



NANAIMO, February 10th, 1886.

*To the Grand Lodge of the Province of British Columbia:*

**OFFICERS AND REPRESENTATIVES,**--I have great pleasure in again greeting you, and presiding over this, our twelfth annual session, being also the first held in this, the city of Black Diamonds.

And before proceeding further in our deliberations for the welfare of our beloved Order, should not each heart present send up a prayer of gratitude and thankfulness, to the supreme Grand Master above (the fountain of all good) for the continued blessing of our lives, while in this short year so many of our brothers have been taken to that bourn, whence no traveler returns, we are still permitted to enjoy the pleasures of life, and to assist in the cultivation of that grand fraternal relation designed by the great author of our existence.

The increase in our membership, I am proud to say, has not been exceeded any year since the institution of this Grand Lodge, and I am informed the material thus brought in to assist us in the great work of friendship, love, and truth, has been the very best. Financially, too, I find all the lodges presenting good reports.

My official duties, for the past year, have been of the very simplest, in fact, I have not had a single question brought to me officially during the whole time of my term of office, and the reports of the various District Deputy Grand Masters, which are herewith annexed, show that peace and harmony have reigned throughout this jurisdiction, thus making the year 1885 not only one of the most prosperous, but also a year of peace and good will.

#### PROCLAMATIONS.

I received a proclamation from the Grand Sire, dated February 2nd, 1885, enjoining all grand and subordinate bodies to take steps for the proper observance of the sixty-sixth anniversary of our Order, upon the 25th or 27th of April, the 26th falling upon Sunday. In accordance with above, I granted dispensations to the various lodges, to celebrate this occasion as they each might deem advisable.

I also received a proclamation from the same source, dated November 10th, 1885, regarding the Patriarchal Circle, in which the following resolution occurs: "That any Odd Fellow, who shall after January 1st, 1886, retain his membership in the Patriarchal Circle, or its successor, by whatever name it may be known, or in any secret organization, not authorized by this Grand Body, that has, or may hereafter require as qualification of membership, a past, present, or future standing in the Order, shall be guilty of conduct unbecoming an Odd Fellow, and on conviction thereof, shall be expelled from the Subordinate Lodge." I find this institution numbers about 4000 members, located principally in the States of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, and Michigan. The above course of the Sovereign Grand Lodge should surely stamp out this illegal branch of our Order.

#### CIRCULARS.

I received a circular from the Sovereign Grand Lodge, herewith marked "C," in regard to the condemnation by the city of Baltimore, of the Sov. Grand Lodge property, and calling upon the Order at large to offer inducements for the permanent location of this Body and its offices. I think the time of this Grand Lodge need not be further taken up with this subject, except perhaps to acknowledge the receipt of communication.

I have also received a circular, marked "D," from the Grand Lodge of Indiana, soliciting contributions to erect a memorial to Brother Schuyler Colfax, P. G. R., the father of the degree of Rebekah, who died January 13th, 1885. I would suggest that a copy of the same be sent to each of our subordinates, to do as they think best in the matter.

#### DISPENSATIONS.

In addition to the dispensation authorizing lodges to celebrate the 35th anniversary, on the 25th or 27th of April, upon application, I granted a separate dispensation to Victoria lodges, to celebrate the above occasion on the 28th April. On November 26th, 1885, granted a dispensation to New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, to allow them to hold a ball under their auspices, and to wear regalia at the same, which took place on December 4th, 1885.

#### INSTALLATIONS.

On the 2nd July, 1885, installed the officers elect of Harmony Lodge, No. 6, and Black Diamond Lodge, No. 5.

On the 9th July, 1885, installed the officers elect of New Westminster Lodge, No. 3.

On the 7th January, 1886, installed the officers elect of New Westminster Lodge, No. 3.

#### APPOINTMENTS.

On August 14th, 1885, I appointed Brother H. Waller, P. G. M., on Committee on Laws of Subordinates, in place of Brother R. Roberts, P. G. M., who declined to serve.

