

OTTAWA, April 26.

Sir John A. Macdonald laid on the table the correspondence with the Imperial Government respecting the Fening hards a specific Resident Commission Medical Sir G. E. British Columbia on her part, agreed to give towards the railway twenty miles of land on each side of the line. Then there was another condition: that the line should not be built by Government, but by a subsidized company, and that it should be run by a company. The bill also provides that two companies might amalgamate for the purpose of building the railway. The Government, however, would require that any codipany undertaking toxuald, it should have a capital of ten'nilfillion of dollars, with ten per cent of that amount paid into the hands of the Receiver General. The Bill would also provide that in ease the, Government could not agree with any company, the Government would be authorized to receive the offers of capitalists to build the railway. And to give them a charterunder Orders in Council based on the general railway Act. The Bill had therefore a threefold character. The Government would prefer that the railway should be in the hands of one company. Therefore the Government proposed to have at their disposal 50,600,000 acres of land, in order to be able to make an agreement with that company. The land was to be granted in alternate blocks of twenty miles in depth to the cappany. The Government would prefer that the cappany. 
