The steam ship Europa, with the Mail of the 23rd March, arrived at Halifax on Wednesday, in a fine passage of 11 days from Liverpool. The mail arrived in this city on Friday, at noon. The Europa brought out 56 passengers, 15 of whom were for St. John.

The young Westport throughout the United Kingdom is most favourably spoken of, and being good for nearly all been put down under very favorable circumstances. The short supply of foinage still continued at Liverpool, and the price is high.

Trade in the Manufacturing Districts is not so good. Two weeks later advices from India politically there is nothing important, and commercially the news is less encouraging than what was anticipated. In France the Elections have passed over without any disturbance.

Liverpool Timber Market.—The supplies of Wood, since the 1st of February have been less than the usual quantity during a similar time in the year. The market for the various kinds of timber is quiet.