Our Endowment Auxiliary Association, established in 1884, has not progressed as rapidly as we had been led to expect; the Grand Secretary

will give you all particulars on this subject; I hope also to hear from the Committee, formed at our last session, to assist the Executive Officers in promoting the interests of this scheme.

In accordance with your wishes expressed at last session, that it would be advisable for Grand Masters in future to include in their reports any important matter which may transpire in the Sovereign Grand Lodge, I notice the following:—

The Sovereign Grand Lodge met at Baltimore on the 21st September, 1885. The condition of the Order in the various jurisdictions as appearing from the reports of the different Grand Bodies, is in the main prosperous, and while there is a decrease of initiations in Lodges and Encampments of 4142, as compared with the previous year, there is an increase of 10,359 Lodge members, and 3405 Encampment members; an increase of 142 Lodges, 28 Encampments, 66 Rebekah Degree Lodges and one Grand Encampment. The total relief paid, \$2,111,926, exceeds the amount of the previous year, \$96,094.34. Yet with this prosperity exhibit the revenue of Lodges and Encampments has decreased \$75,733.58. The Grand Secretary says, "that it seems difficult to account for it, as there has been an addition of 10,359 to the membership, and the result cannot be attributed to the difference in the number of initiations."

I would call your attention to the new form of application for membership upon page 10188 of the Proceedings, the object sought is that it shall have the force of a contract, by which all disputes between members and their lodges shall be settled within the Order, according to the laws of Odd Fellowship.

I have noticed considerable discussion on this matter, in the press devoted to the interests of the Order, in regard to the legality of the document, on this point I think it should be safe, for I notice that was prepared by a judge, and finally accepted by the Sovereign Grand Lodge, a body in which the lawyers amount to more than one-quarter of the entire membership. The chief objection I see to it is that it will involve the lodges in some expense in procuring new forms of application.

Australasia and Germany have been allowed to work in the Initiation degree.

The Ridgely monument, the corner stone of which was laid August 27th, 1885, in Harlem Park, Baltimore, was unveiled September 2nd, 1885, with grand and imposing ceremony.

I would respectfully draw your attention to the fact that it is not  
wful to omit the regular lodge meeting on account of such meeting  
alling upon a public holiday. P. G. Sir Stokes brought in a motion to  
allow such omission, but it was not adopted.

It cannot be out of place for me to refer to the visit last  
August of the Grand Patriarch of Oregon, under which jurisdiction the  
Patriarchs of this province work, the kind and affable manner of this  
gentleman won us all, and I believe not only improved our Encampments,  
but assisted our subordinates in a great measure. I notice with pleasure  
the institution last year of two new Encampments, one located in this  
city, and the other at Wellington, and second, the wish of Brother Jas.

Phillips, D. D. G. M., of No. 3, that one other may soon be organized, thus  
adding to the strength of this Province to a Grand Encampment and bringing us within  
representation to the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

We have had to mourn the death of eleven of our brothers since our  
last meeting, two being Past Grands, first among these was Brother W.  
Jeffree, P.G.M., whose death occurred on March 18th, 1885, after a short  
illness, this worthy brother has been sent nearly every year to represent  
our Order in this Grand Body, and has done much by his wise counsel to  
raise the Order in this Province to its present high standard. I trust  
you will insert a memorial page in the proceedings of this Grand  
Lodge, with a fitting tribute to the name of Jeffree. The  
other member of this Grand Body who has answered to the  
call of the Great High Priest, and who has been equally useful in his  
respective sphere, although his name has not been so prominent before  
us as the above, was Thos. L. Scott, P. G., of New Westminster Lodge,  
No. 3.

I am sorry to say that the pleasant duty which my worthy predecessor  
had hoped would fall upon me to perform, namely the institution of  
a Lodge of our Order at Kamloops has not been gratified, having heard  
nothing from that locality on the matter, and I am greatly disappointed  
not being able to announce to you now of new lodges at Chilliwack  
and Granville, in both of which places I had at one time great hopes of

having the honor to start our beloved Order, however I trust that my loss will be my successor's gain, lodges in the districts named, I am confident, would prove prosperous.

