animals, such as bulls, rams and boars. Societies may also introduce seeds of new varieties of grain, roots, and also improved implements not previously used in the district. ## DEPARTMENT OF LAW AND JUSTICE.

## SUPREME COURT OF CANADA.

*Chief Justice*—Hon William Buell Richards.*Judges*—Hon William Johnston Ritchie, Hon Samuel Henry Strong, Hon Jean Thomas Taschereau, Hon Telesphore Fournier, Hon William A. Henry.*Registrar and Reporter*—Robert Cassels, Jr.

This Court and the Exchequer Court were organized under the provisions of 38 Vict. cap. 11.

The Supreme Court has both original and appellate jurisdiction—*Original*, as to (1) habeas corpus in criminal and extradition cases; (2) judicial opinions to the Crown; (3) private bills and petitions therefor referred by the Senate or House of Commons; and (4) civil suits in which the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. *Appellate*, in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

## THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court has original jurisdiction (1) in revenue cases, (2) in civil suits when the Crown for the Dominion is plaintiff, (3) controversies between the Dominion and a Province, or between two Provinces.

The Judges and officers are the same as in the Supreme Court.

**Letter Carriers' Delivery.**

The Delivery of Letters by Carriers is as follows: in the business portions of the city, and as far South as Inglis and North as Gerrish, *Three* deliveries daily, Sundays excepted, commencing at 8 a.m., 12 noon, and 4 p.m.; in the Northern and Southern portions of the city, beyond Gerrish (North) and Inglis (South), *Two* deliveries daily, Sundays excepted, commencing at 8 a.m., and 4 p.m.; and in the Northern, Southern, and Western Suburbs, and Richmond, *One* delivery daily, Sundays excepted, commencing at 8 a.m.

Letters for these deliveries will be received at the General Office up to within 15 minutes of the commencement of each delivery.

Letters and Papers should be addressed to Street and Number at which to be delivered.

Change of Residence should be promptly notified to the Postmaster in writing.

The public are requested to adopt the house door letter-boxes, the use of which will result in greatly increased rapidity in the delivery of letters.

No person need call at the office for letters, for all may have mail matter left at their residences regularly, without risk or charge.

**Notice to Box Holders.**

An order to have letters placed in a box belonging to another person cannot be recognized, unless such letters are addressed to the box or to the care of its holder.

Letters for a private member of a firm should be addressed to the care of the firm or number of the box.

A letter addressed to a particular street will be taken out by the Letter Carrier, whether the person to whom it is addressed has a box or otherwise.

Box holders should be careful to authorize only a limited number of persons to receive their letters, and only those in whom they have full confidence.

**Credit for Postage, &c.**

The clerks in this Office are forbidden to give credit for postage, and the holders of boxes and others are requested not to ask them to violate their instructions.

The regulations of the service require that the exact amount of postage shall be tendered to the Clerk at the window in current coin if necessary. Change will, however, be given for public accommodation, whenever practicable.

To West Indies, and British Guiana, via Halifax, 12 cents per half oz. each, which must be prepaid.

To the United States, 3 cents per half oz. each, which must be prepaid.

To the United Kingdom, via Halifax, or by Canadian Packet from Quebec or Portland, or by Packet via N. York, 5 cts. per half oz. each.

To St. Pierre et Miquelon, same rates as within the Dominion: correspondence being subject to a local tax on delivery.

## NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada may be sent by Post from the Office of publication at the rate of 1 cent per lb., to regular subscribers in Canada, Newfoundland, St. Pierre et Miquelon, the United Kingdom or the United States.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to places in Canada and United States, St. Pierre et Miquelon and Newfoundland, will be sent at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp. Newspapers and Periodicals weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly, prepaid by postage stamp, one half ct. each.

Newspapers addressed to places in the United Kingdom, Bermuda, West Indies and British Guiana, must be prepaid by postage stamp, two cents each.

## MISCELLANEOUS MAIL MATTER.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals, Circulars and Prices Current, Books, Pamphlets, and occasional Publications, Books and Newspaper Manuscript, Circulars, Prices Current, Hand Bills, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Music, Packages of Seeds, Cuttings, Roots, Scions, Grafts, Botanical Specimens, etc.

To any place in Canada, Newfoundland, the United States, or St. Pierre et Miquelon, 1 cent per 4 oz. each packet Books, Circulars, Music, etc., must be put up open at both ends.

## BOOK POST.

To Bermuda, West Indies, or British Guiana, via Halifax, 6 cents per 4 oz each packet.

To the United Kingdom, via Halifax, Quebec, or Portland, if not exceeding one oz. 2 cents, over one oz. and not exceeding two oz. 4 cents, exceeding 2 oz. 6 cents per 4 oz. each packet.

To the United Kingdom, via the United States, the above rates with the addition of 2 cents per 4 oz.

Prepayment of Matter of the above description is in all cases compulsory.

