## GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

To the Right Worshipful Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West.

BRETHREN,—It affords me great pleasure to meet you in Grand Lodge to-day and receive the congratulations and friendly greetings of many of my older brethren, whom I have been accustomed to meet in Grand Lodge for many years, and to welcome my younger brethren who are here for the first time.

When, one year ago, you elected me as your chief officer, it was not without feelings of misgiving as to my ability to serve you that I accepted the position in which you were pleased to place me, and now, at the end of the year, permit me to return you my sincere thanks for the great honor done me, and for your kindness and forbearance in overlooking my many shortcomings during the year.

I am happy to be able to report to you that during the year harmony has prevailed throughout the jurisdiction, and peace and prosperity has com-

passed us on every hand.

From the Reports that will be laid before you by the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer, and the returns from the various counties, it will be seen that substantial progress has been made; there has been an increase of membership and a better attendance at primary Lodges, several domant Lodges have been reorganized and a number of new warrants issued. This increase and improvement in our Order is most gratifying and leads us to the conclusion that as the principles of Orangesus becomes better understood, accessions to our ranks will greatly multiply.

My correspondence with the brethern has been large, and the labor of revising by-laws much more than I anticipated at the commencement of the year, but I have endeavored to discharge my duties in these respects as promptly as possible, and if I have failed to respond within a reasonable ime, I can assure the brethren whose cases have been overlooked, that the delay was attributable to causes over which I had no control, and not to any wilful negligence on my part.

Our Constitution and Laws are open to the public, and all classes of Protestants of good reputable character are welcome to join our ranks without question as to their particular creed, and notwithstanding what some say of us, without regard to political associations, whether Tory or

An Order, founded on the principles of the Orange Association, which inculcates the doctrines of the Reformation, instructs its members in their duties and responsibilities to their fellow men, encourages the young to form habits of diligence, and impresses by all its ceremonies and teachings the golden rule "do unto others as you would they should do unto you." Justice to all, oppression to none. Liberty, equity, fraternity, cannot fail to command the esteem and respect of all who understand its teachings and wish to be governed by these golden maxims.

In many of the outlying districts the members, by reason of their isolation, find it difficult to keep themselves fully up to the times in the working of the several degrees, and I would recommend to your consideration the advisability of adopting some means of helping them on in their work, by the assistance of the Grand Lecturer, or some other officer, who could attend and hold Lodges of instruction in central localities.

I consider it of the greatest importance to the welfare of our Order that we should, in our Grand Lodge meetings, lay down such rules for the guidance of our members in matters pertaining to our Association, that no misunderstanding can occur or any friction be caused by members having taken the same obligation pulling in opposite directions expecting to attain the same end. The Roman Catholic heirarchy never makes such a mistake, for when Rome wants to accomplish an object her plans are laid with great care, and then everyone under her rule, and acknowledging her sway, will work with untiring zeal to carry out her designs, following the rules laid down for their guidance, none daring to exercise his own judgment or think for himself.

In a country so democratic as Canada, governed as it is, by political parties, and where the party lines in the past have been so closely drawn, we have many lessons to learn. The first and only one to which I will now call your attention is that when great issues and principles are involved, we should stand by our mottoes "Union, Love and Truth; Our God, Our Country and Our Queen," and let political parties and past associations be laid aside for the use of men void of the principles we profess to teach and practice. By so acting on all occasions our influence for good in the government and councils of our country, as well as in the other relations of life, cannot fail to be felt and acknowledged.

Our educational system in Ontario, the plans and foundation of which were laid by that great and good man, the late Dr. Ryerson, has been justly acknowledged to have no superior, but alas, it has been tampered with by designing politicians for the purpose of pleasing and currying favor with the Roman Heirarchy. This is a question on which, above all others, all Protestants should unite to guard against further encroachments of the whose cam aign against our public schools is now thoroughly organized and conducted with that tenacity of purpose and subtle policy which characterizes all her schemes. Our politicians when they first granted separate schools, let in the thin end of the wedge, and the Roman Ecclesiastics have ever since been driving it still further, every success giving them renewed energy, and unless arrested by the strong hand of the people, in a short time we will find the efficiency of our public schools very materially and injuriously affected

The Irish question is still the all absorbing problem in the Mother Country. We deeply sympathize with our Brethren and Protestant friends in the Emerald Isle in their struggle to maintain their freedom from the grasp of the Parnellite party, and we venture to express the hope that the day is far distant when the British House of Commons will consent to any measure tending to a severance of the brightest jewel from the rest of the Empire. Yet it is our earnest desire that every extension of freedom may be granted to the people of that unhappy land, which is consistent with the mainten.

ance of the integrity of the Empire.