I cannot close my report without offering a few remarks on my visit to Black Diamond and Harmony Lodges, as stated above, I installed the officers of these lodges last July. I had the pleasure of witnessing an initiation by Harmony Lodge, and I must compliment the officers and members on the proficient and able manner in which the same was performed; no fears need be entertained of this lodge (the youngest of our family), while under the watchful eye of our worthy Brother Robert Scott, P. ## PROCLAMATION OF THE GRAND SIRE.

SOVEREIGN GRAND LODGE OF THE I. O. O. F.

To Wm. McColl,

DEAR SIR AND BROTHER.—Your immediate and careful attention is hereby called to the following important action at the session of the Sovereign Grand Lodge, I. O. O. F., held at Baltimore, Md., September, 1886, viz.:

*Resolved*, That the acts of the Grand Sire, as set forth in so much of this report as refers to the Patriarchal Circle, are hereby approved.

*Resolved*, That any Odd Fellow who shall, after January 1st, 1886, retain his membership in the Patriarchal Circle, or its successors, by whatever name it may be known, or in any secret organization not authorized by this Grand Body, that has heretofore or may hereafter require as a qualification of membership a past, present, or future standing in this Order, shall be guilty of conduct unbecoming an Odd Fellow, and on conviction thereof, shall be expelled from the Subordinate Lodge,

*Resolved*, That the Grand Sire, when the Sovereign Grand Lodge is not in session, is hereby clothed with all the power, authority and rights that this Grand Body possesses to prevent the members of this Order remaining or becoming members of the Patriarchal Circle.

*Resolved*, That for the purpose of enforcing all laws in relation to the Patriarchal Circle, the Grand Sire is authorized and empowered to deal directly with the State Jurisdictions and the Grand Officers thereof, and upon a failure of the Grand Subordinate Jurisdictions, or their officers, to obey the mandates of this Sovereign Grand Body upon this subject, the Grand Sire shall suspend the Charter of such offending jurisdictions.

*Resolved*, That hereafter every Grand Representative, before entering upon the discharge of his duties in the Sovereign Grand Lodge, shall subscribe and file with the Grand Secretary the following affirmation:

I, upon my honor as an Odd Fellow, declare that I am not now, and was not at the time of my election as Grand Representative to the Sovereign Grand Lodge, a member of the Patriarchal Circle by whatever name known, or of any secret organization, not authorized by this Order, nor has ever had as a basis of qualification membership in this Order of Odd Fellows.

(Journal 10,131.)

And now in pursuance of and by virtue of the duty imposed, and the authority conferred upon me by the foregoing resolutions, I, HENRY F. GAREY, GRAND SIRE, do hereby give you full notice thereof and request that you give the same notice to all the Subordinate Lodges in your jurisdiction, and that you will see that the above resolutions are put in force and fully complied with, in every particular so far as your power extends, and report your action to me in the premises, through the Grand Secretary of the Sovereign Grand Lodge. I hereby also give notice that I will proceed on my part to execute the law as required by said resolutions, whenever the facts shall justify me in so doing.

**Report of Grand Secretary read :—**

Office of Grand Secretary,

To the Grand Lodge of British Columbia, I. O. O. F.

DEAR SIRS AND BROTHERS,—I beg most respectfully to present the following report of the transactions of this office for the past year, and of the present condition of the Order in this jurisdiction.

In compliance with the resolution of last session, copies of the vote of thanks for the use of the Hall, were forwarded to each of the lodges in this city.

No time was lost in printing the Proceedings of the last session of this Grand Body, which was done at a very low price, and they were distributed in the usual manner to our own Lodges, and members, copies being at the same time despatched to all the sister jurisdictions.

Acting under directions from Brother Carne, D. G. M., the officers and members of the Grand Lodge were called together, by advertisements, to attend the funeral of our late Brother W. J. Jeffree, P. G. M., which took place at Victoria, on the 20th March last; this proceeding was subsequently approved by the Grand Master.