## PATTERNS OR SAMPLES OF MERCHANTISE.

Can be forwarded at Book rate to any address in Canada, Newfoundland, St. Pierre et Miquelon, the United Kingdom, and certain British Colonies and Foreign countries, via England. Samples can be forwarded to the United States, but the weight must not exceed 8 oz., the postage on which is 10 cts.; they must also be genuine samples having no value.

## PARCELS.

To any place within the Dominion 12½ cents per half pound, which must be prepaid. Parcels must not exceed 4 lbs in weight.

## Postage Stamps.

The stamps issued by the Canadian Post Office Department, are of the following denominations, viz., ½ c., 1 c., 2 c., 3 c., 6 c., 12½ c., 10c. and 15 c., stamps.

## Post Cards and Post Bands.

Are issued at one cent each, and may be sent to any address in Canada, Newfoundland, St. Pierre et Miquelon or United States. Post Bands are for sale in cities at the rate of \$1.25 per hundred.

**LIGHT HOUSES***On the Coasts of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.***WEST FROM HALIFAX.**

**CHERUBCTO HEAD**—On the Head. A revolving light, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 30' 21''$  N. Long.  $63^{\circ} 30' 49''$  W.

**AN IRON BELL BUOY**, painted black and surmounted by a cage, has been moored south-east by south, one quarter of a mile from the Blind Sisters, off Sambro, to the westward of the entrance to Halifax Harbor.

**SAMBRO ISLAND**—On the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax Harbor. A fixed white light, elevated 115 ft. above the sea, visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 26' 11''$  N. Lon.  $63^{\circ} 33' 30''$  W. In thick or foggy weather, signal guns from ships will be answered from the signal station by firing two guns in quick succession, and the same reply will be made from the island to the sound of a steamer's whistle. A Steam Fog Whistle is being erected.

**BETTY'S ISLAND**.—On South Point revolving red light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every two minutes. Elevated 75 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of 14 miles from all points of approach. The tower is a square wooden building, painted white, with two horizontal red bands, and has keeper's dwelling attached. Lat.  $41^{\circ} 26' 22''$  N. Long.  $63^{\circ} 45' 54''$  W.

**PEGGY'S POINT**—East point of entrance to St. Margaret's Bay. A fixed red light, about 65 feet above high water. Square white Building standing about 40 yards from the shore. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 29' 30''$  N. Lon.  $63^{\circ} 55' 0''$  W.

**CHESTER LIGHT ON IRON BOUND ISLAND**.—Entrance to Mahone Bay. One fixed white light, visible from all points of approach. The Lantern alone is visible: Building hidden by trees. Elevated 50 feet above high water. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 26' 20''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 41' 45''$  W.

**MARGARET'S BAY**—On the south point of Green Island, Margaret's Bay. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 22' 45''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 2' 45''$  W. The light is a revolving red and white light, showing alternate red and white flashes every minute and a half, and making a complete revolution every three minutes. The light is 69 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather will be seen at a distance of 15 miles.

**MAHONE BAY**—On Hobson's Nose Island, A fixed red light. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

**CROSS ISLAND**—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. Two lights placed vertically 41 feet apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute, visible 14 miles. Building red, Lat.  $44^{\circ} 18' 43''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 9' 57''$  W.

**BATTERY POINT**—East side of entrance to Lunenburg Harbor. A fixed white light, visible 12 miles. White square building. This harbor is easy of access, buoys are placed in the bay and entrance to the harbor on the Sculpin Rock, Haddock Shoal, Battery Point Shoal, and Head Shoal. In approaching the harbor from seaward the Buoy on Sculpin Rock, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, may be left on either hand, giving it a berth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in. Iron can buoys in summer, spar buoys in winter.

**IRON-BOUND ISLAND**.—Entrance to LaHave River. A bright flash light, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The Lantern is

on a square white tower, on the southern side of the island, 70 feet above sea level, visible from all points of approach. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 13' 45''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 16' 19''$  W.

**MOSER'S ISLAND**—West side of the entrance to LaHave River. A fixed red light, on the S. E. point of the island. Square white building, 58 feet above sea level, standing 100 feet from the cliff. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 14' 15''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 18' 50''$  W.

**PORT MEDWAY HARBOR**—On Admiralty Head, West side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, and a black square in the centre of the seaward sides. A fixed white light, 44 ft. above sea level, visible 10 miles. Spr. buoys are placed in the channel to Port Medway Harbor, on the breaking ledges, Nautilus Rock, corner ground and edge of flats off Bang's Point. In passing in from seaward the red buoys must be left on the starboard, and the black buoys on the port hand.

**LIVERPOOL**.—South end of Coffin's Island. A revolving white light appearing full at intervals of two minutes. 80 ft. above sea level. Building octagonal, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

**PORT POINT**—Entrance to the inner Harbor of Liverpool. A red fixed light, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the port hand when entering the harbor.