The Triennial Council will meet in July next at Carrickfergus, in Ireland, where it is expected delegates will attend from all parts of the world, to consider the various subjects affecting the prosperity of the Order.

The success of the Orange Mutual Insurance Department is now an accomplished fact. All death claims have been fully settled, and means have been adopted to create the nucleus of a reserve fund, so as to always have on hand sufficient to pay one or more claims promptly, as soon as they are proved, without waiting the usual time necessary for collecting an assessment, thus rendering assistance to the widow and orphans of a deceased brother at a time when it is most needed. I would urge all brethren to use their influence in promoting this useful branch of our

association.

Our Cons itution, Laws and Ritual, while they contain all that is necessary for our government and guidance, I feel constrained to say could be greatly improved by revision and by the introduction of some new features, bringing the working of the Order more in harmling with modern ideas. I would particularly refer to our present system of organizing new lodges by drawing away members from existing lodges; a system which, in my opinion, is not well calculated to advance the spread of our association and increase our membership; and I would recommend that a petition be presented to the M. W. G. L. of B. A. praying for a revision of the Ritual in the manner thus indicated, and for such amendments of the Constitution and Laws as may be necessary to enable any number of Protestants (not less than 6) to organize a new Lodge under dispensation from the M. W. G. M. of B. A. or the R. W. Provincial G. ## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY.

To the Right Worshipful the Provincial Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West:

RIGHT WORSHIPFUL SIR AND BRETHREN,—In accordance with constitutional practice, I have great pleasure in presenting my fourth annual report, as your Grand Secretary, and in transmitting to you in a brief form the work transacted during the past year.

#### OBITUARY.

The members of the Association have been called to mourn the loss by death of some of our most active workers, although, so far as I am able to judge, the death roll has not exceeded that of past years.

Bro. Alex. Edgar, District Master of Innisfil, who was present with us and took part in our deliberations last year and on previous occasions, was saddenly called away shortly after our meeting last year.

Most Worshipful Bro. John Flanigan, of Kingston, at one time Grand Master of British America, has also passed to his reward.

#### LODGE REPORTS.

34 of our County Lodges have reported, and from these I have pleasure in being able to report that 1.031 new members have been admitted by initiation; 559 brethren by certificate; while the number removed by death, 97, and by expulsion has been 68, indicating a steady and increasing growth, which must be gratifying

#### ISSUE OF WARRANTS.

Eight new warrants have been issued during the year, by Counties, as follows: No. 828, to East Grey; No. 809. to Muskoka; Nos. 809 and 838, to Parry Sound: Nos. 154, 196 and 804, to Toronto; and one to North Bay, number not fixed as yet.

#### RENEWAL OF DORMANT WARRANTS,

The following dormant warrants have been revived, and the lodges reorganized and in working order: No. 153, South Huron; No. 643, North York; No. 770, Dufferin, and one each in South Perth and West Wellington.

### SURRENDER OF DORMANT WARRANTS.

Only one warrant reported in working order last year has been returned to me, but another has been withdrawn,

#### CORRESPONDENCE.

The Grand Lodge correspondence has continued to increase, and from the spirit of the enquiries it is in the direction of making the brethren acquainted with the work of the Association. No difficulty, I am pleased to state, has occured, and good feeling and harmony prevails to a most wonderful degree, a feature most creditable to the Association. The revised Constitution and Rituals have apparently closed the doors on disputed and constitutional points, so that they are no longer a bone of contention at our lodge meetings.

I have pleasure in reporting that printed Reports of the last annual meetings of the M. W. the Grand Lodge of British America, and the Provincial Grand Lodges of Ontario East, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, Manitoba and N. W. T., have been duly received, and from which I have obtained much valuable information.

### OUR JULY ANNIVERSARY.

The year we have entered on marks the bi-dentenary of the great event which called the Orange Association into existence; and recalls to us the great struggle for liberty and the truth, which, two hundred years ago, our forefathers were engaged in in the Mother Country. History furnishes no greater example of fortitude under the most trying and difficult circumstances, and right loyally and enthusiastically should we celebrate our forefathers' deliverance from civil and religious tyranny. # GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT ON THE ORANGE MUTUAL BENEFIT SOCIETY.

