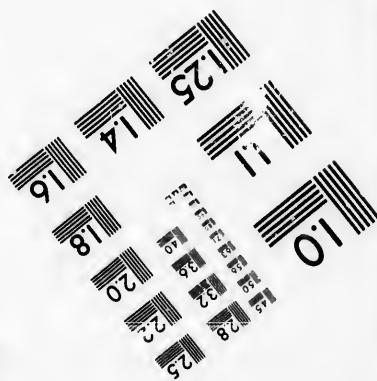
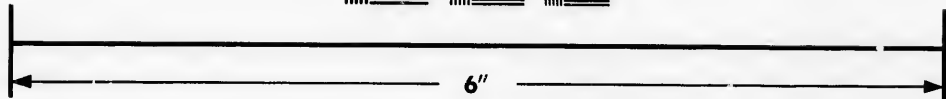
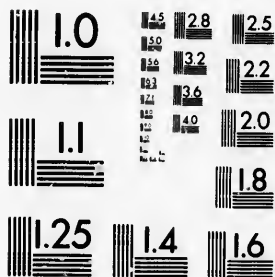
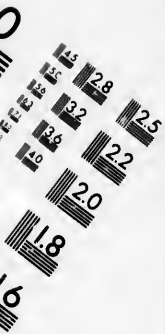


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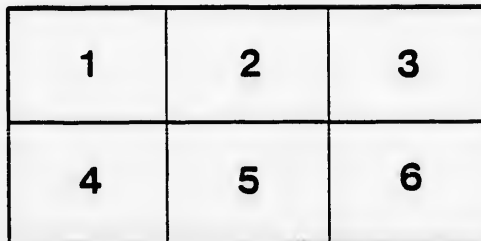
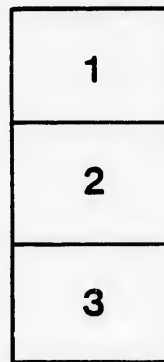
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REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE

UNIVERSITY LYING-IN HOSPITAL,

For the Year ending Oct. 1st, 1858.

The Committee of Management of the University Lying-in-Hospital, in resigning the trust confided to them at the last Annual Meeting, have to congratulate the friends of the Hospital on the prosperity which has marked its progress during the year now closed; and while tendering these congratulations, they are desirous of most gratefully remembering and acknowledging, that all is due to the watchful care of "Him who neither slumbereth nor sleepeth," and whose choicest blessings are freely dispensed to all, "without money and without price."

Your Committee with feelings of deepfelt gratitude have no deaths to record among the increased number of patients admitted during the year, undoubtedly due to the strict attention with which cleanliness and ventilation are enforced. Pauper patients are admitted as usual, and they are attended to with as much care as those who pay their board. Unmarried females are, as a rule, not admitted twice, the Committee being persuaded that the observance of this regulation—a standard one of the Hospital, is the only safeguard of the Institution against a charge of connivance with vice. This rule is rigidly enforced, and will continue to be so.

A reference to the list of admissions will exhibit a considerable increase over that of the year preceding; and, what is a source of still greater pleasure, is to observe, that while the number of unmarried patients is about the same, that of the married has very considerably augmented. Your Committee are much pleased to witness this fact, as it tends to demonstrate that among that class—the poor mechanic and laborer, for whose benefit the Institution was more immediately established, its advantages are becoming daily more appreciated.