**HERRING COVE**—On east side of Liverpool Bay, green light on the breakwater.

**PORT MOUTON HARBOR**—On North-east point Spectacle Island. A fixed red light.

**LITTLE HOPE ISLAND**—Off Liverpool. A revolving red light 40 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. Situate nearly in the centre of the island. Lat  $43^{\circ} 48' 43''$  N. Long  $64^{\circ} 47' 15''$  W. The Lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

**PORT LEHERNERT, QUEEN'S COUNTY**—On Shingle Beach, East side of the harbour. Fixed red light.

**GULL ROCK**—Off the entrance to Ragged Island Harbor. A white fixed light, 51 feet above sea level. Square white building. Lat  $43^{\circ} 39'$  N. Long  $65^{\circ} 5' 50''$  W.

**CARTER'S ISLAND, RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR**—On the middle of the Island. Fixed red light. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

**SHELBOURNE HARBOR**—On Sand Point,  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile S E of the Point. Fixed red light.

**SHELBOURNE**—On the S E point of McNutt's Island, west side of entrance to the harbor. Two white lights vertical—the upper light 100 ft above sea level, and visible 18 miles; the lower light 38 ft below the Lantern at the top of the building, and visible 10 miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat  $43^{\circ} 37' 17''$  N. Lon  $65^{\circ} 15' 45''$  W.

**NEGRO ISLAND**—On North part, south of Budget Rocks, A revolving red and white light, showing alternately red and white flashes every minute. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

**BARRINGTON**—On Baccaro Point, E side of the entrance to the harbor. A red fixed light. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

**BRAZIL ROCK, SOUTH SIDE**--Bell buoy painted red and black, in horizontal bands, surmounted by a cage.

**LIGHT VESSEL**—A light vessel has been placed at Barrington East Bay, in the County of Shelburne. Lat  $43^{\circ} 31' 5''$  N Long  $65^{\circ} 34' 25''$  W. The vessel is a-hooper rigged, and the hull and spars are painted red, with the word "Barrington" in white letters on both sides. The vessel is moored in six fathoms at low water; Wesses' Ledge bearing S W by W  $\frac{1}{2}$  W distant 3-8 of a mile; Baccaro Lighthouse bearing S S E  $\frac{1}{2}$  E distant 6-3-16 miles; and Bantam Rocks bearing S by E  $7\frac{1}{2}$  E distant  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles. The light is a fixed white light, exhibited at an elevation of 30 feet above the deck. The light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into Barrington East Bay and through Barrington Passage.

**CAPE SABLE ISLAND**—On South point. A revolving light, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 40 feet, visible 12 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat  $43^{\circ} 27'$  N. Long  $65^{\circ} 36'$  W. High water a Cape Sable, full and change, at  $7\frac{1}{2}$  o'clock. Spring tides rise 12 ft, neaps 6 ft.

**BON PORTAGE, OR SHAG HARBOR ISLAND**—On South Point. A revolving red light, showing a flash every minute.

**SEAL ISLAND**—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S point of Seal Island. A fixed white light, 80 feet above high water, and may be seen when approaching, from all points of the compass, at a distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. The Blond Rock lies about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles S. by W. from the light house. Between this rock and the island there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them. A Fog Whistle is in operation at Seal Island, near the light house—the whistle sounds in each minute as follows: A blast of five seconds, then an interval of five seconds, then a blast of five seconds and an interval of 45 seconds, to complete the minute. Lat  $43^{\circ} 23' 34''$  N. Long  $66^{\circ} 0' 22''$  W.

**PUBNICO HARBOUR**—On point of beach, S E side of the entrance to the harbor, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. A fixed white light, 28 ft above high water, (rise and fall 12 feet.) Square white building, standing 50 fathoms from low water mark. Spar buoys mark the channel. Black left on port hand, red on starboard in approaching the harbor.

**ARGYLE**—A fixed red catoptric light, 115 feet above the level of high water has been erected on the south point of White Head Island, Yarmouth County, for the purpose of guiding vessels into Argyle Harbor, Lat  $43^{\circ} 39' 40''$  N. Long  $65^{\circ} 52' 4''$  W.

**FISH ISLAND**—On Big Fish Island, E side of the entrance to Tusket River. Two fixed horizontal white lights, visible 12 miles.

**YARMOUTH**—On the Eastern island of Cape Fourchu, West side of the entrance to the harbor. A bright revolving light, 145 ft above sea level, visible quarter minute and invisible half a minute. Seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Lat  $43^{\circ} 48'$  N. Long  $66^{\circ} 09'$  W. Steam Fog Whistle near light house, a blast of 10 seconds in each minute, in operation in all thick weather.

**YARMOUTH HARBOUR**—A fixed red catoptric light, 27 feet above high water, has been erected on the end of the Reef on the South West point of Bunker's Island, East side of entrance to Yarmouth Harbor. Lat  $43^{\circ} 48' 30''$  N. Long  $66^{\circ} 8' 45''$  W.