To the R. W. The Grand Master and Members of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Ontario West:

R. W. Sir and Brethern,—I have great pleasure in presenting herewith my Annual Report of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society, and in so doing I would offer my congratulations on the steady progress which we have made during the year.

Our hembership roll has been increased by 204 new members, and 39 members names are ready to enter on our books; while the deaths have only numbered eight, or about one in every one hundred members on our

At an Executive meeting held on November 17th, 1887, after mature consideration, it was decided to increase the rates then paid as commission to sur agents, in the hope that by giving them sufficient remuneration to make their engagements without loss of time or means, that the agents would be embled to prosecute our work and assist in increasing the membership.

I am of the opinion that in addition to the efforts of our agents, the Masters of our various Lodges could create a great interest in our work by making the Muual Benefit department a part and parcel of the routine work at their meetings, and by continually referring to the benefits to be derived therefrom.

The Provincial Government of Ontario have introduced a measure dealing with the Friendly Societies now conducting business in the Province. After with the Friendly Societies now conducting business in the Province. After a careful examination of the principal clauses, I am enabled to say that we should experience little or no change or difficulty in conducting our work under it. As matters now stand we have a separate and distinct account for each member; he is notified direct of all assessments, remittances and sarsars, and cannot be declared out of membership without full notice to his ask known P.O. I think, however, that we should have a Friendly Societies' Act passed by the Dominion Parliament, so that its operations might strend, as do our members, over the whole Dominion. In connection with this matter I would urge the appointment of a committee to act in conjunction with committees from other bodies now seeking such legislation.

The Auditors' Report, which will be submitted, will show the financial pestion of our department, and that the most rigid economy has prevailed, and a surplus in both branches.

### GRAND TREASURER'S REPORT.

In the absence of R. W. Bro. E. F. Clarke, M.P.P., Grand Treasurer, W. Bro. James A. Keyes read the Annual Report of Grand Treasurer.

To the Right Worshipful Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Orange Grand Lodge of Ontario West:

R. W. Sir and Brethren,—I beg herewith to submit for your consideration the Annual Financial Statement for the year ending 8th March, 1888, the fourth submitted by me during my incumbency of your Grand Treasurership. With it I also beg to present schedules and vouchers, showing in detail receipts and exenditures and amounts still owing for dues by Primary Lodges within the jurisdiction of your Grand Lodge. The Financial Statement also embraces receipts and expenditures of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society of Ontario West, received by me from the Secretary of the society and paid out through him upon his order. Accompanying the Financial Statement will be found report of Grand Lodge Auditors, certifying to the correctness of the accounts.

Like other statements which I have had the pleasure of submitting to your Grand Lodge, the present one shows marked and permanent improvement in the financial standing of the Grand Lodge, and a very large increase in the volume of its funds.

The total receipts for last year, including credit balance carried forward, were almost \$10,000, an increase of about \$4,000 over the previous year. I have disbursed, during the year, the sum of \$6,111.52, including \$3,850 death, endowments, and \$622.50 management expenses of Orange Mutual Benefit Society, and the total balance at credit of your Grand Lodge, after payment of current accounts and salaries of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer to date, is \$3,719.02, as follows:

Balance at credit of Grand Lodge, ordinary fund. ....\$1,141.54
Balance at credit of endowment fund, O.M.B.S. ..... 2,227.72
Balance at credit of management fund, O.M.B.S. ..... 349.76

During the year I have opened accounts for three new Counties, upon your Grand Treasurer's books, viz.: Algoma, Bruce North, and Grey East.

Notwithstanding my best efforts to collect all outstanding Grand Lodge dues, I regret to say there is still owing the large sum of \$1,211.40. The onus of this unnecessary indebtedness falls directly upon the Primary Lodge officers responsible for the payment of dues, and indirectly upon the County Masters, who should see that every lodge in the jurisdiction pays its Grand Lodge dues. I would arge upon the lodges to have all arrears paid forthwith; and thereby further strengthen the financial standing of your Grand Lodge.

The large increase in receipts and expenditures, necessary accounts and correspondence during the year have considerably augmented the duties of your Grand Treasurer's office; and I trust that my efforts to administer the sevenue of your Grand Lodge and the funds of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society handed to me will be found satisfactory.

