LAWSON'S CHARGES PROVED BANKER TURNED CARELESS

National City Bank of New York Loaned \$480,000 Just to Laundry Mining Stocks.

New York, Jan. 8.—The most striking revelation in the case of Munroe & Munroe, curb brokers, is the part played in their game by a vice-president of the largest national bank in the country.

Munroe & Munroe tried the old trick of unloading mining stock on the public by "wash sales"—by forming a syndicate to buy and sell the stock, in totally fictitious transactions, at gradually rising prices. The cheapness of the stock appealed to amateur operators. A messenger boy's salary for a week would margin a basket of it.

Archibald G. Loomis is vice-president of the National City or "Standard Oil" Bank. Mr. Loomis was also one of the "syndicate." His connection with it was avowed and public, and was its best advertisement, as a sign that "the Rockefeller were in the hold" of the mines in question.

\$90,000 a Day Loaned.

For eight days Mr. Loomis loaned his co-conspirators without security \$90,000 a day of the bank's deposits—of the funds of people of New York entrusted to it for safe-keeping. James Stillman, president of the bank, says he knew nothing of the action, and that he is not a party to it. "We are all liable to make mistakes."

This is not a case of making mistakes. It is the case of depositors' money, which should be safeguarded in the honor of bankers as well as in the honor of the laws governing loans. To conduct a reckless campaign of flotation, LAWSON IN HIS CONTINUED STRUGGLE FOR FINANCIAL FINANCING, MAKES JUST THAT CHARGE AGAINST THE FINANCIAL MAGNATES. HE MAKES NO CHARGE THAT IS MORE GRAVE.

The Custom House Deal.

In August, 1904, the National City Bank, thru Lyman J. Gage, the secretary of the treasury, bought the New York custom house on Wall street, for \$7,255,000.

The government has since paid the National City Bank rental for the custom house at the rate of \$130,000 a year, being 4 per cent. on the purchase price. The purchase price practically still remains in the coffers of the National City Bank. The government has deposited in the bank on an average \$15,000,000 a year. At 4 per cent. this is worth \$600,000 per annum to the bank. It has been estimated that ten years of this arrangement will give the immensely valuable custom house property to the Standard Oil Bank free of all cost. Five and a half years have already elapsed.

The Montreal and Boston Deal.

Archibald G. Loomis is second vice-president of the National City Bank, and its credit expert.

He went into a syndicate to sell 700,000 shares of Montreal and Boston Copper stock. Munroe & Munroe were a party to the syndicate. They "washed" the price up from \$1 to \$25.50 a share.

Every morning for eight successive days they got \$50,000 on the syndicate from the National City Bank. The \$50,000 was used in the "wash" trades by which the syndicate's stock was to be unloaded on the public at a fancy profit. The plan was to "wash" the price up to \$25. This would have been a gross profit of \$24 a share, or \$2,400,000 in all. The syndicate's share was to have been \$2,100,000. The syndicate was known as the Loomis Syndicate.

SNOWBOUND FORTY-EIGHT HOURS

One Hundred Railway Passengers Suffer From Intense Cold.

Halifax, N.S., Jan. 8.—A Nova Scotia Central train which left Bridgewater on Friday reached here to-day after having been snowbound near Alpena for 48 hours, during which time the 100 passengers suffered intensely from cold and hunger.

Alpena, with only a railway station, afforded no accommodations for feeding the travelers, and the locomotives had barely enough fuel to keep up steam until the relief engine broke its way thru the drifts. Communication with other points by wire was interrupted by the blizzard, which lasted two days.

The railway management sent 20 teams from Middleton to transfer the passengers to the nearest station on the Dominion Atlantic Railway, a distance of 12 miles. As the temperature was five below zero few left the train to face the storm.

FATAL GYMNASIUM FALL

ITHACA, N.Y., Jan. 8.—Frederick E. Schmidt of Newark, N.J., a sophomore in Cornell University, died to-day in the Cornell institute of injuries received several weeks ago in the Cornell gymnasium.

Young Schmidt was an expert gymnast, but while performing on the parallel bars he lost his hold and fell to the floor. His spinal column was so injured that his whole body was completely paralyzed, although he retained consciousness, and his hopes were entertained of Schmidt's recovery, but his death to-day was sudden and unexpected.