**AN IRON BELL BUOY**, painted red, has been moored on the west side of Trinity Ledge, off Cape St Mary.

**CAPE ST MARY'S**—East side of entrance to St Mary's Bay, Digby Co. A revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and showing alternately red and white faces, 100 ft above high water. White octagonal building. Lat  $44^{\circ} 04'$  N. Long  $66^{\circ} 08'$  W.

METEGHAN RIVER—Fixed green light on end of breakwater. Must be left on starboard hand, and pass close aboard on entering the river. Lat 44° 13' 43" N. Long 66° 8' 12" W.

CHURCH POINT—A fixed red light, has been erected on Church Point, East side of St Mary's Bay, Digby County. Lat 41° 19' 55" N. Long 66° 7' 35" W.

WEYMOUTH—On the Beach, South side of the entrance to the harbor. A fixed white light.

BRIER ISLAND—Situate on the Western side. A fixed white light, 92 ft above sea level, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building. A Steam Fog Whistle on Whipple's Point, 8 W of light, in operation in all thick weather.

WESTPORT—On Peter's Island, S entrance of Grand Passage, two fixed lights, placed horizontally, visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Square white building.

BELL BUOY, painted red, has been placed on north side north-west ledge, Bay of Fundy.

BOAR'S HEAD—N entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. Alternate flashes, red and white, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.

DIGBY GUT—On Prim Point, at the entrance of the Gut. A fixed white light, 76 ft above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted white, with vertical red stripes. A Steam Fog Whistle, near the light house, sounded in all thick weather, 8 seconds in each minute, making an interval of 52 seconds between each blast.

PORT WILLIAMS—Two fixed white lights, 20 feet apart, perpendicularly, visible from all points of approach. Square white building. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E 25 miles; and from Black Rock W 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE—A red fixed light, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.

BLACK ROCK—A white fixed light, 55 ft above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—On Hetty Point, N side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. One fixed light, 40 feet above high water visible 10 miles. Square white building.

A STEAM FOG WHISTLE has been erected at Cape D'or, Cumberland County.

PARRBORO'—On the W side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. A fixed white lig. t, 80 ft above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

BURN'T COAT HEAD—The Lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. A white fixed light, 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

SPENCER'S POINT—A white fixed light is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the Northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

WALTON HARBOR—A fixed red catoptric light on the north side of the entrance to Walton Harbor, Basin of Minas, Hants County. Lat 45° 14' 0" N. Long 64° 0' 45" W.

**HORTON BLUFF**—A white fixed light, 95 ft above high water level, (rise and fall 40 to 45 ft) visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomidon) and above the Five Islands and up to Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.

#### EAST FROM HALIFAX.

**GEORGE'S ISLAND, HALIFAX HARBOR**—On west side of island, shewing two white lights, vertical. They show seaward on the south, and into the harbor on the north side. On the west the upper light only can be seen.

**MEAGHER'S BEACH**—East side of Halifax Harbor. A fixed white light, elevated 58 ft above sea level, and visible 10 miles. A fog whistle has been erected on the west side of tower.

**DEVIL'S ISLAND**—On the S W point of Devil's Island, Lat  $44^{\circ} 34' 48''$  N. Lon  $63^{\circ} 27' 15''$  W on the S W point Eastern side of entrance to Halifax Harbor. A fixed red light, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights, elevated 45 feet: visible 8 miles. Octagonal dark brown tower, with a white belt between the balcony and lantern, to distinguish it in day time. A life-boat is kept at this station for use when required.

**EGG ISLAND**—Off Jeddore. A revolving light, 80 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately red and white faces. Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat  $44^{\circ} 39' 51''$  N. Long  $62^{\circ} 51' 32''$  W. Visible 14 miles.

**OUTER BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND**—On South East part of the Island. A revolving white flash light, 70 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island some distance. Lat  $41^{\circ} 49'$  N. Long  $62^{\circ} 21'$  W.

**LISCOMB HARBOR**—Revolving Light on Liscomb Island, 450 feet E S E from West end of Cranberry Point on the West side of Liscomb Island, East side of the entrance to Liscomb Harbor. The light is a revolving red and white light, showing alternate red and white flashes, every two minutes: elevated 64 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white; roof of dwelling painted red. Lat  $44^{\circ} 50' 20''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 57' 51''$  W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels in the harbor.

**ISAAC'S HARBOR**—On Holly Point West side of the entrance to the harbor. Fixed red light.

**COUNTRY HARBOR**—On South Point of Green Island. Fixed white light. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white. Lat  $45^{\circ} 5' 18''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 32' 31''$  W.

**TOR BAY LIGHT ON BERRY HEAD**—Fixed red light to seaward, and white to northward into the bay and towards Molasses Harbor. Tower square wooden building, 36 ft high, with dwelling attached, painted white with vertical stripes. Top of lantern painted black. Lat  $46^{\circ} 11' 37''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 18' 35''$  W.