### MEDICAL REFEREE'S REPORT.

To the R. W. Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West.

BRETHERN-I beg herewith to submit my Fourth Annual Report as Medical Referee of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society of Ontario West.

During the year ending 5th March, 1888, I received 252 Medical Examinations, of which 8 were r-jected, 1 held for further inquiries, and 243 passed. The causes for rejection were as follows:

The above includes one of the old Orange Guard, the late Bro. Armstrong, of Strathroy, who was admitted at the inception of the Association though much beyond the age limit laid down in the Constitution. It will be seen from the above that the insurance in our Association continues very reasonable indeed, having cost only \$5.76 at the age of 30, during the year past. This is the best evidence of the nature of the work done by our local Examiners, who certainly deserve the thanks of the Association, for the paintstaking manner and judgment in which they have performed their duties. I would again urge upon the Grand Lodge the desirability of presenting the claims of the Association in every part of the Dominion, so as to afford all Orangemen the opportunity of placing their families under the protection of our splendid Benefit Association.



### CONSTITUTION AND LAWS

OF THE

# ORANGE MUTUAL BENEFIT SOCIETY

OF ONTARIO WEST.

### ARTICLE 1. -NAME.

This society shall be known as the "Orange Mutual Benefit Society of Ontario West."

### ARTICLE 2, -OBJECT.

The object of this Society shall be to render financial aid and assistance to the widows and orphans, or representatives of deceased orange brethren who were in good standing in the Orange Association and in this Society at the time of their death.

### ARTICLE 3.-MEMBERSHIP.

SEC. 1.—The membership of this Society shall hereafter be composed exclusively of brethren who have made application, passed the medical examination and have been accepted as is hereinafter provided, and who at the time of their application are members of the Loyal Orange Association of British America, and who are in good standing in some Primary Lodge under the jurisdiction of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America, and not over fifty years of age.

Sec. 2.—Should a member of this Society be suspended or expelled from his Primary Lodge for any cause, or withdraw from member-ship in it, he shall cease to be a member of this Society; and in case of his death, his representatives shall not be entitled to any benefits from the Society's funds.

### ARTICLE 4.—REVENUE.

The revenue of this Society shall be derived from the proposition fees and assessments of its members and the interest upon the investment of the reserve fund.

### ARTICLE 5.—BENEFITS.

SEC. 1.—The maximum amount to be paid to the representatives or assigns of a deceased member shall be one thousand dollars; but until the membership of this Society is sufficient to raise that amount

by one assessment at the respective rates hereinafter mentioned upon all its members at the time of death, the representatives or assigns shall only be entitled to the amount of one assessment, and except as provided for in Article 10, Section 3, of this Constitution, to provide for a reserve fund.

SEC. 2.—Upon satisfactory proof of the death of a member who is entitled to benefits from the funds of this Society, his representatives or assigns shall receive within thirty days from the time of his death a sum not to exceed in any case \$1,000.

### ARTICLE 6. -OFFICERS.

SEC. 1.—The officers of this Society shall consist of a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and two brethren members of the Benefit Society, who shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members of the Mutual Benefit Society present at Grand Lodge meeting, who shall constitute the Executive of the Society.

SEC. 2.—The R. W. Grand Master of the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West shall be the President of this Society; the R. W. Grand Secretary of the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West shall be the Secretary of this Society; and the R. W. Grand Treasurer of the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West shall be the Treasurer of this Society.

### ARTICLE 7.-DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

SEC. 1.—The President shall preside at all meetings of the officers. He shall sign the certificates of membership and orders drawn on the Treasurer, and shall see that the laws and regulations of the Society are faithfully and properly executed.