The amendments to the Grand Lodge Constitution effected last session were transmitted to the Sovereign Grand Lodge, and received its approval, *vide p. p. 10140 and 10185 of the Proceedings, 1885.*

A petition for the remission of the Representative Tax, charged against this Grand Lodge for the years 1884 and 1885, was prepared and sent as directed. It appears by reference to the Proceedings of the Sovereign Grand Lodge, p. p. 10086 and 10172, that the request was granted.

Nine volumes of the Proceedings of this Grand Body, from 1874 to 1885 inclusive, have been bound at a cost of \$11.25, and are now ready for sale.

Amendments have been received to the By-Laws of Victoria, Black Diamond and Harmony Lodges and handed to the Committee on Law of Subordinates, whose reports thereon will be submitted to this Grand Lodge. The amendments to the by-laws of the two last named Lodges bring them into accord with the Constitution for Subordinate Lodges in compliance with the directions contained in a resolution of last session. One hundred copies of the by-laws of Harmony Lodge, No. 6, have been printed at a cost of \$33.34 (the lowest tender obtained for this work) and have been forwarded to that Lodge.

Enquiries have been addressed to me by a Brother residing at Granville, Burrard Inlet, on behalf of several members, as to the steps necessary to be taken to open a Lodge at that place. I have furnished the desired information and have been told that a petition for a charter for this purpose would in all probability be presented at this Session but it has not yet come to hand.

A new edition of Grand Lodge Books have been printed by the Sovereign Grand Lodge to conform to the alterations made in the work of the Lodges, and as our copies are very incorrect and antiquated, I would submit that new ones be procured, both of the Grand Lodge Charge Book and Subordinate Lodge Institution and Installation Book.

I beg to point out that a contradiction occurs in the Constitution of Subordinate Lodges, which should be rectified at once. Sec. 10 of Art. VI reads "That the N. G. or officer acting as such shall appoint the majority and the V. G. or officer acting as such, the minority of Committees on Candidates and Charges." Rule 3, Sec. I, Code of Procedure, Art. VII, provides elaborately for the election by ballot of the Committee of Trial when charges are preferred.

I think the simplest way to remedy this error is to strike out the words *and charges* from Sec. 10 of Art. VI.

Brother Huxtable, Grand Herald, has performed certain services during the year in laying fires and cleaning the Grand Secretary's office and I recommend that some remuneration be granted him for the same.

The Finances of the Grand Lodge are in a very satisfactory condition; the balance in the hands of the Grand Treasurer being sufficient to meet the expenses of this communication and the cost of printing the proceedings. I would submit that it is unadvisable that the balance at the end of the year should be reduced, it has on former occasions been so low as to be unable to pay for the printing of the Proceedings. The printer has had therefore to wait until July when the semi-annual Bill is received from the Subordinate Lodges. This is sometimes inconven-

#### ENDOWMENT ASSOCIATION.

The Endowment Association now consists of 100 members being 15 more than at last report. One death has occurred during the year, that of Brother Aaron Wood, of Harmony Lodge, No. 6, Wellington, on the 5 October last, and \$164.80, the amount realized by Assessment No. 2, has been paid to the nominee of the deceased.

This showing is not as good as it might have been, if more interest was taken in this Fund by the members, and it can undoubtedly be improved if a few earnest Brothers would take the matter in hand and work up, nothing succeeds in these associations like personal solicitation of members.

I would recommend that the Committee appointed last year be continued.

During the year there has been an increase in the membership of each lodge, showing in the aggregate an addition of 68 to our ranks.

The total amount spent for relief gives an average of \$9.40 per member on our present membership.

The Sick Benefits paid during the year average six days to each member.

Since the establishment of this Grand Lodge there has been disbursed \$49,140 for relief, a fact which needs no comment.

The return of the gross assets of the Lodges shows an average of \$1 per member.

The amount paid last year for current expenses of the Lodges is about 23 per cent of the gross receipts.