**WHITE HEAD ISLAND**—On the S W point of the island. A bright flash light of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds, displaying

alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Square white tower, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, 55 feet above the sea level. Lat  $45^{\circ} 11' 58''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 08' 02''$  W. Visible 11 miles.

**CRANBERRY ISLAND**—(Cape Canso.) Two white fixed lights, placed vertically 12 yards apart; the upper 75 ft, and lower 45 ft, above high water, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat  $45^{\circ} 19' 49''$  N. Long  $60^{\circ} 55' 29''$  W. A steam fog whistle has been established on Cranberry Island. In all thick weather, the whistle will be sounded eight seconds in each minute, thus making an interval of fifty-two seconds between each blast. The whistle will probably be heard, in calm weather, about 15 miles; with the wind about 20 miles; in stormy weather and against the wind, 5 to 8 miles.

**CANSO HARBOR**—The light is a fixed red light, on North East part of Hart's Island, elevated 42 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white. Lat  $45^{\circ} 21' 0''$  N. Long  $60^{\circ} 58' 31''$  W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into Canso Harbor, and through Canso both North and South.

**BELL BUOY**—At the Grimes Rock off Cape Canso.

**GREEN ISLAND**—Near the S E end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichat. A revolving red light, elevated 70 feet above high water. Lat  $45^{\circ} 28' 51''$  N. Long  $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$  W. (Changed 15th Oct., 1875, to a red revolving light.) The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Visible 14 miles.

**ARICHAT**—On Marachie Point, S side of the entrance to the harbor. A white fixed light, 34 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Square white building. Lat  $45^{\circ} 29' 02''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 01' 52''$  W.

**ARICHAT HARBOR**—The light is a fixed red light on the North end of Jerseyman's Island, elevated 39 feet above the level of high water, and in fine weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 ft high, painted white. Lat  $45^{\circ} 30' 20''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 3' 4''$  W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels through Crid Passage in and out of Arichat Harbor.

**RANGE BEACON** has been erected on the southeast point of Jerseyman's Island, painted white, to mark the Hantfoun Shoal off the entrance to Arichat Harbor. When the Beacon and Spire of the Roman Catholic Chapel in Arichat are in range it leads over the west part of the Shoal in 10 feet of water. Vessels bound into Arichat, C B, should pass to the west of the Shoal and bring the Beacon in range of the Cupola on the Convent which stands 130 yards east of the R C Church which will lead in clear of the Shoal. Only those well acquainted should pass to the eastward of the Shoal, or bring the beacon to bear to the N or N E. An IRON CAN Buoy painted red has been placed about one Cable's length S W of the Shoal in six fathoms of water. The buoy will be placed on or about the 1st of May in each year and taken up about the 10th December.

**CHEBUCTO'S HEAD**—On the north extremity of the Head, West Arichat, C B, a white revolving light, showing a flash every 40 seconds. The light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into Little or West Arichat. One can and two spar buoys have been placed to mark the dangers when entering the harbor.

**GUYBOROUGH HARBOR**—On the W side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chebucto Bay. A fixed white light, 30 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Lat  $45^{\circ} 21' 47''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$  W.

**EDDY, OR SAND POINT**—(Gut of Canso.) On the W side of the S entrance to the Strait of Canso. Lat  $45^{\circ} 31' 30''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 14' 40''$  W. Two horizontal fixed white lights, 24 ft apart, elevated 25 ft each, visible eight miles. Square white building, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

**POINT TUPPER**—On Stapleton's Point, South side of Ship Harbor, Gut of Canso. Fixed red light. Lat  $45^{\circ} 36' 40''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 22' 0''$  W.

**NORTH CANSO—WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSO, NORTHERN ENTRANCE**—A white fixed light, 110 ft above high water, visible 18 miles, or between Cape George and Port Hood. White tower standing 120 yards from the shore. Lat  $45^{\circ} 41' 42''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 27' 10''$  W.

**POMKRT ISLAND**—St George's Bay, Antigonish Co. Standing on the N side, 50 yards from the E end of the island. A fixed red light. Square white building, 50 ft above high water. Lat  $45^{\circ} 37' 40''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 44' 30''$  W.

**CAPE ST. GEORGE**—On the N side of the Cape. A revolving white light every half minute, visible 25 miles. 350 ft above high water. Square white tower. Lat  $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 53' 40''$  W.

**PICTOU ISLAND**—On the S E part of the island. A white fixed light, 52 ft above sea level, visible 11 miles. Square white building, Lat  $45^{\circ} 49' 10''$  N. Long  $62^{\circ} 50' 29''$  W.

**PICTOU HARBOR**—On the S side of the entrance to the harbor. A white fixed light, 95 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. A small red light is shown below the lantern. Building octagonal, in red and white vertical stripes. Lat  $45^{\circ} 41' 25''$  N. Long  $62^{\circ} 39' 26''$  W.