SEC. 2.—The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of all meetings of the officers of the Society and of its business transactions; keep the books of account and conduct the correspondence; collect and receive moneys due to the Society, and as soon as the sum in his hands amounts to \$20.00, pay over the same to the Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor; prepare the certificates of membership and notices of deaths or assessments, and all communications called for and required by the officers; keep a record of the names of deceased members of the Society, and of the amount paid to their representatives; keep a record in the books of the Society of the names of the members who have paid and of those who have failed to pay the assessments made upon them, and also of those whose applications have been rejected; make annually, or oftener if required by the Executive, a full report in writing of the transactions and condition of the Society, and perform such duties as may be required of him by the Executive. For such services he shall receive from vear to year a stipulated salary as agreed upon by the Executive, so long as he shall conduct the business in an efficient manner. He shall be furnished with whatever assistance the Executive may deem necessary to conduct the business satisfactorily. bond to the President and his successors in office in the sum of at least \$1,000, from a guarantee company named by the President, the premium of which shall be paid out of the Society, for the faithful performance of his duties and for the proper care and accounting for of all moneys or other property of the Society that may come into his possession.

faithful ting for ne into SEC. 3.—The Treasurer shall receive all moneys or securities from the Secretary, giving his receipt therefor; deposit the same in a legally chartered bank in the names of the President, the Secretary and himself, and shall pay them out by cheque, signed by himself, and countersigned by the President and Secretary; make annually, or oftener if required by the President, a full report of the receipts and expenditures, and of all matters affecting its financial condition. He shall give a bond to the President and his successors in office, from a guarantee company to be named by the President, the premium of which shall be paid out of the funds of the society, in the sum of at least \$2,000, for the faithful performance of the duties of his office, and for the proper care and accounting and depositing in bank, or return of all moneys or other property of the Society that may come into his possession.

SEC. 4.—The Medical Referee shall examine all applications for membership after the same have passed the Medical Examiner, and perform such other duties as may be required of him by the President and Executive.

SEC. 5.—The Legal Adviser shall examine and prepare the bonds of the Secretary and Treasurer, and of the Special Agents which may be appointed by the Executive from time to time to present the claims of the Society in various sections of the Dominion, and perform such other duties as may be required of him by the President and Executive.

#### ARTICLE 8.—APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP.

SEC. 1.—All applicants for membership must be members in good standing in some Primary Lodge under the jurisdiction of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America, not more than fifty years of age, who pass a satisfactory examination before a regularly qualified medical examiner, which examination must be approved of by the Medical Referee and accepted by the Executive.

Sec. 2.—Applications must be made upon the forms supplied by the Society, and countersigned by the Master and Recording Secretary of the Primary Lodge to which the applicant belongs. They must be accompanied by an application fee of \$3.00, and the Master, Agent or some Brother appointed by the Primary Lodge shall forward the fees and see that papers are completed.

SEC. 3.—Should a candidate be rejected, the fees accompanying the application shall be returned, less \$1.25 for the medical examination.

SEC. 4.—The names of all rejected applicants shall be entered on

the Register.

SEC. 5.—Upon receipt of his certificate of memoership, the applicant shall forthwith remit to the Secretary the sum of \$1.00, the fee for registration.

### ARTICLE 9. -ASSESSMENTS.

Sec. 1.—The assessment of all members of this Society shall be graded according to age, and shall be as follows:

Sec. 2.—Upon sufficient proof of the death of a member of this Society, the Secretary shall forthwith notify the Executive; and the Executive, if the claim is satisfactory, shall order the Secretary to make an assessment, according to the scale in Section 1 of this Article, upon all members in good standing in this Society.

SEC. 3.—The Secretary shall make such assessment by sending to each member a notice containing the name of the deceased member, his age, occupation, and cause of death. Notices so sent, or deposited in the postoffice for what was the last given address of the member to whom the same is directed, shall be deemed and taken to be a lawful and sufficient demand for the payment of the assessment so called for and required; and any member failing to remit the amount of his assessment within thirty days from the postage of such notice of a call being made, shall forfeit his membership and all benefits therefrom, except in cases mentioned in Section 4 of this Article.

SEC. 4.—At the expiration of thirty days allowed for the payment of such assessment, the Secretary shall examine the books, and forthwith notify all members who have failed to pay their assessment, informing them that they have forfeited their membership and benefits therefrom; upon any member so forfeiting his membership giving satisfactory explanations to the Executive, paying all charges and dues, and again passing the medical examination referred to in Section 4 of Article 7, and Section 2 of Article 13, of this constitution, the Executive may reinstate him, and place him in the same position as if no forfeiture had taken place. This application must be made within thirty days after forfeiture of membership.

Sec. 5.—All assessments must be sent to the Secretary of this Society by bank draft, postoffice order, or registered letter (containing money only), and to the postoffice address of the Secretary named on notice of such assessment.

Sgc. 7.—Beside the assessments mentioned in the previous section, there shall be in each year one assessment made and called for from all members, the receipts from which shall be placed to the credit of the reserve fund?

