The Amount of Water Power.

The American Statistical association publishes some interesting figures on the amount of water power employed in the United States. In 1880 there was a total water power equal to 1,223,379 horse power used for manufacturing purposes, this being 35.9 per cent. of the total power thus employed in the states. The annual value of the water power, thus power thus employed in the states. The annual value of the water power thus utilized is set down at \$24,000,000. The New England states alone use 34.5 per cent. of the whole water power of the country, and altogether the Atlantic states use over three-fourths of the whole.—Public Opinion.

The "Book of the Dead."

A magnificent hieroglyphic papyrus, containing a careful transcript of the "Book of the Dead." has been secured by the British museum. It was written for a royal scribe called Ani, who was a man of great importance in the early part of the period of the rule of the kings of the nineteenth dynasty over Egypt, about 3,200 years ago. The papyrus is quite complete, the first and last 'vignette having been preserved intact.— Chicago Herald.