**BIG CARIBOU ISLAND**—On the N E end of the island. A white revolving light, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute. Square white building, standing 130 ft from the point, and about 35 ft above high water. Lat  $46^{\circ} 44'$  N. Long  $62^{\circ} 42'$  W. Visible 10 miles.

**AMET ISLAND**—Off Tatamagouche Harbor. A fixed white light. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white, 44 feet above high water mark. Building square, painted white. Light visible 10 miles. Lat  $45^{\circ} 50' 15''$  N. Long  $63^{\circ} 10' 10''$  W.

**MULLIN'S POINT**—North side of entrance to Wallace Harbor, a fixed white light. The tower is a square wooden building, painted white, in Lat  $45^{\circ} 49' 45''$  N. Long  $63^{\circ} 25' 16''$  W. Cask buoys are placed to mark the dangers on entering the harbor, black to be left on port, and red on starboard when entering.

**PUGWASH HARBOR**—A fixed light on Seaman's or Fishing Point, on the east side of the entrance to Pugwash Harbor. The light is a fixed light, showing red seaward, and white towards the harbor, is elevated 48 feet above high water, and in clear weather can be seen from a distance of 8 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building 44 feet high, painted white. Lat  $45^{\circ} 52' 30''$  N. Long  $63^{\circ} 40' 30''$  W. Black buoys to be left on port hand, and red on starboard when entering the harbor.

**PORT HOOD**—A fixed light, shows red on the N side, and white to the southward, elevated 54 feet, and visible 10 miles. Square white tower. Lat  $46^{\circ}$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 31' 40''$  W.

**IRON CAN Buoys** have been placed at the following Shoals, Port Hood Harbor, C B. Portsmouth Point, Spithead, Smith Spit, Dean Shoal, also one at Judique Shoal. Judique Shoal and Dean Shoal Buoy are painted red, the other three are painted black. These Buoys will be placed on or about the 1st of May in each year and taken up about the 10th of November.

**MARGARET, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND**—On the N W side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp Harbors, and distant 2½ miles from the main land. A white fixed light, near the centre and summit of the island, elevated 298 feet, visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building Lat  $46^{\circ} 21' 30''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 15' 33''$  W. To vessels in dangerous proximity to the Island the Light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs on the side of the Island.

**CHETICAMP**—The light is a revolving white light on S W end of Cheticamp Island, revolution every one and a half minutes, and a flash every 45 seconds, elevated about 149 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building about 24 feet high, painted white, with a black ball seven feet in diameter on seaward side to distinguish it in day time from Sea Wolf Island light. Lat  $46^{\circ} 36' 32''$  N. Long  $61^{\circ} 3' 0''$  W. This light is for a coast light, and for the purpose of guiding vessels into the harbor south of west end of Cheticamp Island.

**ST PAUL'S ISLAND**—On the S point of the island, Lat  $47^{\circ} 11' 20''$  Long  $60^{\circ} 9' 38''$ , is an octagonal light house, exhibiting a revolving white light every minute, elevated 140 ft, visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S S E southward to W. On a rock, 26 feet from the end of the island, in Lat  $47^{\circ} 13' 50''$ . Long  $60^{\circ} 8' 20''$ , is another similar building of the same height, on the N E end of the island, showing a white fixed light, visible 20 miles, between N by E  $\frac{1}{2}$  E northward to E N E. A gun is fired every 4 hours at the Humane Station, when the whistle is not in operation. A Steam Fog Whistle in operation during all thick weather.

**CAPR NORTH**—On Money Point North-East end of Cape Breton Island, revolving, showing alternately red and white every 45 seconds. Building square, painted white, in Lat  $47^{\circ} 2' 10''$  N. Long  $60^{\circ} 23' 30''$  W.

**INGONISH ISLAND**—A fixed white light is exhibited at an elevation of 237 feet above high water, and in clear weather can be seen at a distance of 15 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 40 feet high, and painted white. Lat  $48^{\circ} 41' 20''$  N. Long  $60^{\circ} 20' W$ .

**OUTER BIRD ISLAND**—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or, and St. Ann's, E. Coast of Cape Breton. Octagonal white building, red revolving, changed 1st July, 1875. Lat.  $46^{\circ} 23' 10''$  N. Long.  $62^{\circ} 22' 30''$  W.

**ST. ANN'S HARBOR**—On Point of Beach north side of the entrance to the harbour, a fixed white light is exhibited at an elevation of 24 feet above high water, and can be seen at a distance of 8 miles. The light house is about 30 feet high, and painted white. Lat.  $46^{\circ} 17' 30''$  N. Long.  $60^{\circ} 32' 15''$  W. This light is exhibited to guide vessels through the Narrows to the Harbor, which cannot be distinguished in dark nights.