#### ARTICLE 10.-FUNDS.

SEC. 1.—The management funds of the Society shall be composed of the fees derived from applications for membership, the registration fee, and the annual fee of one dollar from each member, which fee shall be payable on or before the first day of October in each year, and shall be applied in payment of medical examiners, officers and special agents' fees, and office expenditures of Secretary and Treasurer.

Sgc. 2.—The death benefit fund shall be composed of the receipts from assessments made to pay death claims as they take place, and all death benefits must be paid out of same except as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3.—The reserve fund shall be composed of the sums derived from the special assessment mentioned in Section 7 of Article 9 of this Constitution, and interest thereon, and an amount equal to five per cent. from each and every assessment. When the Executive think that the reserve fund is sufficient to warrant them in making provision for death benefits out of the same without affecting the stability of the Society, they may dispense with making a call for one or more assessments and pay the same out of the reserve fund.

### ARTICLE 11.—AUDITORS.

Two auditors shall be appointed annually, one by the President and one by the R. W. the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West, who shall audit the books of the Societyand make their report thereon not later than the 15th of January in each year. They shall be paid for their services such sums as shall be agreed upon by the Executive and themselves.

### ARTICLE 12. -SEAL.

A seal shall be procured of a design selected and approved by the Executive, which shall be attached to all cextificates of membership or other official documents, save and except the notices of assessments. The design of the seal shall be registered.

### ARTICLE 13.-MEDICAL OFFICERS.

SEC. I.—A Medical Officer shall be nominated by the District Master for each District, upon the request of the Master of a Primary Lodge or the agent for such District, and in case that the District Master has not so appointed, or where it may be necessary that additional examiners are required, the agent shall have all the powers of the District Master in so appointing a Medical Officer or Officers, and such appointment shall be subject to the approval of the President, and shall, whenever possible or advisable, be a member in good standing of the Loyal Orange Association. He shall in all cases be a regularly qualified practitioner.

SEC. 2.—The Medical Officer shall carefully examine all candidates who are instructed to appear before him, and make full reports to the Medical Referee upon the forms supplied; for his services he shall receive the sum of \$1.00, which shall be paid to him at the time of such examination by the applicant.

SEC. 3.—Not more than one Medical Officer shall be appointed in each District, except in cases where, in the opinion of the Executive, it would promote the best interests of the Society to appoint more than one.

### ARTICLE 14.—CERTIFICATES.

SEC. 1.—The Secretary shall furnish each member of the Society with a certificate of membership signed by the President, and comtensigned by the Secretary, with the seal of the Society attached. On payment of the endowment stipulated, it shall be surrendered and delivered to the Secretary by the representatives or assigns of the deceased member, and shall be receipted in full, clearing the Society of all further claim upon it; such certificate shall be filed by the Secretary in bis office.

SEC. 2.—After three years duration all certificates shall be indisputable, and payment shall be made without further evidence of age, character or habits, except in cases covered on certificates, which are death by suicide or at the hands of the law, or by Section 2 of Article 3 of this Constitution.

SEC. 3.—Whenever the words "Orange Mutual Insurance Society" appear in the Certificates of Membership now issued or hereafter to be issued, such words shall be taken and construed as and shall mean the "Orange Mutual Benefit Society."

### ARTICLE 15.—RESIDENCE.

Should a member change his place of residence, he shall, previous to so doing, notify the Secretary of this Society of his intention to remove, and of the place where he intends moving to; and the Secretary may, after consultation with the Executive, forthwith notify him of the number of calls necessary for him to advance in order that his representatives or assigns shall be entitled to benefits should he die during such change of residence; the member so removing must also continue in active membership with the Orange Lodge of which he has been a member, or within ninety days from change of residence become connected with an Orange Lodge working under a Grand Lodge recognised by the Triennial Council, which jurisdiction includes all portions of the British Empire and the United States of America, wherein the member may reside. He must also within ninety days furnish the Secretary of this Society with a certificate signed by the Worshipful Master, Secretary and Treasurer, showing that he has joined such Orange Lodge, which certificate shall also be sealed with the Lodge seal of such Orange

#### ARTICLE 16, -SPECIAL OCCUPATION.

No member of this Society shall engage in any dangerous or hazardous occupation, such as the manufacture of gunpowder, dramite, gun-cotton, naval or submarine operations, without first folifying the Secretary; and the Executive shall immediately consider

### ARTICLE 17.—AMENDMENTS.

SEC. 1.—No alterations or amendments shall be made to the Rules of this Society unless agreed upon by a two-thirds majority of those present at a meeting to be held as hereinafter provided.