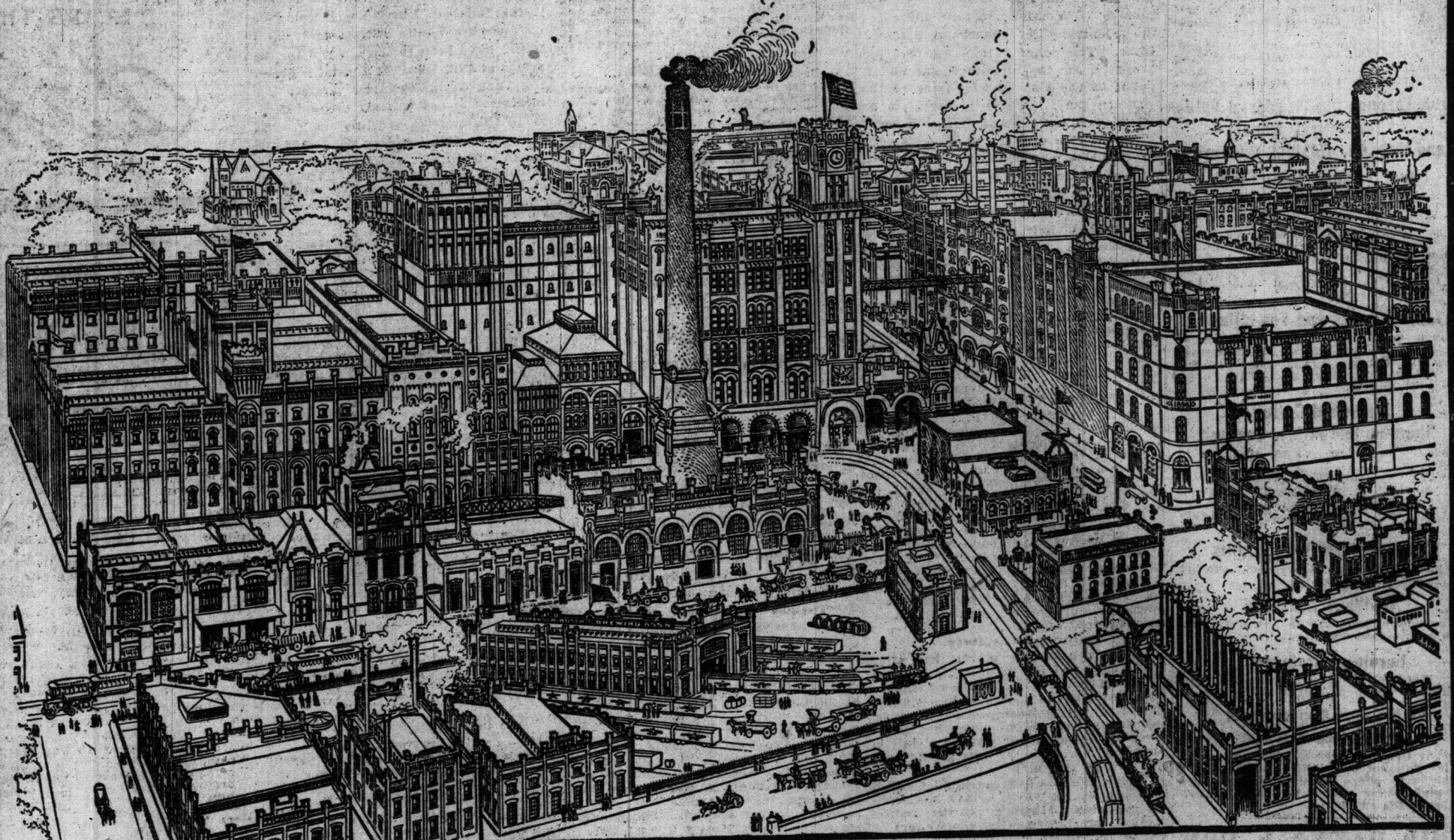
POPE AGAINST REVOLUTION.

SECRET PAPAL BULL TO STOP CLAIMS OF NATIONS TO VETO

Cardinal Bringing Message of Objection, or Communicating Intention, Excluded From Concave

Rome, Jan. 7.—One of the most important acts thus far in the pontificate of Pope Pius X. has been embodied in a secret bull, the text of which will not be made public until the Pontiff is dead, when it will be read as forming part of the constitution in the next conclave to elect his successor.

The bull is in connection with the claims of Austria, France and Spain as to their right to veto the election of any cardinal to the papacy. All the cardinals have not been informed as to the contents of the document, it having been drawn up in accordance with a decision reached in meetings held by the cardinals living in Rome, with the exception of Cardinal Rampolla, who is absent from the city. The bull is the direct result of veto against Cardinal Rampolla, should he be elected as successor to Leo XIII, which was presented to the conclave Aug. 2, 1903, by Cardinal Puzyna, Bishop of Krakow, Austria, at the instance of Emperor Francis Joseph.

Briefly the bull says that all cardinals are absolutely forbidden under penalty of exclusion from the conclave, and not being allowed to vote, to be the bearer of a message of veto, and that if any cardinal, knowing the intention of his refer to object to the election of a cardinal, communicates this intention to his colleagues in the conclave, he will be excluded and not allowed to vote.