**BLACK ROCK POINT**—S. side of entrance to Big Bras d'Or, C. B. Fixed white light. Square white building, about 45 feet above high water, standing 100 feet from the point. Lat.  $46^{\circ} 19' N.$ , Long.  $60^{\circ} 24' W$ .

**MCKENZIE POINT**—A fixed Light on Point, north side of Bras d'Or Lake, about 2 miles south west of Port Bevis, Victoria County, Lat.  $46^{\circ} 7' 18''$  N. Long.  $60^{\circ} 39' 0''$  W. The light is a fixed white light elevated 96 feet above the level of high water and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of 11 miles. The Tower is a square wooden building painted white. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric. The light is for the purpose of guiding vessels through the Bras d'Or.

**KIDSTON'S ISLAND**—On N E point of Island, entrance to Baddeck, Bras d'Or Lake, fixed red light, tower square wooden building painted white.

**GRAND NARROWS LIGHT**, Barra Straits, Victoria County, Bras d'Or, C. B., on Unineko Point, north side of Channel, Lat.  $45^{\circ} 47' 58''$  N. Long.  $60^{\circ} 48' 0''$  W. The light is a fixed white light elevated 29 feet above the level of high water and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of 10 miles. The tower is a square wooden building 20 feet high painted white. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric. The light is for the purpose of guiding vessels through Barra Straits, and navigating the Little and Great Bras d'Or Lakes.

**CAPE GEORGE**—Fixed white light on the Cape, South side of the Bras d'Or Lake, West side of North entrance to St. Peter's Canal, Cape Breton.

**POINT ACONE**—On High Cape North side of the entrance to Little Bras d'Or, Cape Breton. Fixed red light.

**SYDNEY HARBOUR**—The light is a fixed red light on the West end of South Bar, elevated  $30\frac{1}{2}$  feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white. Lat  $46^{\circ} 12' 40''$  N. Long  $60^{\circ} 12' 40''$  W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into the harbour and marking the dangers of the bar.

**LOW POINT**—On the Eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B., harbour. A white fixed light elevated 70 feet, visible 14 miles. Building octagon red and white vertical stripes. Lat  $46^{\circ} 16' 12''$  N, Long  $60^{\circ} 09' 22''$  W.

**LINGAN**—On the Head, north side of entrance to Bridgeport Harbor, Cape Breton. A fixed red light.

**FLINT ISLAND**—On Flint Island, E Coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat  $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$  N, Long  $59^{\circ} 45' 56''$  W. A revolving light attaining its greatest brilliancy every 15 seconds, 65 feet above high water. Octagonal white building.

**SCATTARI ISLAND**—On the N E Point of the Island. A revolving light visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 90 feet, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat  $46^{\circ} 2' 13''$  N. Long  $59^{\circ} 40' 18''$  W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of N N E or to the southward of S S W nor approached nearer than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles. A boat for assistance.

**MALINADIEU**—On the west end of Scattari Island, a fixed red light is exhibited at an elevation of 90 feet above high water, and can be seen at a distance of 9 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 40 feet high, and painted white. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric, and consists of 4 lamps and reflectors. Lat  $40^{\circ} 0' 30''$  N. Long  $59^{\circ} 47' 30''$  W.

**LOUISBURGH**—On Lighthouse Point, N side of the entrance to the harbour. A white fixed light, 85 feet above high water, visible 16 miles. Square white building, with vertical black stripes. Lat  $45^{\circ} 54' 31''$  N, Long  $59^{\circ} 57' 15''$  W.

**OURTIQUE ISLAND**—St. Peter's Bay on South Point of the Island, North side of the east entrance to Lennox passage, Richmond County, Cape Breton. Fixed red light.

**CAPE LE ROND**—East end of Madame Island on the Cape West side of entrance St. Peter's Bay, Richmond County, Cape Breton. Fixed white light. Lat  $44^{\circ} 34' 45''$  N, Long  $60^{\circ} 53' 0''$  W.

**SARLE ISLAND, EAST END**—Fixed white light. The tower is octagonal, 86 feet high, painted white and brown, vertical stripes. Lat  $43^{\circ} 58' 30''$  N, Long  $59^{\circ} 46' 6''$  W.

**SASSIE ISLAND, WEST END**—An octagonal white building, showing a revolving light which revolves in three minutes, showing three flashes at intervals of half a minute, then a cessation of light during 1½ minute in each revolution. In thick or foggy weather or snow storms a steam fog whistle is sounded 8 seconds in each minute, leaving an interval of 52 seconds between each blast, Lat 45° 57' 0" N, Long 60° 8' 0" W.

**Light Boxes Building.**

**GUYON ISLAND** off Cape Gabourne, South-East Coast of Cape Breton.

**ON THE COAST OF NEW BRUNSWICK.**

**MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND**—S W by W ½ W from Grand Manan, lie the Machias Islands. On the eastern island two light houses are erected, showing fixed lights, distant from each other about 230 feet in the direction of E S E and W N W, by which they are easily distinguished from all other lights on the coast. Elevated about 54 and 58 feet above high water, visible 15 miles. A gun is fired every four hours during a fog. Both buildings white.