SEC. 2.—Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual or special meeting of the R. W. the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West, notice of the proposed amendments having been previously sent to the Secretary at least thirty days before the meeting; and a copy of such notice shall be sent by the Secretary to the such District and County Master in Ontario West, and also to the members of the Benefit Society, at least six days before the meeting takes place. All amendments to be adopted by a two-thirds majority of the members of the Benefit Society present at such meeting.

# Orange Mutual Benefit Society of Ontario West.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the R. W. The Grand Master and Members of the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West.

R. W. SIR AND BRETHREN—I have great pleasure in presenting herewith my Annual Report of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society, and in so doing I would offer my congratulations on the steady frogress which we have made during the year.

Our membership roll has been increased by 204 new members, and 20 more new names are ready to enter on our books; while the deaths have only numbered eight, or about one in every one hundred members on our list.

At an Executive meeting held on November 17th, 1837, after mature consideration, it was decided to increase the rates then paid as commission to our agents, in the hope that by giving them sufficient remuneration to make their engagements without loss of time or means, that the agents would be enabled to prosecute our work and assist in increasing the membership.

lam of the opinion that in addition to the efforts of our agents, the Masters of our various Lodges could create a great interest in our work by making the Mutual Benefit department a part and parcel of the routine work at their meetings, and by continually referring to the benefits to be derived therefrom.

The Provincial Government of Ontario have introduced a measure dealing with the Friendly Societies now conducting business in the Province. After a careful examination of the principal clauses, I am enabled to say that we should experience little or no change or difficulty in conducting our work under it. As matters now stand we have a separate and distinct account for each member; he is notified direct of all assessments, remittances and arrears, and cannot be declared out of membership without full notice to his last known P.O. I think, however, that we should have a Friendly Societies' Act passed by the Dominion Parliament, so that its operations might extend, as do our members, over the whole Dominion. In connection with this matter I would urge the appointment of a committee to act in conjunction with committees from other bodies now seeking such legislation.

The Auditors' Report, which will be submitted, will show the financial position of our department, and that the most rigid economy has prevailed, and a surplus in both branches.

### MEDICAL REFEREE'S REPORT.

To the R. W. Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West.

BRETHREN-I beg herewith to submit my Fourth Annual Report as Medical Referee of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society of Ontario

During the year ending 5th March, 1888, I received 252 Medical Examinations, of which 8 were rejected, 1 held for further inquiries, and 243 passed.

The causes for rejection were as follows:

Ununited fracture..... Intemperance.. Consumption in family history..... Heart affections .....

There occurred during the year eight deaths, from the following causes :

Acute Cerebral Meningitis 1 Acute Pneumonia Dysentery Injury to Spine... Accidental death .....

The above includes one of the old Orange Guard, the late Bro. The above includes one of the old Orange Guard, the late Bm. Armstrong, of Strathroy, who was admitted at the inception of the Association, though much beyond the age limit laid down in the Constitution. It will be seen from the above that the insurance in our Association continues very reasonable indeed, having cost only \$5.76 at the age of 30, during the year past. This is the best evidency of the nature of the work done by our local Examiners, who certainly deserve the thanks of the Association, for the painstaking manner and judgment in which they have performed their duties. I would again urge upon the Grand Lodge the desirability of presenting the claims of the Association in every part of the Dominion, so as to afford all Orangemen the opportunity of placing their families under the protection of our splendid Benefit Association.

ST. CATHARINES, ONT., June 1st, 1888.

DEAR SIR AND W. BRO .:-

(2) That the Brethren of each Primary Lodge in British America attend Divine Service in a body on Sunday, July the 8th, and that the collection (if the service be arranged for) be devoted to such pious and charitable purposes as the Brethren may determine.

(3) That special efforts be made to have all former members (unless those suspended or expelled for grevious offences) take a place in the procession both at the Sunday service and on the 12th July.

(4) That a general invitation be extended to the Clergy of the various Protestant Churches to occupy seats on the platform, and take part in moving the resolutions on that occasion.

4.