**GRAND MANAN ISLAND**—On Swallow Tail Point, N E side of the island. A white fixed light, 140 feet above high water, visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat 44° 45' 22" N. Long 66° 44' 4" W. This is a conspicuous mark in the S Channel between Brier Island and Grand Manan.

**GANNET ROCK**—The Gannet Rock is 66 feet above high water, and has a light house upon it, painted black and white in vertical stripes. A revolving light (visible 12 miles), lies S W by S distant 3½ miles from the southern point of Three Islands, and S S E ½ E 7 miles from the S W head of the Grand Manan. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. There are a number of small ledges and sunken rocks about it, which are always breaking. The light stands conspicuously in the immediate vicinity of all the sunken rocks and dangers, extending from the old Proprietor to the Seal Islands of Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the light house about 4 miles. From this range farther westerly, about six miles, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S W end of Grand Manan, open.

**CAMPO BELLO**—On the N E extremity of the island. A white fixed light, 61 ft. above the sea, visible 15 miles. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy.

**POINT LE PREAU**—Upon this projecting head land two fixed white lights, one above the other, distant 28 feet. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mach's Bay. The highest light is 81 feet, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes, 5 ft broad, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E by N, 11 miles.

**ST JOHN, N B HARBOR**—On Partridge Island at the entrance of the river and harbor. A white fixed light, 120 feet above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. A Steam Whistle is sounded 10 seconds in every minute during fog and snow storms, audible 4 to 6 miles. There is also a BELL BUOY at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The bell can be heard 3 miles.

**QUACO HEAD**—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. A revolving white light, 58 feet above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

**CAPT. ENRAGE**—On the point of that name in Westmorland nearly opposite Apple River Light in Cumberland. A plain white light, 161 feet above the sea, visible 15 miles. Square white building.

**GRINDSTONE ISLAND**—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay. Lat 45° 4' 13" N. Long 64° 27' 25" W. 60 feet above high water. Octagonal white tower.

#### EXPLANATION OF SIGNALS.

*Made at the Ship Staff at Citadel Hill, when Vessels are seen from the Citadel or reported from an Outpost.*

For 1 Square Rigged vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.

" 2 Do, 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard and one close up on the inner halliard; outer ball dropped.

" 3 Do, 2 balls close up, one on the outer and one on the inner halliard.

" 4 Do, 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 5 Do, a pennant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside

" 6 Do, a pennant under a bail close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

" 7 Do, a pennant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 8 Do, a pennant under two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 9 Do, a pennant between two balls close up on the outer halliard with a ball close upon the inner halliard.

" 10 Do, a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c, are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When Sailing Vessels are reported from an outpost, the following

Signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:

For a Square Rigged Vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A Ship, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at inner halliard.

A Barque, a large do, at the end, with a small one dropped at inner halliard.

A Brig, a small ball at the end of the yard, and large one at the inner halliard.

A Brigantine, a cross close up at the outer halliard. Two or more do, a cross half hoisted.

A Topsail Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

Two or more schooners, a cross inner half hoisted.

The upper yard of the Ship Staff is used solely to designate Steam Vessels thus:

Two large balls close up, one at the outer and the other at the inner halliard, E or W, a steamer reported in that quarter.

A small ball at the outer, and large one at the inner halliard a second class Packet or merchant Steamer.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.

Lanterns are hoisted at night to denote a steamer reported.

*Red* light on outer and *white* light inner on E. yard-arm denotes Steamer East reported.

*Green* light outer and *white* light inner on W. yard-arm—Steamer West reported.

*Red* light above *white*, 12 feet apart, mail from England.

*Green* light above *white*, 12 feet apart, mail for England.

*White* light above *red*, 12 feet apart, Newfoundland mail.

*White* light above *green*, 12 feet apart, Bermuda mail.

*Green* light above *red*, 12 feet apart, English Man-of-War.

*Red*, *green* and *white*, 12 feet apart, enemy's Man-of-War.

The coloured lantern is always shown at yard-arm, and the white one at the inner halliard, E or W, according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

When a Steamer is sighted the inner (*white*) light is taken down.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

When the description of vessel is ascertained, the following descriptive colors will be hoisted at the masthead, and the inner ball taken down:

A Union Jack—a Flag Ship.

Man-of-War Screw Steamer, a white pennant with a blue ball in the centre, over the Union Jack.

Man-of-War Paddle Steamer, a white pennant with a blue ball in the centre under the Union Jack.

Troop Ship, white pennant two blue crosses.

Dominion blue Ensign, under steamer pendant, Dominion gunboat.

A red flag pierced white, Royal Mail Packet from England.

A blue and red four quarters, with white ball in upper blue quarter, mail for England.





With Position of Acadia Coal Company's Mines and Wharf.




